Baptism Celebration – 6/10/12

This is a different service for us, a baptism celebration, where a total of 27 people are getting baptized this weekend, to proclaim their *new life* in Christ And each person has spent a good deal of time and effort working through a Bible study to understand what baptism is, what they're doing, and why But before we get to it, I want to be clear about a few things

• The first of which, is that baptism doesn't save you

If it did, or in some way contributed to it – that would be a work

And 2 Timothy 1:9 says that – [God] saved us and called us to a holy calling, not

because of our works but because of his own purpose and grace

God saved us and called us – not b/c of our works

It's God's work of grace in your life that saves you; Not your works of obedience

We obey b/c we're saved, not to get saved*****

Or another way to look at it, is that **salvation is a** *gift* – a free gift of God And baptism is an act of allegiance/obedience, that shows you've *embraced* that gift That indeed, you're a genuine follower of Jesus Christ; You've been given new life

That's what each person is saying by being baptized
They're already believers, who are now being baptized to show it
To *show* that they're identified with Jesus; To *show* that he's Lord/Savior of their lives

And it's so important, that . . .

• An unbaptized believer is a contradiction of terms

That's one of the reasons Peter linked it so closely with repentance in Acts 2:38
Saying – Repent and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins, and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit.

Repent – as in, confess your sin, and stop doing it
Acknowledge your wrong beliefs, wrong thoughts, wrong words, and wrong actions . . .
Ask God to forgive you; And start doing what's right; That's repentance
Repentance that leads to salvation, from the consequences of your sins

• But notice he says – repent and be *baptized* for the forgiveness of sins
Linking them so closely together that some people think you have to be baptized in
order to be saved; But we know from 2 Tim 1:9, that can't be true
B/c that would make baptism a work – something tangible you *do*, in order to be saved

When in fact it's by *grace* we are saved, through *faith* – not something we *do*, but something we *believe*

And this is not our own doing, this saving, Paul says in Eph 2:8 – it's a *gift* of God; *not* a result of works

So Peter's not saying in Acts 2:38 that you have to be *baptized* in order to be saved, but that baptism goes *hand in hand* with salvation
So closely it seems, that an *un*baptized believer is a contradiction****
That's the 3rd thing I want to be clear about

• 4th, I want to be clear about the **Reasons For Baptism**

Starting the fact that . . .

1. It demonstrates commitment

Each/every person getting baptized has *admitted* they're a sinner, in need of a Savior . . . They *believe* that Jesus *is* that Savior – that when he died on the cross, he died for them They've *repented* of their sin – asking God to forgive them, and turning from any ongoing sin . . .

They've *received* him into their life – to live *his* way, for *his* glory, forever and ever . . . And now they're getting baptized to demonstrate that commitment; To declare it publicly like the Bible says

That's the 1st reason for baptism

2. It encourages the saints

Baptisms encourage the church – those who have *already* been baptized Reminding us of *our* walk with Christ; *Our* salvation; And *our* commitment

3. It challenges the sinners

Urging them to repent and follow Jesus just as they have
And if that's you – I trust you'll listen closely; And maybe even make this the *day* of your salvation

4. It glorifies God

And that's the ultimate point – to glorify the one who saved us in the first place . . . And keeps us for all eternity

All of which we want to emphasize, with a verbal testimony
And that's the last point I want to be clear about
Along with their baptism, each person will give a testimony of their salvation; B/c . . .

• Testimonies reinforce the picture of baptism

Have you ever looked at a picture of modern art and wished for a little plaque that explained what in the world the author was trying to convey?

That would help, wouldn't it?

That's what a testimony is to baptism; It clarifies what it's all about, and reinforces the symbolism – explicitly giving credit where credit is due

Like when David said to God in **Ps 40:9-10** – I have told the glad news of deliverance in the great congregation; behold, I have not restrained my lips, as you know, O LORD. [10] I have not hidden your deliverance within my heart; I have spoken of your faithfulness and your salvation; I have not concealed your steadfast love and your faithfulness from the great congregation.

We have people give a verbal testimony in baptism, b/c it magnifies God's work of deliverance, and faithfulness, and salvation****

Reinforcing what we *see*, for the purpose of glorifying the Lord, encouraging the saints, challenging the sinners, and demonstrating commitment (*Grady, John, Bob*)

Pray – Bless; Meaningful, Memorable

Post-baptisms

You've just heard 8/9/10 people bear witness to the saving work of Jesus Christ in their lives, and get baptized to show it

And I can't help but think that some of you need the same; You need to be saved

And you can be, if you admit that you're a sinner, in need of a Savior . . .

Believe that Jesus is the one – that when he died on the cross, he did so for you, so you wouldn't have to . . .

Repent of your sin – asking him to forgive you . . .

And receive him into your life – to live his way, for his glory, forever and ever

Admit, believe, repent, and receive

If that's you, if you need to be saved – I'm going to lead you in a prayer

And I want to encourage you to pray along with me, calling out to the Lord in the quietness of your heart

Pray – God, I admit . . . I believe . . . I repent . . . I receive

Father, for those who just prayed, would you impress this day upon their hearts

And for those who were baptized – would you bless them immensely for their act of obedience? I know you will

Hear the praise now of those who love you; And be magnified as we stand, with arms high and heart abandoned, to the one who gave it all
