The Challenge of Oneness

The political assassinations of Melissa Hortman and Charlie Kirk expose the dangerous divide between our political parties, and likely will only deepen it.

"The ultimate weakness of violence is that it is a descending spiral, begetting the very thing it seeks to destroy... Hate cannot drive out hate; only love can do that."

- Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

Here, Dr. King gives us a glimpse of the solution to solving divisiveness and hate: **LOVE.**

The Church's Response

Loving people who are different from us is:

- Simple: Jesus said, "Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you." (Matthew 5:44, NRSVUE)
- Complex: Love cannot tolerate hate or evil at its core.
- Messy: If we confuse Jesus's message with a worldly one, we miss the point.

Jesus, who died at the hands of and on behalf of his enemies, is our guiding light. He did not include hate in his message, he died to overcome it.

A Call to Be One Church

To be "one church" today is a critical task. It means:

- Standing up to hatred and evil wherever it is found
- Building relationships across differences, even political ones
- Telling the truth, even when it's hard
- Living love as both a simple and difficult idea

To be one church, we must follow Jesus's example of love. We are better together!

Every Meal Distributions
