Every Wednesday is someone's first Wednesday. We strive to create a personal experience for each student that walks into our campuses every week. The Student Ministry Concessions teams create a unique and engaging environment for students by selling pizza, pop, and candy. You will play a vital role in accomplishing our two wins by creating an engaging experience and setting up students to enter into transformational relationships with God and others.

Here's how we do it:

Before

- Read weekly communications from you leader prior to student services.
- Check in with your team lead at scheduled time to receive instructions, connect with your team, and prepare to serve.
- Check in, wear your nametag, attend huddles, and participate in ongoing training meetings if applicable.
- Communicate scheduling conflicts with your team leads and manage you schedule on My.eaglebrookchurch.com.
- Set up concession tables with pizza pop and candy and take inventory. Taking inventory of the night is simple count all pop and candy at the beginning of the night and count what is left at the end of the night.
- Be familiar with the campus facilities and the schedule of the evening this way you can help students who are new.

During

- Maintain the organization and cleanliness of the concession area.
- Stay attentive and aware—avoid using your phone while serving.
- Student will come back every week try to remember their names or their favorite treat to make the experience more personal.
- Helping to create a fun atmosphere for parties and special events.

After

- Tear down, clean, and store all concession items in designated storage area.
- Maintain the organization and cleanliness of the student ministries' storage area.
- Count all inventory that was not sold that night and compare it to the beginning of the night number to get an accurate inventory cont.
- At the end of the night money must be counted by two background-checked volunteers or staff members.
- If you're a volunteer overseeing the money count, you'll receive training from a staff member to do so.
