Doors Open at 10:00am; Music at 11:00am; Lunch at Noon

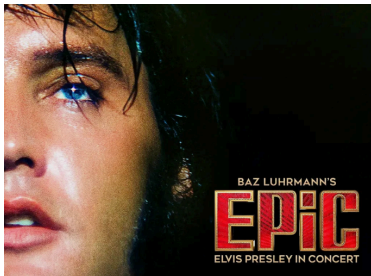

1776 The Musical



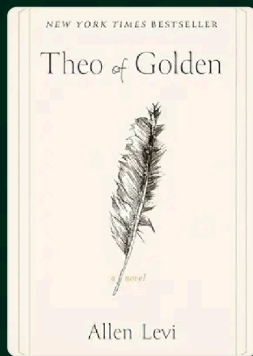
