Pastor's Article

Often faith can seem dead, but the #Real Presence of Jesus pushes us forward, challenges us to see God in new ministries, new places and people, and tells us to never be satisfied with how things are. The #Real Presence of Jesus pushes us to shape the world in God's image rather than our own.

In the next few weeks, we'll have many opportunities to practice, detect, sniff out, and notice the #Real Presence of Jesus. Community meals, collaborative Lenten Wednesday worship, Holden Evening Prayer, Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter Sunday are all opportunities to notice the #Real Presence of Jesus at Woodlake and in your life.

In fact, everything we do at Woodlake should give you the tools to help you successfully answer these two questions: What is God up to at Woodlake? And what is God up to in your life?

Hopefully after Easter, you'll know with crystal clarity that faith can seem dead, but Jesus has other plans.

My hope is that our worship theme #Real Presence is not just a cheap gimmick with free sunglasses, but offers a way to ask the question, what could be? Our world is hurting and God needs people who don't see a dead faith, but notice and proclaim the #Real Presence of Jesus at work in the world, in our church, and in our lives? This month, I hope you ask the hard questions of "what could be?" for it just might be the push we need to transform Woodlake and our ministry in Richfield.

A prayer from the Cranberry Hymnal for the health of body and soul:

By your power, great God, our Lord Jesus healed the sick and gave new hope to the hopeless. Though we cannot command or possess your power, we pray for those who want to be healed. Mend their wounds, soothe fevered brows, and make broken people whole again. Help us to welcome every healing as a sign that, though death is against us, you are for us and have promised renewed and risen life in Jesus Christ the Lord. Amen.

Miraculous healings occur frequently in the Gospels, and after the Resurrection, they are some of the most dramatic events, offering clear evidence of Jesus's power. But as this prayer acknowledges, we do not possess or command this power. Are we completely powerless in the face of the distress of others? Certainly not. We can offer what physical assistance we can (think of the traditional act of dropping off a hot dish to the recently bereaved), offer a sympathetic ear, send an encouraging letter, give a warm greeting to others, and wish them Godspeed on life's journey.

Not too long ago, I was getting a meal at a downtown Subway restaurant. As I was leaving, an older gentleman in a wheelchair asked me to pause for a moment and said, "I just want you to know God loves you." I said thank you and offered the same to him. For a brief moment, we were the real presence of God.



New Visitation Members Needed

When we started the Visitation Ministry about 10 years ago, it was called the Homebound Ministry and we had between 60 and 65 members. Today we have only 35 members. Our numbers keep dwindling. The majority of our members are elderly and many have died, particularly during the pandemic. We even changed our name to the Visitation Ministry because there was а stigma surrounding the name "homebound". We have 19 visitation ministers. but currently 3 of them do not have anyone to visit.

Over the past 10 years, all of us have aged, so many of you may be in need of a visit or a call or even a card. During the pandemic it was proven that isolation and loneliness are not good for us, so the Visitation Ministry could provide someone to visit. We have many different options to be a visitation member. We try to tailor the options to what you would like.

- All members receive cards made by Woodlake Ink for Valentines Day, Easter, Thanksgiving, and Christmas, and some just receive cards.
- Some like "full service": a visit once a month plus communion. Others may just want a visit because they come to church and get communion or get communion at the facility where they live.
- Some enjoy getting a call once a month rather than a visit.
- Some would like us to provide devotion books whether we deliver them or mail them.
