Session Meeting Highlights | DECEMBER 20, 2023

The December Session meeting is always bittersweet, as retiring elders are celebrated and newly elected elders present their statements of faith. Pastor Karla commented on the elders of the remarkable Session Class of 2023, who were at work throughout the full "pivot" of worship and operations during the pandemic. The Session applauded retiring Elders John Brand, Chris Capen, Susan Cramer, Carolyn Griesemer, and Kristen Stephany (PLCPC's first "non-resident" ruling elder). Also appreciated was Elder Lynn Ziegenfuss, who has agreed to serve another year! Lynn has been instrumental in shepherding the Session's new Mission Group structure, which continues to evolve.

The retiring elders were replaced by what promises to be a remarkable Class of 2026. The Session welcomed Elders-elect Claudia Bender, Carol Leimbach, Gordy Lutes, Michelle Reynolds, Lou Suter, and Doug Werner. Elder-elect Patrick Marion had met with the Session earlier. They will be ordained and installed at 9:00 AM, Sunday, January 7, 2024.

Deacon-elect Valarie Jonas also presented her statement of faith and was welcomed by the Session.

The remainder of the meeting was chiefly concerned with the review of the 2024 preliminary budget. The staff and Session had committed to presenting a balanced budget for the first time since the start of the pandemic and the launch of our new Online Ministry. Prayers were offered for a robust completion of the 2024 stewardship campaign so that this goal could be achieved. The final budget will be approved in January and presented to the congregation at the annual meeting in February.



An Update from Loaves & Fishes, Ocean Beach Emergency Food Pantry

A MISSION PARTNER OF POINT LOMA COMMUNITY PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH



Loaves & Fishes, operating out of the Water's Edge Church, has been serving the Ocean Beach community since 1977. PLCPC has supported the mission since the beginning with funds and volunteers. Former PLCPC pastor Rev. Lou Vick was the president of the board for over 20 years!

Loaves & Fishes is open every Monday morning at 9:30am, rain or shine, 52 weeks a year (holidays included). They feed our neighbors (60% families, 40% homeless). Weekly, they provide bags of food for clients who are able and unable to cook. Hygiene kits and pet food/toys are available, and they provide clothing once a month. Twice a month they are joined by CalFresh (EBT- food stamp program), FSD, & T-Mobile.

With the end of the Covid pandemic, government help to those in need has been cut drastically. In June 2023, their client base increased from 150 to 275 per week. The past 12 months they gave out 10,000 bags of food, which is huge for a small operation. Although they receive fresh foods from grocery store partners like Grocery Outlet, Target, and Gelson's, they still rely heavily on shelf stable items purchased

from SD Food Bank and Feeding San Diego, and costs at SD Food Bank skyrocketed from \$30/week to \$300-\$600/week.

They are certified by UCSD as a Gold Level food pantry. To keep this accreditation, they are reviewed and inspected annually.
