



Group Questions | March 5 | Week 4

OPENER

It was said on Sunday that “Following Jesus takes faith.” What do you think this means?

This week, Travis mentioned two boxes that make up our faith or belief. And he titled these boxes **“I know, and I think.”** He explained that there are a lot more things in the “I think” box, but the things in the “I know” box carry so much weight that it helps his faith when he’s not 100% sure about the items in the “I think” box.

What are some things in your “I know” box that helps your faith when you’re not 100% about the things in your “I think” box?

TRUTH

Regarding Revelation, there are four things we can stick in the “I know” box.

- It’s a message from Christ that reveals Christ.
- It makes it very clear that God is on the throne.
- It makes it overwhelmingly clear that Christ already holds victory.
- It makes it beautifully clear that I can share in that victory.

How can knowing these things are true help us as we continue to read through the book of Revelation?

This week we heard about “The Millennium” and the four main views around this 1000-year timeframe. Have you heard about any of these? Have you held firmly or loosely to any of them?

Read Revelation 6:1-8.

Do these events sound like something that has never happened before but will in the future? Or does it sound like events that have been happening throughout history?

Through chapter six, there is a lot of destruction. Then we turn to chapter seven and read about a great multitude in the throne room.

Read Revelation 7:13-17.

Read Isaiah 49:10 and 25:8.

What do these verses tell us about the work of the Lamb/Christ/Lord?

APPLICATION

As we read this book together and walk through this series as a church, we'll ask these questions each week to help us keep our attention on Christ instead of being distracted.

How does this week's teaching keep our focus on the hope of Christ?

How does this change the way we should live our lives?
