PASTOR'S ARTICLE

Some of my most cherished Bible stories are nestled into the awful and confusing time between when Jesus died and when the disciples learned about or bore witness to his resurrection. Which might be a strange thing to say, since most of these are not – or don't start out as – happy stories. We meet the disciples in locked rooms and empty gardens and along the road toward Emmaus, and each time we find them in confusion, grief, and fear. They don't know what's



coming; they are way too familiar with what just happened; and they don't know what they are supposed to do about it. They simply know that what they thought was supposed to happen turned out so differently than they'd imagined so far.

I think I gravitate toward these stories because of how familiar the opening moments, deep in the uncertain in-between, tend to be. Being a pastor who was born the same year as the ELCA was formed means that I grew up in a denomination that had recognized that what came before was not what was gonna persist forever. But it also means that I grew up in a church that had committed to following the gospel of Jesus into the New Thing that God was up with in our little corners of the world. What a gift!

These stories of in-between times – and the courage it takes to step out not quite knowing what the destination looks like, but knowing the journey will make demands of us – have been clamoring for my attention a lot this summer as we've continued in our process of conversations and collaboration toward unification on Reformation Day 2026. There are so many parts of this process that are in formation, but the exact shape of the final decisions is still murky to us. We know God is calling, but we don't know where (even literally in our location!); we know there will be great gifts along the way, but the losses inherent in the process feel especially near and especially tender. We know that there will be opportunities (like the time Thomas was out for groceries when Jesus showed up, all resurrected) when we will have utterly different experiences of what's true, and those differences will drive us nuts; they may even break our hearts a bit.

What we also know is that not a single one of those disciples or communities of disciples was ever actually alone, even when it felt like God had died and that was it. One of the gifts of this journey we are embarking on together will be the opportunity to preach the good news to each other, right here as Woodlake and House of Prayer. To remind one another that it's God, and not our budgets, who is calling us together; it is God who is stirring us up to try a New Thing even before we know exactly what it'll look like (and sound like and smell like); and it is God whose stories feed us already and will continue to feed us, in the Word and at the Table, and God whose promises meet us at the Font and then every time we touch water and remember whose we are.

If it sounds like I think these gifts will be easy, I've messed up. They won't be easy. But they will be enduring; and they will be ours. Our congregations are in in-between times, it's true; but as it happens, we belong to a God whose stories come to life right in the midst of uncertainty, right in the time between one way of being disciples and the next. Thanks be to God.

Called to Unity: An Update on Our Congregational Journey

To the friends and members for the congregations of House of Prayer (HOP) and Woodlake (WL) Lutheran churches, good day. I am Augie Schauer currently serving as the Vice President of Woodlake Lutheran church and a member of the joint leadership team of our HOP/WL leadership group. I am sharing an update on some of our recent activities. As you all should be aware we are looking to combine congregations by October 2026.

As you can imagine this union will engage us all in some form or capacity as we work in grace to attain this goal. Your leadership boards have been busy coming together to begin the workings needed. Each traditional team or commission has been busy meeting together and making plans to determine what is required in this 'New Congregation'.

We have divided up into the following groups to begin this work. Below is an outline put together by one of our members, Brent King, and highlights some activities to date.

At both House of Prayer's Feedback Forum on May 18 and Woodlake's Town Hall on June 1, the message received was that our congregations are energized by the collaborative activities and feel led toward unification of our congregations in order to live out a shared mission for the sake of the Gospel.

On Wednesday, June 11, the leadership teams of both House of Prayer and Woodlake met for a joint conversation about what the next steps in coming together for our congregations might look like. Based on feedback from the congregational gatherings and guided by the question 'What is God calling us to do next?', the Joint Leadership determined that House of Prayer Lutheran Church and Woodlake Lutheran Church are being called to become a faith based community in Richfield that is inclusive of HOP and WL focused on putting our faith into action for the benefit of the Richfield community.

On July 17th leadership boards were together again, and one outcome was both leadership teams approving to move forward with interviewing a shared worship and music director for House of Prayer and Woodlake churches.


