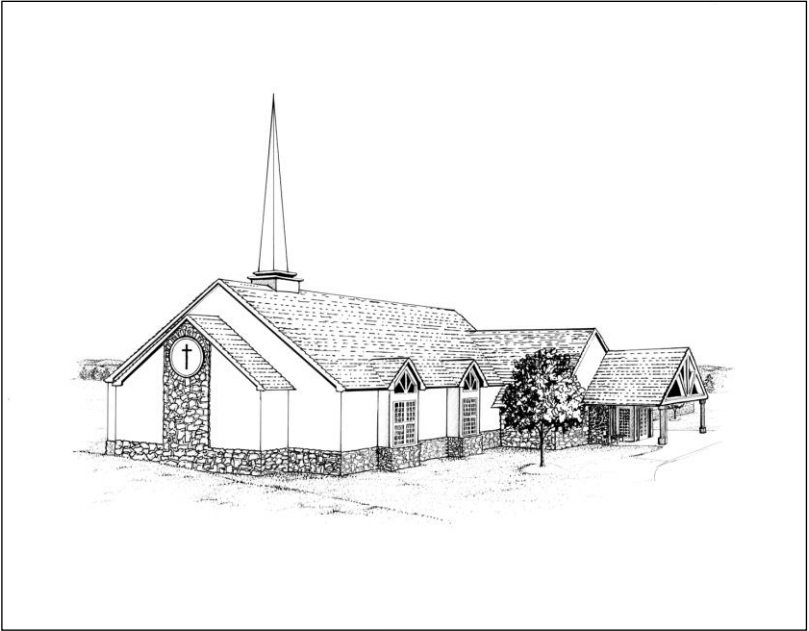
Missions

Shibu Oommen and his wife Mary are serving with Evangelism Explosion International. They are also founders of India Village Mission (IVM) which seeks to address the spiritual, physical and educational needs of women and children in areas of India where people are destitute and ignored. The main focus of IVM in the past year was to provide quality education to children from economically challenged families, with the aim of nurturing not only their academic growth but also their social, moral and character development. Along with children’s education, IVM also focused on the upliftment of women, especially those from underprivileged backgrounds. To help them become self-reliant, the ministry conducted skill-development programs such as tailoring, envelope making and similar activities. Unfortunately, a Hindu group started to copy what they have been doing and canvassed some of their students by making false promises. This situation caused a disruption in ongoing programs, but God’s grace was clearly revealed when for unknown reasons the other group stopped their activities. If it is God’s will, IVM hopes to restart their skill training in the near future. Please pray for the following:
-for God’s direction in carrying out the ministry more effectively and fruitfully and in possible plans to expand the ministry
-that the ministry will be able provide at least one healthy meal every day to their students
-for God’s guidance and provision to restart their discontinued programs in a professional and sustainable manner
