OPENER

This week we started a new series on the book of Revelation. This book certainly comes with a lot of thoughts, questions, and opinions attached to it. Why do you think that is?

Is this a book of the Bible that you've interacted with a lot or very little?

From what you've heard, studied, or believe, what would you say the book of Revelation is about?

TRUTH

In week one of this series, Travis covered a few verses in chapter one and laid some groundwork for the book of Revelation. What stood out to you the most from his message?

Can someone read Revelation 1:1-3?

Why do you think people will be blessed by reading and hearing this book?

From a 30,000-foot view, this book reveals and reminds us that Christ and the Kingdom of God will prevail over evil in the end. How might that be a constant blessing to people if they remember this in their daily lives?

Can someone read Revelation 1:4?

Maybe you recall what Travis mentioned, but why do you think it's significant for us to remember that this letter was written to a specific group of people in the first century?

APPLICATION

As we read this book together and walk through this series as a church, we'll ask these questions each week to help us keep our attention on Christ instead of being distracted.

How does this week's teaching keep our focus on the hope of Christ?

How does this change the way we should live our lives?
