Now- as we head back into Luke's gospel- I want to introduce you to the Pillar Killer. A very sneaky character.

Luke Series Slide

I recently finished reading Cormac McCarthy's "No Country for Old Men".

The book primarily follows 3 characters.

One character- named Anton Chirgurh- represents deterministic and chaotic evil. (Evil is going to happen and it there is no real rhyme or reason to it)

Another character- Llewellyn Moss represents a kind of morally complicated person- he likes good. He's a hard working salt-of-the-earth type, but when he stumbles upon a bag full of money after a drug deal gone bad- he takes it. And evil follows him at every turn.

Chigurh- starts to hunt him because he has been hired to retrieve the money. And Moss has attached himself to the money...so he becomes the target of evil.

The money does not make Moss' life better. In fact it brings evil and death not only to him, but to people that he loves.

Then there is the third character. The Sheriff. Sheriff Bell. He represents good in the novel. He has an old school sort of "Yessir, yes m'am" attitude. He's committed to objective morality and doesn't like the moral decay he sees around him. He's at the end of his career about to retire as a man of the law- and he's not sure if society can be saved.

He's the Old Man of "No Country for Old Men". In other words- as he watches money corrupt good men...and evil chasing it...he looks around to the broader country around him... and thinks- I can't live in this world...my morality, my values are no longer making sense of the evil I see.

In a scene right at the end of the book- he's speaking with one of the county prosecutors in the courthouse hallway in their little Texas town... and out of blue...comes this short dialogue. There is no further context to these words. It flashes up in conversation...and then its gonebut for me its a major theme of the whole novel.

All narrated in the first person by Sheriff Bell.

Finally, I asked him if he knew who Mammon was.

And he said: Mammon?

Yes. Mammon.

You mean like in God and Mammon?

Yessir.

Well, he said, I cant say as I do. I know it's in the bible. Is it the devil?

I don't know. I'm goin to look it up. I got a feelin I ought to know who it is.

He kindly smiled and he said. You sound like he might be getting ready to take up the spare bedroom.

Well, I said, that would be one concern.

In any case I feel I need to familiarize myself with his habits.

Indeed it does come from the Bible.

Matthew 6:24

No one can serve two masters, since either he will hate one and love the other, or he will be devoted to one and despise the other. You cannot serve both God and [Mammon].

Mammon is the demonic spirit that attaches itself to money. Its the evil that follows money wherever it goes.

Paul's warning to young pastor Timothy...

1 Timothy 6:9-11

But those who want to be rich fall into temptation, a trap, and many foolish and harmful desires, which plunge people into ruin and destruction. 10 For the love of money is a root of all kinds of evil, and by craving it, some have wandered away from the faith and pierced themselves with many griefs.11 But you, man of God, flee from these things, and pursue righteousness, godliness, faith, love, endurance, and gentleness.

Luke 12:13-34

13 Someone from the crowd said to him, "Teacher, tell my brother to divide the inheritance with me."

14 "Friend," he said to him, "who appointed me a judge or arbitrator over you? " 15 He then told them, "Watch out and be on guard against all greed, because one's life is not in the abundance of his possessions."

There is a tracker in the money Lewllyen Moss doesn't know is there. Thats how Chigurh finds him.

In NCfOM, they take off their shoes to sneak around.

Sneaky.

Sneaky- breaking a family up. Blind to it. Can't even see it happening.

v 15

Watch out - Be on guard against all greed, because one's life is not in the abundance of possessions.

Watch out-Greek Horah- Oh. Means to make visible Be on Guard.

Sneaky enemy. Like Predator with the cloaking device. (Predator Badlands- PG-13.) There are no human deaths in it- the message of the movie is despite what bad scripts we received from our family of origin- we can form a family stronger than blood that transcends division, makes enemies into brothers and sisters, and values even the weakest member of the community.

Its basically God's Not Dead 5.

Anyway- Greed has a cloaking device.

