### A note from Pastor Karla

When one of my grown nieces was a little girl I took her to the park to play. While we were still walking on the path to get there, it started to rain. Seeing shelter in the distance, I grabbed her hand and tried to pull her through a shortcut in the grass. "Run!", I said, but she dug her feet in the dirt and wouldn't budge. I turned to ascertain the situation and in the middle of the field, stood a sign that read "Stay on the Path". With tears streaming down her face and her hands balled in tight fists, she yelled in the now pouring rain, we can't go through the grass, we have to follow the directions. As I stood there sopping wet, it occurred to me that her under-developed brain could not fathom a world where it was okay to break the rules.

As adults, though, it doesn't take much living to perceive the shades of grey in our world. Life and its choices are not often clear cut. We are able to see different sides of the same story. We experience joy and sorrow in the same experiences. We are both fearful and courageous. Life is so complex that obeying yard signs in the rain is the least of our concerns.

This is why we are spending the summer in the Psalms. The Psalms are powerful because they offer a wide range of human emotions and experiences, expressed through prayer and praise, and become for us a source of comfort, guidance, and connection to God. They provide a framework for expressing both joy and sorrow, praise and lament, and they also connect us with the broader community of faith

If you want to deepen your prayer life, there is no need to create something new, instead just pray the Psalms and God will show you how to be authentic with your life.

### **Session Meeting Highlights**

### Session Highlights | May 28, 2025 Session Meeting, John Spafford, Clerk

Pastor Karla led the Session on a tour of the renovation spaces before the May Session meeting convened. Session elders had lots of questions, and were impressed with the progress made and the quality of the work. Shaw is hopeful that Phase 2 will begin in early July.

The Session welcomed Dr. Claudia Grauf-Grounds, chair of the Staff Restructure Task Force, established in December, 2024. The team is working with consulting resources developed by "The Unstuck Group" in determining how PLCPC is performing in a church life-cycle continuum.

Grauf-Grounds provided an update on the team's progress, and requested that the Session participate in the next steps to answer two questions: Who are we

primarily called to serve, and how do we balance operations to meet their "inward and outward" needs. Following wide-ranging discussion, the Session agreed to dedicate focused time to the topic over the summer, and thanked Grauf-Grounds and the team for the report and progress.



### Thanks to John Leimbach for His Years of Service as Church Treasurer!

In 1997, Google.com was registered, the movie Titanic premiered, and more importantly, John Leimbach was elected Treasurer of PLCPC. Since then, Leimbach has been

re-elected to this unpaid post 28 times. This remarkable length of service – professional or volunteer - has rarely been seen in PLCPC history, and now Leimbach has decided to turn in his green eyeshade and calculator. He retires on June 1, 2025.

### During his service, Leimbach:

- Ushered the church finances through three major building campaigns
- Worked with three very different senior pastors
- · Was instrumental in building the Endowment Fund
- Shepherded funds through the complicated church accounts
- Prepared the budget for scrutiny by Session, auditors, and the congregation
- Danced through economic minefields during the pandemic, emerging with the healthiest PLCPC finances in its history
- Scrawled his cryptic signature on thousands of checks

... and did so much more, with a smile, a word of encouragement, an air of confidence, all while staying quietly in the background, serving with humility and honor. His faithful stewardship of our church finances has been acknowledged by the Session by naming him "Treasurer Emeritus."
