A NOTE FROM PASTOR KARLA

I remember as a small child my grandmother telling me stories of her time living in the Alaskan frontier. She talked about the lack of access to basic resources during World War I and II and worried about not being able to provide for her growing family. I can only imagine how hard that must have been. This summer I researched my family genealogy when I was visiting Salt Lake City and I learned that my great, great grandmother ventured across the United States with Joseph Smith and the other followers of Mormonism. When Smith died, she provided care for his widow and children. In her journal she wrote of worrying about their lives and the church and the future. I can only imagine how hard that must have been for her too. I expect every generation, in some form or fashion, has concern about the world we live in. Our world is broken. It is polarized. It is daunting, and at times even overwhelming. None of this is a surprise to our God. This is the reason God gave us Himself. This is also one of the reasons God gave us one another, so we might find hope in our unity.

In this giving season as we take an inventory of our blessings, as we give thanks to God for all that has been provided, may we understand one another as one of the biggest gifts of all. Our coming together in unity is what makes difficult things more bearable and life's joys more meaningful.

Session Meeting Highlights | October 23, 2024

Several milestones were carved at the October Session meeting. A new Deacon's Handbook was presented by Deacon Carolyn LeVasseur for approval. All the current deacons contributed to this edition, edited by Deacon Moderator Janis Jones.

Elder Joey Sagawa presented for approval the latest edition of the PLCPC Employee Handbook which he edited. The Personnel Committee worked with human resources consultant ChurchHR360 and our liability insurance carrier to integrate the preschool and church employee handbooks, and to add and improve several sections. Next up: the Volunteer Handbook. The Deacon and Employee Handbooks are now formatted to join the recently-edited Financial Handbook and Session Handbook, all curated by Assistant Clerk Kathy Wright.

Sagawa also presented for approval the PLCPC Workplace Violence Prevention Plan, developed in response to new workplace regulations. The Session approved the plan, and applauded Joey for all his faithful work.

The Session welcomed Building Committee Chair Sue Skala and construction manager CBSI president David Suter who presented a renovation update. The Session approved an amendment with Prava, the project contractor, and approved a call for a congregational meeting on Sunday, November 3 at 10:00am for the purpose of authorizing a construction loan.

Elder Amy Radonich reviewed the church finances, noting how she is "blessed and amazed" by the faithful financial support of our congregation.

Last month, we learned all about joy on Sunday mornings and that's exactly what several families experienced together at Family Camp! Thanks to everyone who came and made it such a blast.


In November, we'll be learning all about generosity in Kids' Worship: When we remember what God has given us, we can choose to live with generosity. We can make someone's day by giving something away!



Supporting Mission Partners & Providing Disaster Relief

Each year, the Transform Our World Mission Group recommends financial grants to the Session to support selected mission partners. These recommendations are made after carefully reviewing grant requests from mission partners.

For 2024, the Session approved a total of \$119,000 in grants for 17 mission partners, including 10 local/regional partners and 7 international ones. While the need for both local and global missionary support is great, we trust that it is through God's limitless love that these needs will be met. These grants are part of God's love flowing through PLCPC, and they truly make a positive impact.
