# A note from Pastor Karla

When I was considering becoming a pastor, the one hang-up that prevented me from taking the final leap in those last years was my fear of death. This is not a profession to get involved with if you have that type of fear, as facing death is a central part of what a pastor does—not just for self but for others.

A fear of death, though, is not uncommon in our culture, as we are a culture that denies death. We pad our lives with constant life-saving measures—seat belts, exercise, vitamins, healthy diets—these are all good things, but having so many "good things" also teaches us something. Our beauty products are marketed to prevent aging. In our healthcare industry we market pills to prevent decay. We color our hair to go with the season. Our media depicts those who are mostly young and beautiful. We send those who are aging to nursing homes like they are not a part of our family systems anymore and the young then have zero exposure to those in their final season of life. When we get sick, even with a terminal diagnosis, we have been trained to look forward--to the next treatment, to the next cure. In the end, it's hurting us. As when death comes our way, we don't know what to do, because we have been denying it for so long.

# This is the gift of the season of Lent: an invitation to face that which scares us.

One Lenten season, while living in Pittsburgh, I frequented a tiny Catholic church and I meditated on the stations of the cross. I sat in death for an entire season at first to see if I could and then secondly to see if death had anything to teach me. And what I learned, and have continued to learn since while walking with people through all kinds of death--not just physical, but emotional and spiritual death as well--is that the death of things, while painful, is also hopeful. Death is only all consuming when you haven't also experienced life after death. Not like us. Thanks be to the resurrected Christ who enters this season with us.

May we all invite the darkness these next weeks so that the light might have the opportunity to shine brighter.



# Session Meeting Highlights | John Spafford, Clerk | February 26, 2025

The Session approved an amendment to the Endowment Funds Bylaws, prepared by past Endowment Committee Chair Steve Smith. This complete rewriting of the document provides clearer language and clarifies the perpetuity of the endowment principal. Members may receive a copy of the Bylaws by

Pastor Karla provided an extensive update to recent progress on Renovation projects, but noted the City permit is still pending a few sign-offs. She said the City is requiring that PLCPC improve the Udall and Poinsettia sidewalks at

substantial cost. The Session, with some reluctance, approved the unbudgeted project, identifying operations reserve funds for payment.

The meeting adjourned with many prayers for those suffering family losses in recent weeks.



She also became a staple at the monthly luncheons, where her table—fondly known as "Mildred's Table" became a gathering place for friends old and new. For over 20 years, she faithfully greeted attendees, collected donations, and, most importantly, made each person feel seen and valued.
