

Matthew: Portraits of the King - Week 4 Arrival of the King "How to Beat a Triple Team"

Matthew 3:16-17 (NIV)

As soon as Jesus was baptized, He went up out of the water. At that moment heaven was opened, and He saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and alighting on him. ¹⁷ And a voice from heaven said, "This is my Son, whom I love; with Him I am well pleased."

Matthew 4:1-11 (NIV)

Then Jesus was led by the Spirit into the wilderness to be tempted by the devil. ² After fasting forty days and forty nights, he was hungry. ³ The tempter came to him and said, "If you are the Son of God, tell these stones to become bread."

- ⁴ Jesus answered, "It is written: 'Man shall not live on bread alone, but on every word that comes from the mouth of God.""
- ⁵ Then the devil took him to the holy city and had him stand on the highest point of the temple. ⁶ "If you are the Son of God," he said, "throw yourself down. For it is written: "'He will command his angels concerning you, and they will lift you up in their hands, so that you will not strike your foot against a stone."
- ⁷ Jesus answered him, "It is also written: 'Do not put the Lord your God to the test.'"
- ⁸ Again, the devil took him to a very high mountain and showed him all the kingdoms of

the world and their splendor. ⁹ "All this I will give you," he said, "if you will bow down and worship me."

Three Truths from the Battle in the Wilderness:

- 1. Jesus is our representative.
 - Jesus' victory in the wilderness avenges Adam's loss in the garden.
 - You were not in the wilderness with Jesus, but Jesus was in the wilderness for you.
- 2. Jesus shows us the cross always precedes the crown.
 - The wilderness is not a punishment, but a proving ground.

James 1:2-3 (NIV)

Consider it pure joy, my brothers and sisters, whenever you face trials of many kinds, ³ because you know that the testing of your faith produces perseverance.

 God's pattern for our lives often times starts with a struggle and ends with glory.

1 Peter 5:10 (HCSB)

Now the God of all grace, who called you to His eternal glory in Christ Jesus, will personally restore, establish, strengthen, and support you after you have suffered a little.

- Every shortcut to glory that bypasses the cross is a deal with the devil.
- 3. Jesus' victory over Satan leaves us a blueprint for winning our daily battles.

¹⁰ Jesus said to him, "Away from me, Satan! For it is written: 'Worship the Lord your God, and serve him only."

¹¹ Then the devil left him, and angels came and attended him.

- You can't have spiritual success until you are aware of the "Scout."
- The triple team of temptation is the flesh, the world and the enemy himself.

How to beat a triple team:

- 1. Be full of the Spirit.
- 2. Be full of the Word.
- 3. Be focused on the Father's will.
