# **Missions**

Flavien and Inyange are missionaries stationed in the US serving churches and church planters in sensitive countries.

During the past few months Flavien has been occupied with multiple study/research endeavors. He has done quite a bit of digging into the context and history of the Westminster Assembly, as he was working on a few speaking engagements related to its documents. He also has been busy sharpening his skills with Biblical Hebrew in conjunction with preaching through the book of Micah, while also diving into the book of Revelation for a Bible study. Another subject that has taken his attention is the Reformed doctrine of the covenant of works, as he is preparing to write an essay on the subject for a multi-author book. He is in conversation with a couple of journals and publishers to turn some of his research into a few articles and books, mostly in the French language.

In addition to his research endeavors, Flavien has had a chance to meet with ministry partners who have traveled to the US from other parts of the world. Each visit has been an opportunity to talk about how he might best serve them the next time he is able to travel to their locations. Any travel plan has to be tentative as there has not been any movement yet on his green card application.


