Missions

Richard Crane is the Mission to the World liason to Cuba, maintaining relationships with pastors and leaders in the church there. After forty-eight years of ministry in Chile and in Cuba, Richard and Robin will be retiring on December 31.

Starting in 1979, they became involved with the National Presbyterian Church in Chile. During that time they started a church plant, wrote a Bible survey course for theological education by extension, taught courses and started a Christian counseling center. In 1991, they participated with Chilean professionals in the formation of a two-year pastoral psychology training program for church leaders and also wrote a book on pastoral psychology, which has served as a tool for Hispanics in many countries. From 1997 to 2002, Richard served as a pastor in the Christo Rey Church. The Cranes moved to Miami in 2003 and joined the Latin American Faculty for Theological Education, where they developed and taught many courses and started traveling to various Latin American countries, including Cuba. Their ministry to Cuba intensified over time until they developed a counseling program called Center for Gospel Centered Counseling. Over the past few years they have also had the privilege of conducting conferences and retreats and have come alongside a new church plant in Havana.

After retiring, Richard plans on continuing as a volunteer so they can stay in contact with their brothers and sisters in Cuba, mentoring, counseling and encouraging.

The Cranes are praising God for His faithfulness and blessing over the years and ask for prayer that He would use the many counselors that they have trained to bring about Gospel direction and healing to families in their churches and communities.
