Led by the ministry staff, Vivek H. Murthy's book, Together: The Healing Power of Human Connection in a Sometimes Lonely World will guide our conversation if you'd like to read along. - In worship at Highland, we aim to sing music with a theology that reflects an expansive and inclusive God.

Our ministers and choir will often replace "He/Him" with "God" or "Love" (1 syllable) and "Father" with "Parent," "Holy," or "Divine" (2 syllables). We would love to hear what creative language for God you might use in worship, too.
