## **Celebrating Endowment Gifts in May**A note from Steve Smith, PLCPC Endowment Chair

In May at PLCPC, we are celebrating and honoring the hundreds of contributors to the Endowment as well as considering how the Endowment can support the church in the future.

Over the past 45 years, members and friends of PLCPC have promoted the congregation's long-term work and mission through supporting the Endowment. Gifts to the Endowment from the 1970s are still generating funds to support the Endowment in 2024!

Since gifts to the Endowment are never spent, but rather gifts are invested and the income from those investments is used to fund promising new opportunities, resolve occasional challenges, and improve the church's programs, the Endowment's principal keeps creating income year after year in perpetuity.

The long-term value of Endowment gifts are also protected from devaluation by inflation because the appreciation of the principal is returned to the principal. So, instead of a gift to the Endowment made in 1980 of \$1,000 being worth approximately \$250 now, it would have an approximately \$4,000 value today and roughly the same purchasing power.

As we celebrate those who have participated in the Endowment, would you consider making a gift and being a part of supporting the church for decades to come?

### **Campus Updates**

Generation to Generation: At our Annual Meeting, held in early February, we shared some updates to the renovation plan with the congregation. In the new plan we have decided to utilize our existing footprint instead of undergoing new construction. This decision enables us to address deferred maintenance in addition to addressing our essential priorities for the project, including an upgraded Preschool, enhanced safety and security measures, revitalized adult multipurpose spaces, and the addition of an elevator to the second floor.

The Quieter Non-Residential Program (of the San Diego Airport) has completed the installation of new windows and exterior doors to meeting and teaching spaces in the Parlor & Office, the Chapel, and the Family Life & Youth Centers. There are a few remaining finishing touches to be worked out, but the program and contractor have been very responsive.

The purpose of the program is to lessen the air traffic noise in all meeting spaces. In a few special cases, the sound treatment has been to add a layer of sound absorption to replace existing windows or doors.

The QNRP would also like to treat our sanctuary and education buildings, and is waiting for confirmation of state funding and guidelines. These treatments, including adding air conditioning will likely take place after our renovation is complete.



### TRANSFORM OUR WORLD

### A Note on PLCPC's Temporary Shelter

### OPERATED BY THE TRANSFORM OUR WORLD MISSION GROUP

Our church and its Transform Our World committee has embraced the compassionate mission of offering temporary housing to immigrant families who have legally entered the United States. Nearly two years ago, our first family found solace in the apartment known as "Room 6" within our church. Since then, we've welcomed and sheltered two more families, each with their own unique journey, hailing

from Haiti and Venezuela. While we amalgamate their narratives to safeguard their privacy, their collective ordeal reflects a quest for temporary protected status on their road to citizenship.

Their stories are ones of resilience amidst adversity, fleeing persecution and violence in their homelands. Crossing through Central America and the infamous Darien Gap, up through Mexico, they navigated their way to safety, traveling by various means, including trains, buses, and even on foot. Some arrived in Texas before being transported to our region. One family was separated at the border, enduring the anguish of being torn apart before reuniting in San Diego.

Through our partnership with the Safe Harbors Network, we have been able to provide crucial support, including access to legal aid, county services, work permits, and identification documents. Our local schools have warmly embraced the children, who are swiftly mastering English and excelling academically, earning recognition for their outstanding citizenship and academic achievements. Meanwhile, the adults fortunate enough to secure work permits are





contributing to our community through various service industries.

In a city witnessing a significant influx of immigrants, most who then move to other places, our commitment remains steadfast. While the Migrant Welcome Center has regrettably disbanded due to financial constraints, organizations like Catholic Charities, Jewish Family Services, and The International Rescue Committee continue to extend aid to asylum seekers. As a congregation, we plan to



support these families, step by step, as they navigate the labyrinth of resources, healthcare, education, and transportation and finding housing. Our church's dedicated volunteers have lent a helping hand in myriad ways, from transportation assistance to furnishing their temporary abode, from tutoring to English language instruction.

The gratitude of these families toward our congregation is immeasurable. As we lift them up in our prayers, we envision a radiant future as they progress along their path to Citizenship.


