Nominate Members for Ministry Council Congregational Representatives

Each January, the congregation is invited to nominate members to serve as congregational representatives on Ministry Council. The Ministry Council is the primary body of elected leaders

who attend to the business of the church and support the work of its ministry groups. The Ministry Council is made up of the Chair and Vice Chair of the Ministry Council, the Chair and Vice Chair of the Deacon body, the Ministerial Staff, the Chair of Finance Ministry Group, and six Congregational Representatives who are elected by the church.

The Ministry Council acts as a support for ministry groups, oversees planning of the church calendar, and can serve as a discerning body for issues that arise in the church. The Ministry Council Nominating Group will contact those nominated to serve on Ministry Council to determine their willingness to serve. The church will vote by ballot to approve the names of those who have agreed to serve a three-year term, beginning February 2023. Active deacons are not eligible to serve on Ministry Council.

Current Ministry Council members are Jennifer Baker, David Bannister (vice chair), Vaughn Bell (Personnel chair), Lauren Blackwell, Molly Braun (chair), Troy Burden (deacon chair), Emmanuel Maize, Beth Metcalf, Charlie Suer (Finance chair), Tyler Swim (deacon vice chair), and Katie Williams. Beth and Katie are rotating off. We need to fill three congregational positions.

Nomination ballots will be available in paper form Wednesday evening (January 11) and during worship on Friday, January 13 and Sunday, January 15.



The Wisdom of Your Body

Lauren Jones Mayfield will lead a four-week Wednesday evening class (January 18, 25, February 1, and 8) on Hillary McBride's book *The Wisdom of Your Body: Finding Healing, Wholeness, and Connection through Embodied Living*.



McBride writes in the introduction, "The body is central to our experiences, to our sense of ourselves, to our autobiographical narratives. Yet research about body dissatisfaction and body hatred shows us that the majority of us—up to 90 percent of those of us in Western culture and in communities touched by globalization, inclusive of women and men—loathe our bodies." As we are created in God's image, how do we come home to this theological understanding of self?

Together class participants will learn more about embodiment—"the way that you are." We will get curious about acceptance, attention, and practice as we remember and embrace our wholeness, which is a God-given gift. (Reading the book is not required, but it is available at Carmichael's or wherever you purchase your books.)


