### **Gut Check: Are You Thankful? – Various Scriptures**

- Acts 17:26-27; We're in the middles of a series called Gut Check, where we're looking at qualities to live by, and doing an internal evaluation
  - An assessment of our commitment and resolve; Just like boxers place a punch to the stomach to test the resolve of their opponent; It's a gut check
- And this week I want to talk about gratitude; Especially as it relates to the country in which we live on this  $4^{th}$  of July weekend
  - B/c quite often, maybe even more often than not, we focus on the bad, instead of the crazy amount of good, and get cynical, or complacent, or even numb to it all

So I think a gut check is appropriate, and I'd like to start with this – Are you thankful . . . For our nation? (Acts 17:26-27)

Even if this isn't your home or country of origin; Are you thankful for it?

You should be; Not only does God tell us to *give thanks* <u>in</u> *all circumstances* (1 Thess 5:18), including the nation in which you find yourself – but he actually *established* it

And I don't mean that in some sappy, overly spiritual, patriotic way that you most often hear it – as if the United States is God's chosen country and the apple of his eye I don't mean it that way at all

When I say that God established our nation, I mean that he marked off the boundaries, both in time and geography; B/c that's what Acts 17:26 says

He made from one man [Adam] <u>every nation of mankind</u> [as in every people group, every culture] to live on all the face of the earth, having determined allotted periods [time] and the boundaries of their dwelling place [geography], that they [the people in those nations] should seek God, in the hope that they might feel their way toward him and find him.

God has not only determined the *time* in which we exist as a nation, but our borders as well – the boundaries of our dwelling place (26); He established it Which ought to make us thankful; We're a part of something explicitly ordained by God

And, it's been used by God; It was established by God, and it's been used by God That we *should seek* him and *find him*, v27; And nobody would argue *that* hasn't happened in these United States

People have come to Christ and/or matured in Christ, in droves the past few centuries Including most of us

Which once again, ought to lead to an attitude of gratitude

Especially when you consider that we could have born or lived in any *number* of countries; From the bloodshed and struggle of a nation like Eritrea . . .

To the oppression and persecution of North Korea, or no nation at all like the West Bank or a refugee camp

If you're a follower of Jesus, and you live and work in these United States, thank God right now; B/c you're benefiting from something he established, and continues to use

And thank God it was founded on biblical principles

One nation under God indivisible with liberty and justice for

One nation, under God, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all; Those are *biblical* principles; Not to mention the right to life and pursuit of happiness It's cause for thanks

As is the affluence of our nation; And the opportunity we have here

We are *ridiculously* wealthy; Even the poor among us are wealthy in comparison to the world; And our *natural* resources are mind-blowing; As is our infrastructure

All of which affords us the opportunity to better our lives like no other nation on the face of the earth; To *truly* enjoy the goodness of God in the land of the living (Ps 27:13) To make something of ourselves that's so far outside the scope of most people in this

world, it doesn't even occupy their dreams

This nation may not be perfect, but it's *ridiculously* good; And for that, I hope you're thankful

Here's the 2<sup>nd</sup> question – Are you thankful . . .

## For the people who founded it? (John 15:13)

Those who laid the groundwork for what we have – a groundwork of godliness, hard work, honesty, and integrity; B/c those aren't the norm in this world

And are you thankful for those who gave their life or livelihood to make it happen?

I hope so; B/c Jesus said in **Jn 15:13** – *Greater love has no one than this, that someone lay down his life for his friends.* And they did; Both figuratively *and* literally

The question is – Are you thankful?

Or is the 4<sup>th</sup> of July just another holiday; A day off work; An opportunity to binge on video games, or get hammered with your friends\*\*\*\*\*

Honestly, I fear that it *is* for most; From what I've seen, most people don't even *think* about the significance of this weekend . . .

Let alone give thanks to God for those who made it special; Those who founded this country (**Photos of Founding Fathers**)

➤ People like John Adams, and Benjamin Franklin, Alexander Hamilton, John Jay, Thomas Jefferson, James Madison, and George Washington Considered by most, to be the most prominent and influential of our Founding Fathers

And the things they did, and the efforts they led, were nothing short of extraordinary Like John Adams; A passionate, principled, and godly man who worked *tirelessly* to get

this thing off the ground; Probably doing more than anyone else

Or how about Benjamin Franklin; A brilliant man before his time, and an influencer like no other; Serving both here *and* overseas

And then there's Alexander Hamilton, who literally set up our nation's financial system

And John Jay, who was the first Chief Justice of the Supreme Court

And Thomas Jefferson, who penned the Declaration of Independence

And James Madison, who authored the Bill of Rights

And George Washington, who was a statesman, general, and president rolled into one

You don't have to know these people to be thankful for them\*\*\*\*

You just have to give credit where credit's due, and realize what a monumental task it was, to not only establish a brand new *nation* . . .

But give of their blood, sweat, and tears to pull it off

And we're the beneficiaries; Which ought to evoke *immense* feelings of gratitude on our part; Do a gut check

3<sup>rd</sup>, are you thankful . . .

### For the government we have? (Rom 13:1)

The government we're under? Including those who lead it; Are you?

I hope so; B/c once again it's a work of God

<u>Rom 13:1</u> – Let every person be subject to the governing authorities. For there is no authority except from God, and those that exist have been instituted by God.

And 1 Pet 2:13-14 says – Be subject for the Lord's sake to every human institution, whether it be to the emperor as supreme, or to governors as sent by him to punish those who do evil and to praise those who do good.