You need to make it visible and protect yourself from it.

watch out for greed!- Why not adultery— not nearly as sneaky

Jesus speaks about money 10x the amount he talks about sex. The point is not that a sexual ethic isn't important. IT IS EXTREMELY IMPORTANT. The larger point is that most of us just nod our heads and say Ok, Ok, Ok...no matter what our brother or sister does with money... but if they walked up and said "Hey, I'm thinking of having an affair this weekend...we'd probably say "NO!" Dont do it!

No G4 group for materialism or greed. Would be hard to start it. Likely no one would show up.

We don't feel materialistic, because most times you end up hanging out with people who make the same amount of money as you.

Blindness to the condition is a part of the condition.

KELLER STORY

Some years ago I talked to a TV executive who was well-paid. He was the executive of a channel a lot of teenagers watched, but he wouldn't let his own teenage daughters watch it. When somebody asked the question about whether that was consistent, he was not excited about that question. He says, "You don't ask questions like that. How could you possibly do business if you were always asking questions like this?"

If you refuse to ask those questions- you are being voluntarily blind

Don't want to budget because the budget will tell them what to do.

2) Mammon makes you feel like a king, while he uses you as an ottoman.

1 John 2:16

16 For everything in the world — the lust of the flesh, the lust of the eyes, and the pride in one's possessions — is not from the Father, but is from the world.

Possessions- BIOS, life...

Luke 12:15

2 Cor 8:7-9

7 Now as you excel in everything — in faith, speech, knowledge, and in all diligence, and in your love for us — excel also in this act of grace. 8 I am not saying this as a command. Rather, by means of the diligence of others, I am testing the genuineness of your love. 9 For you know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ: Though he was rich, for your sake he became poor, so that by his poverty you might become rich

He became poor- so you could become rich through his poverty you have become There it is. Look, the same thing. Does Paul say, "If you give your treasure away, God will give you his heavenly treasure"? No. He actually says, "You will never be free with regard to your earthly treasure until you see God has given you his ultimate treasure."

He liquidated everything for us, the poor. Why? To pay for our sins on the cross.

Our possessions- we didn't create. We are given stewardship and rule- but they are all Gods

"What do you get the man who has everything?"-

If you knew that, Jesus says, if you had that inner subjective spiritual wealth, if you knew how much you had been treasured, if you knew how much you are treasured, your money would just be money. It wouldn't be security, it wouldn't be beauty; it would just be money. See, the only way you're going to get over this sickness is not just to look at the rule "Give your money away." It's to see what he has done. Only when you see him treasuring you at infinite cost to himself will you start treasuring the needs of your neighbors just at the cost of your money, and it's just money.

Every treasure except Jesus will demand that you die to purchase it. It will drive you. It will say you have to run after it. "You have to do anything to get me."

Jesus is the only treasure that dies for you.

Second- a member of a radically changed community

1 Peter 2:9-10

9 But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people for his possession, so that you may proclaim the praises of the one who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light. 10 Once you were not a people, but now you are God's people; you had not received mercy, but now you have received mercy.

Luke 12:32-33

Sell your possessions, dont be afraid.

Seek first the KoG and all these things will be added.

Little flock- he's talking to a group-

This passage started with a family divided. He addresses them as a family of grace.

The flock is how you will be provided for.

Mark 10 - RYR- sell and give to the poor. You get new brothers and sisters

Along with the new community come homes and fields. We must not read these terms any differently than the words *brothers*, *sisters*, and *mothers*. In Jesus' view, when we become part of a new community, we not only share one another's parents and siblings, but we also share one another's homes and possessions.

The reason individual Christians in both Luke 12 and Mark 10 are free to radically give away money when needs are evident is because it is assumed that they are now members of a community that will do the same for them if they should be in want. The only way to be able to

give and share as Jesus directs us is to be part of a community in which no one considers their possessions their own." Do you see that?

1 Timothy 6:9-19

If anyone teaches false doctrine and does not agree with the sound teaching of our Lord Jesus Christ and with the teaching that promotes godliness, 4 he is conceited and understands nothing, but has an unhealthy interest in disputes and arguments over words.
