

The Palmetto Voices Spiritual Ensemble strives to preserve the legacy of the Concert Spiritual while sharing the vision that this unique American art form is available to all. The ensemble was formed in 2006 and is comprised of alumni of Dr. Sonja Sepúlveda from Sumter High School, the University of South Carolina, Salem College, Brewton-Parker College, Western Kentucky University, and auditioned singers from 6 states. The choir meets three or four times a year to rehearse and has sung for National, Southern, and State ACDA conferences, Carnegie Hall, and toured Italy, Vienna, and Greece.



About the Artistic Director Dr. Sonja Sepúlveda

Dr. Sepúlveda is a graduate of Winthrop University where she earned both Bachelor of Music Education and Master of Music degrees. She received a Doctor of Musical Arts degree in Conducting from the University of SC. Dr. Sepúlveda's choirs have performed concerts at the National Cathedral, Carnegie Hall, Kennedy Center, and the Lincoln Center as well as performed concerts in Europe, Canada, and Mexico. She sang with the Robert Shaw Festival Chorus for eight years and is in demand as a choral adjudicator and clinician, as well as being known for her TEDx Talk "Being a Woman Conductor and Overcoming the Prejudice."