Every government that's ever existed, has been instituted by the sovereign hand of God; Even the bad ones; Like the one in 1<sup>st</sup> century Rome when Peter/Paul were writing *God* put it in place; And for that reason alone, we ought to not only submit to it, but thank him for it; Why? B/c God knows best\*\*\*\*

We ought to be thankful for the government we have, b/c God has a plan, and he's working it out

Does that mean there's no room for disagreement with those in authority? Not at all There's even a place for civil *disobedience* – like when David opposed King Saul; Or Daniel refused to stop praying

But short of being asked to do something wrong, something sinful – we need to comply And do so with an attitude of gratitude, b/c it's of the Lord

➤ And, it's a representative form of government; We're not dealing with a dictatorship, we're subject to a republic – a political system with elected representatives
 One that has not only stood the test of time, but has been extremely effective
 Not without gridlock, or politics, or the snail's pace of bureaucracy; Totally
 But compared to other governments, there's no comparison
 And short of a theocracy, where God himself would rule as a benevolent dictator – it's the best form of government in the entire world

So instead of chaffing against it, we ought to appreciate it; Instead of hating it, we ought to love it; Or at the very least, have a good *attitude* toward it

Especially as believers – who trust in the sovereignty of God

Instead of obsessing on all that's *bad*, we ought to be thankful for all that's *good* 

4<sup>th</sup>, are you thankful . . .

# For the <u>freedoms</u> we enjoy? (James 1:17)

Like freedom of speech; Or the freedom to exercise our religion; Or the freedom to assemble; Or bear arms; Or be secure from unreasonable searches We enjoy an *amazing* amount of freedom in this country

The problem is, we've enjoyed it for so long, we take it for granted; We take our freedoms for granted; And we must not do so; For at least 5 reasons:

### 1. They're gifts from God

James 1:17 says – Every good gift and every perfect gift is from above; From God And the rights we enjoy in this country would certainly qualify as good; Which means they're from God; And the last thing we should do regarding something from God... Is take it for granted; Or fail to thank him for it

#### 2. They're not universal

Not *everyone* enjoys the freedoms we're so accustomed to; Especially our religious freedom; In fact, ¾ of the world lives under some sort of censorship Where they have to be careful of what they say and do **Video** (One Generation Away – 1:04:54–1:06:35)\*\*\*\*\*

The freedoms we enjoy are not universal

Just this past week, one of the churches in our Fellowship was threatened by an angry mob of religious leaders, right in front of their church; As they were meeting And then influenced the authorities through bribes and intimidation, to call the pastor to the police station for several hours of questioning

And though he was allowed to return home late that night, it's not over

And right here in our own backyard, in some of our southern states . . .

No less than 7 black churches have been burned down in the last 2 weeks – since the Charleston shooting; The most recent of which was a Baptist church in S. Carolina The same one that was burned down in 1995, for the same reasons – racism, white supremacy, and class hatred; Things that are evil, wicked, and shameful The freedoms we enjoy are not universal; Even in these United States

#### 3. They're not guaranteed

There's no guarantee that the freedoms we enjoy today, will be here tomorrow; None whatsoever; History is *filled* with examples; Especially for believers

Talk to the church in Russia; Talk to the church in China; Or Iraq; Or Egypt

The freedoms we enjoy are not guaranteed; And to think they are, to think we're exempt from such miscarriages of justice, is naïve to the core

### 4. They're slipping away

Our freedoms are slipping away, as we speak; Especially our freedom of religion **Video** (One Generation Away – 42:44–44:40\*\*\*\*
Our freedoms are slipping away

And lest you think that's a bunch of Chicken Little talk, to say that the sky is falling when it's not – think again; B/c it's already happening; Here's just one example **Video** (One Generation Away – 55:02–58:33)\*\*\*\*\*

And that kind of freedom seems about as American as baseball, hotdogs, and apple pie But it's slipping away; And Julea Ward isn't the only one feeling it

Hobby Lobby is as well, in their battle to live out their faith at work, instead of parking it at the door

And then there's Catholic Charities in Washington DC, who chose to shut their doors after 100 years of existence . . .

Instead of violating their beliefs by being forced to place adopted children in homosexual households

And how about Melissa Klein, the owner of Sweet Cakes in Oregon, who had to close *her* business recently, b/c she didn't want to make cakes for same-sex marriages Or Barronelle Stutzman who owns Arlene's Flowers in Washington State, and is facing

the same thing; And that's just the short list

A growing number of people and businesses are losing their rights and freedoms – sometimes due to *government* interference, and sometimes due to cultural pressure They're slipping away

And here's the thing . . .

## 5. They're worth fighting for

The freedoms we enjoy, are worth fighting for; And we ought to; B/c we're never more than one generation away from losing them

I'm not talking about taking the law into your own hands, I'm talking about taking a stand before it's too late

I'm talking about influencing anyone you can; And engaging in conversations I'm talking about educating yourself, and staying *up* on what's going on

Like getting a subscription to World Magazine (**WorldMag.com**) – news and editorial from a *biblical* worldview

Or bookmarking a link to **LibertyInstitute.org** – an organization dedicated to defending our *religious* freedoms

Or picking up a copy of **One Generation Away** – the documentary from which I pulled the video clips; And *The Family Leader* right here in Iowa

Our freedoms are God-given, and worth fighting for; B/c if we lose them – our ability to share the gospel, preach the Word, and live for Jesus, will be severely limited\*\*\*\*\*

So whatever you do, don't do nothing; Pray, educate yourself, and speak up Supporting those whose rights are being infringed, even if it *doesn't* affect you B/c sooner or later, it will; The loss of freedom for 1 person, will affect us all (**Summ**)

Thank God for our nation this weekend, and while you're at it, resolve to take a stand for the freedoms that make it great

<u>Pray</u> – Lord, thank you for the nation in which we live and move and have our being; Thank you for the people who gave of themselves so sacrificially, to found it; Thank you for the government we have; And thank you for the freedoms we enjoy; May you find us ever vigilant to protect that which you've given us
