A note from Pastor Karla

In order to strengthen the muscles in my legs, I have recently taken to wearing ankle weights around my house when doing my normal activity. I can't say that I enjoy them, but I can say that when I take them off, I feel lighter than I would normally. As a result, I have come to appreciate the extra weight. In the same way, the post-Easter season of church life is my favorite. The heaviness of Lent, while I appreciate it, is in the rearview mirror and now it's time to play!

The Playfulness of God, our sermon series these next couple of months, is all about the lightness we feel after the weight of sin has been lifted. As playfulness is really a reflection of how secure the gospel has made us feel. It is to live in grace. We need to be freed to learn to play. Life and faith are not meant to be serious all the time.

When my step-dad was alive he would write me letters. His letters would always include a section of wonder. It might have been a paragraph about a bird, or a deer, or one of his grandkids, it didn't matter the subject, what mattered was the delight. Following this paragraph of wonder, he would often include a hand drawn picture of himself on his tractor, or a bird dancing. He was a terrible artist-stick figures at best--but it always made me laugh. My step-dad loved Jesus with a deep and serious faith, but he also knew how to play.

Do you know how to play? If not, here are some suggestions: So go for a walk, but don't count the steps. Hang a bird feeder outside your window and watch the birds scurry with joy. Go to the beach and collect seashells. Learn the moves to a trendy TikTok dance. Put whipped cream on your child's nose. Write a letter and end it with a goofy hand-drawn picture of yourself. Put the trash can on the other side of the room just to see how many three-pointers you can sink. Do these things for no other reason, except because they are fun.

We are no longer under the weight of sin, Jesus set us free by his work on the cross, let's celebrate together the lightness of God's grace!

Have you been curious what's going on behind that fence? We have a few photos to share with you!

The preschool playground concrete was broken up and hauled away in order to dig trenches for plumbing and new footings. One of the exterior staircases was removed and will be rebuilt.

The preparation and reconfiguration of the preschool classrooms progresses steadily! Last week, the concrete was poured back into the trenches which contain new plumbing, the framing of the new classrooms is happening this week and new HVAC systems are being installed. The new entrance to the Preschool has been cut and is under construction!

Walkway adjustment notice: The courtyard behind the Sanctuary is closed through the start of May. To get upstairs M-F, 8am-5pm, use the interior stairs by the Chapel or walk through the Sanctuary and turf to the exterior stairs.

Session Meeting Highlights

March 26, 2025 | Kathy Wright, Assistant Clerk

Elder Whitney Skala discussed the importance of recruiting and developing new church leaders.

Finance Vice Chair Doug Werner reported that this year's pledges were a little below last year's. Several members who pledged in 2024 but not yet for 2025 are being contacted to encourage them to pledge again this year.

The Transform our World Mission Group proposed making plumbing changes to the temporary shelter during the renovation. The lengthy discussion, including input from the Building Committee, mainly centered around the need for a shower and the installation of piping during the renovation, i.e., costs now vs future costs. Because the future use of the facility for housing is uncertain, the matter was returned to the TOWMG for further discussion and planning.

The Presbytery conducted their annual records review. PLCPC had one minor deficiency that has now been corrected.

The agenda for the April meeting of Session had few discussion items, so after hearing financial reports and renovation updates, the Session settled into the concerns of our church community. The elders joined in prayer for those with dire health concerns, those recovering, and for their families.
