THE NICENE CREED

The Nicene Creed originated at the Council of Nicea (325), and an expanded form was adopted by the Council of Chalcedon (451). It was formulated to answer heresies that denied the biblical doctrine of the Trinity and of the person of Christ.

- Mercy Ministries encourages and equips PCA churches and members to minister to people who not only need the gospel but who face circumstances of tangible need or difficulty.
- Metanoia Prison Ministries offers churches the opportunity to develop a discipleship and outreach ministry for prisoners in their own community.
- Refugee and Immigrant Ministries comes alongside local PCA churches and believers to encourage and resource them as they engage, befriend, serve and disciple refugees and immigrants in their communities.
- Ministry to State exists to serve with the gospel those who serve in government.

In addition to these examples, MNA oversees church planting, disaster response, chaplains and short-term missions.
