

Discipleship Essentials Pathway - Week 17 "Everybody's Working From the Weekend"

Work: Work includes what we do for our vocation and how we create, steward, grow, learn, and affect our community, family, and friends.

Colossians 3:22-4:1 (NIV)

Slaves, obey your earthly masters in everything; and do it, not only when their eye is on you and to curry their favor, but with sincerity of heart and reverence for the Lord. ²³ Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord, not for human masters, ²⁴ since you know that you will receive an inheritance from the Lord as a reward. It is the Lord Christ you are serving. ²⁵ Anyone who does wrong will be repaid for their wrongs, and there is no favoritism.

4 Masters, provide your slaves with what is right and fair, because you know that you also have a Master in heaven.

1. Work is worship.

2. Work is witness.
