

A note from Pastor Karla

When Marc and I were first married and living in Pasadena, we visited the Griffith Observatory. While entrance to the main museum exhibits were free to the public, the planetarium show cost \$7 per person at the time. Marc and I debated whether we could afford such a steep fee on our meager salaries. In the end, we decided it was worth the splurge and bought the tickets. I had no idea that when I sat down for that 30-minute film, I would walk away transformed. As soon as the lights dimmed to darkness in the dome, we were launched through space. During our journey, we discovered just how vast and unknowable the universe truly is. It was such an immersive experience that when we returned to Earth and the lights came back on, the audience remained riveted to their seats. At that point, I looked around the room, and suddenly the Muslim family sitting two rows in front of me, and the man two seats over—covered head to toe in tattoos—didn't feel like strangers anymore. They felt like family. In those 30 minutes, I discovered our shared humanity in contrast to the vastness of God's creation.

Sadly, most of us don't live inside a planetarium show. As a result, we often go through life focusing on our differences instead of recognizing the thread of humanity that connects us all. We have stopped seeing the image of God implanted in everyone, and this dehumanization is, unfortunately, destroying our world. To counter this harmful worldview, the church theme for this school year will be "We Are All Divinely Designed." Through this theme—explored in our sermon series and small groups over the next nine months—we will look inward at our own preciousness, outward at the beauty of others, and around us at the planet God has entrusted to our care, all because of the divine image within us.

I hope you will be inspired this year to see humanity for what it truly is: a reflection of God's grace in a fallen world.

Renovation Update

Phase One is Complete!

While there are still a few finishing touches that need to take place, we were able to open six of our eight new classrooms, a portion of the Children's Courtyard, and the new teacher Resource Room on August 18 for the first day of school! The teachers and students are all getting used to their new spaces and loving the special environments that were built to foster faith and education for the youngest among us.

Now onto Phase Two!

This phase includes a partial removal of the middle building (also known as the tower) to open up the campus and make space for an elevator to the second floor. **Entry to the church campus during the week will primarily continue to be through the church office.** Preschool families, as well as those utilizing rooms in the upstairs Children's area, will access the campus through our newly dedicated Preschool entry. **The passageway behind the Chapel, as well as the Chapel alley gate will be off limits, so traveling from one side of the campus to the other will take place via the sidewalk on Udall St.**

Phase Two also focuses on the refurbishment of the ground level spaces in the 1940's building, as well as the Kids' Cafe space on the second floor. We can't wait to see how this reimagined space will be used for community connections, art/music events as well as our ongoing bible studies and classes.

Thank you for your continued support of the Generation to Generation renovation project! This is critical for Point Loma Church to not only continue, but to expand the ways we are serving our neighbors and sharing the love of Jesus.

THE STORY BEHIND THE PANCAKES!

Did you know that our first Deacon Pancake Breakfast debuted a secret recipe developed by Bill and Millie Gallaher, now known as "Millie's Secret Recipe"? As Bill tells the story, Millie's family had a rustic cabin in the mountain wilderness of Trinity County, just east of Redding where Millie and Bill spent time. Millie and Bill would rise early to fell trees and split logs for the fire that would cook their food and heat water for their showers. They needed a hearty breakfast to fuel their labor! So, instead of adding just water to pancake mix, they added eggs, milk and, eventually, applesauce. Millie was a renown cook too, having run her family's breakfast and lunch business in Sacramento as a young girl.

Bill and Millie hosted the first PLCPC Pancake Breakfast on behalf of the Deacons for 10 years, featuring Millie's Secret Recipe. By then Millie was adding a few more ingredients, a little oil, a little spice, while Bill manned the grill, flipping the cakes and turning the sausages. Millie gifted the Deacons her famous recipe, placing it in the Deacon notes, and it is what we make to this day.
