The Small Group Ministry

Proverbs reminds us that "As iron sharpens iron, so one man sharpens another" (27:17). As we get to know one another at a deeper level in a small group setting, we begin to more easily fulfill the 'one-another' aspects of the Christian life, not only caring for one another (1 Cor. 12:25), but also those deeper elements of spiritual community including bearing with one another (Eph. 4:2), admonishing one another (Rom. 15:14), and loving one another in sacrificial ways (Jn. 13:34).
