Brogdon is the author of several books such as *A Companion to Philemon* (Cascade 2018), *The Spirituality of Black Preaching* (Seymour Press 2016), *The New Pentecostal Message?* (Cascade 2015), *Dying to Lead: The Disturbing Trend of Clergy Suicide* (Seymour Press 2015), and *No Longer a Slave but a Brother* (Scholars Press 2013).
