### A note from Pastor Karla...

My family and I ventured into Lakeside a couple of weeks ago to watch the car races at Barona Speedway. Just in case you weren't aware we had this in San Diego County, the Speedway, located just around the corner from Barona Casino, is a 1/4 mile clay oval track where all kinds of cars--sports mods, dwarves, pure stocks--compete in races a couple times of month. It is really quite the scene! There are tailgate parties, lots of enthusiastic fans, and heart-pounding action utilizing the Lakeside rocky hills as the backdrop. Despite the thrill, though, what I didn't anticipate was the noise. Racing cars are very loud and not just normal levels of loud--I am talking full-body-pulsing loud. The morning after when I was preparing to come to church, I found myself speaking more animated than usual due to my still-reduced hearing. And even more so, in the middle of the race when my older son turned to me to comment on the speed and cool tricks of one of the vehicles, I couldn't hear a thing he was saying.

Is that what is happening in our stunted spiritual growth when we can't hear God's voice? Is the surrounding noise simply too loud?

I would venture to say, "yes".

Priest, theologian and author Henri Nouwen once wrote, "Many voices ask for our attention. There is a voice that says, 'Prove that you are a good person.' Another voice says, 'You'd better be ashamed of yourself.' There also is a voice that says, 'Nobody really cares about you,' and one that says, 'Be sure to become

### **Generation to Generation** Renovation October Update

We are continuing the Environmental Review of the site, including:

- A geotechnical soils test, which will necessitate drilling at least two boreholes – one in the parking lot and the other near the library
- A sewer line investigation snaking the existing lines to check their condition
- Utility locations more spray paint around the campus

The Request for Proposal (RFP) has been finalized. This will be sent to several General Contractors, inviting them to send their proposal for the project. Due mid-October.




### Wine, Women, and Word
