# A note from Pastor Karla...

This fall, in addition to the study of Matthew during our Sunday morning hour, I have also been studying the book of Revelation with dozens of women at the church. Even though these two books have vastly different content, I have been struck over and over again by the consistent theme of "faithfulness". In fact, the call to faithfulness isn't just relegated to the New Testament, it is also the most consistent theme throughout the entirety of the Scripture. From Genesis all the way through the end, we get a beautiful picture of God's faithfulness to His creation followed by a continual call to faithful living in response to God's love.

#### Faithfulness, though, requires consistency.

When I was a young person, consistency felt like death to menew adventures, new relationships, new geography--that is what I longed for. The last thing I wanted was the same thing over and over again. But, as I have aged, I have realized that faithfulness has nothing to do with monotony, in fact it has little to do with consistency outside of us. The kind of consistency God seeks is found within the heart of a person. Are we the same person with our family that we are with our friends? What about our colleagues at work or the stranger at the gym? What about our enemy? Faithfulness means being the same face everywhere you go.

Halloween reminded me of the many faces that we wear as people. At my children's school, during their Halloween parade, they were not allowed to wear masks. This is certainly a bummer
