Brian K. Blount is President Emeritus of Union Presbyterian Seminary, following service as the Richard J. Dearborn Professor of New Testament Interpretation at Princeton Theological Seminary. An M.Div. graduate of Princeton Seminary, he obtained his B.A. from the College of William and Mary. After seminary, he was pastor of the Carver Memorial Presbyterian Church in Newport News, Virginia. He later received his Ph.D. in New Testament Studies from Emory University. He has served as the president of the Society of Biblical Literature and the president of the Association of Theological Schools. His primary research has been in the Gospel of Mark, the Book of Revelation and cultural studies and hermeneutics.



The New Creed of 1968 is a brief and well-loved affirmation of faith used widely in worship in the United Church of Canada. The largest Protestant denomination in Canada, it was inaugurated on June 10, 1925 when the Methodist Church, Canada, the Congregational Union of Canada, 70 percent of the Presbyterian Church of Canada and the General Council of Union Churches entered into an organic union.
