Unburned and Unbowed

Daniel 3:8-30 NASB

1. The Accusation (8-12)

- Some Chaldeans accused Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego for not <u>bowing</u> down in worship to King Nebuchadnezzar.
- Notice the repetition of the command to worship.

2. The Anger of the King (13-15)

- The king is furious upon hearing the accusation and seeks clarification.
- The king believes their God is not worthy to bow down to as much as himself.

3. The Affirmation of Devotion (16-18)

- These three men affirm their <u>devotion</u> to their God. (No need to answer you)
- They recognize the capacity of their God and also that He is in control. (Matthew 26:39)

4. The Fiery Furnace (19-23)

- At the denial from the three men the king becomes angry and **commands** the furnace to be increased seven times hotter.
- The scene becomes **chaotic**, and Nebuchadnezzar's men are burned up.

5. The Appearance in the Fire (24-27)

- The king is <u>astonished</u> that there are four men freely moving about in the furnace.
- The king witnesses that they are <u>free</u> from harm.

6. The Announcement of Adoration (28-30)

- The king acknowledges Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego's God.
- The king made a decree that their God would be worshipped.

Connection to Christ

Just as Christ was present with Shadrach, Meshach, and Abenego, so is Christ with you and me. Jesus saves His children from a greater fire which is eternal separation from God. Col. 1:13-14

Main Idea

Because God can rescue His people from any situation, remain <u>faithful</u> to Him despite the potential consequences.

Application

- Stand Firm
- Trust God
- Be a Witness

How are you going to respond?

No matter where you are, the question is the same: Will you place your trust in the God who walks through the fire with His people? Will you step into His protection and stand firm?
