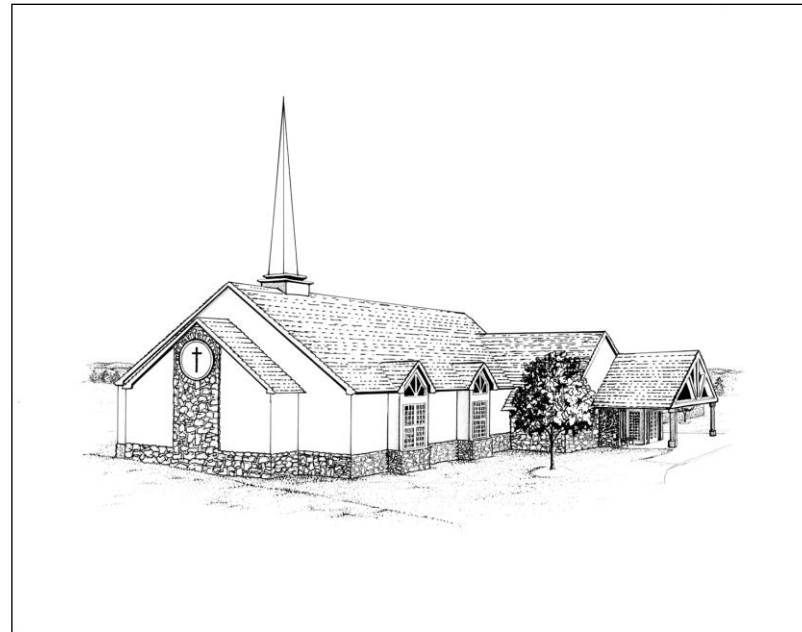
Missions
