Calesta "Callie" Day is a native of Atlanta, Georgia. She is an educator, artist, vocalist, and vocal instructor. She is a multi-talented and gifted woman of God, with a range of vocal abilities. Her anointed style, production and spiritual perceptiveness has proved her as one of the most dynamic and compelling talents. She has traveled extensively performing across the nation, and in Europe and Central America. Recently, Callie has taken social media by storm as fans all over the United States have captured her amazing voice in videos that have instantly gone viral; especially her vocal rendition of Moses Hogan's "Hear My Prayer" that has also taken the internet by storm and has made Calesta an internet phenomenon. Even before then, many had already seen her gifts in churches and schools where she has taught and served, especially in her local Walmart where she was featured as the "Singing Pharmacy Tech" on several commercial videos. She is also a soloist/performer with the American Spiritual Ensemble.

Mrs. Day's freshman album "Hear My Prayer" released on April 14, 2017 is available on all digital networks. She also placed #9 and #24th on the Billboard Magazine's Gospel and Classical music charts. Callie premiered and debuted in PLAY; the first piece created for the Paris Opera Ballet by Swedish choreographer Alexander Ekman December 2017 at the Palais Garnier Opera House. On August 6, 2019, Callie was a contestant on America's Got Talent Season 14 where she made it all the way to the judge cuts with celebrity guest judge, Jay Leno. Mrs. Day received an Associate of Arts degree from Sinclair Community College in Vocal Performance, Bachelor's degree from Bowling Green State University (Oh) in Vocal Performance, the Master's degree in Education with a Music Concentration from the University of Dayton. Callie is also currently a candidate for the Master of Fine Arts (Miami University, Oh) and Doctor of Music degrees (University of Kentucky) in Voice Performance. Her doctoral project is "Exploring the Role of African American Opera Singers in The Establishment of The Spiritual as A Musical Art Form From 1900 To 1920". Since the pandemic outbreak of Covid 19, Calesta recently is giving private vocal lessons via online. She also released a music video project titled "In Trouble" written by composer/writers; Ms. Monica Hodnett and Ms. Theresa Metzger

About Dr. Tony McNeill



Dr. Tony McNeill, affectionately known as Dr. T., is a sought-after workshop clinician, lecturer, consultant, mentor, and guest choral conductor throughout the country. Dr. T. served as Director of Choral Activities and Chairman of the Department of Performing Arts at Clinton College in Rock Hill, SC, from 2019-2022. Before his appointment at Clinton College, he was a Visiting Professor and Interim Choral Director at Texas Southern University (TSU) in Houston, TX. Dr. McNeill also served four and a half years as the Director of Worship and the Arts at Atlanta and Historic Ebenezer Baptist Church, "America and Freedom Church."

In 2022, Dr. McNeill served as Artist-in-Residence for Covenant Presbyterian Church (Charlotte, NC) and Myers Park Presbyterian Church (Charlotte, NC). He now serves as Interim Minister of Music at Myers Park Baptist Church (Charlotte, NC).

He is an adjunct professor of music and worship at Campbell University (Buies Creek, NC), Clinton College, The Interdenominational Theological Center (Atlanta, GA), and Union Presbyterian Seminary (Charlotte, NC). He is the Founder/Curator of THE CALL 2 WORSHIP GROUP, an online community of musicians and clergy. Dr. McNeill has lectured for Duke Divinity School, Hampton University Ministers Conference, The Hymn Society of the United States and Canada, American Choral Directors Association, Shaw University Ministers Conference, and for Association of Partners in Christian Education (PCUSA), and led music for the 2022 Montreat Youth Conference (Omega, Weeks 5 and 6). He has coordinated and led worship for the American Baptist Home Mission Societies' Space for Grace Conference, the Forum for Theological Exploration, The Black Theology and Leadership Institute at Princeton Theological Seminary, and the Montreat Conference Center as well as other faith communities. Dr. T. is a former member and assistant director of Donald Lawrence and The Tri-City Singers.

Dr. Tony earned a Bachelor of Music Education degree from Appalachian State University, with an emphasis in piano and choral music; a master's degree in choral conducting from Florida State University (Tallahassee, FL); and a Doctor of Worship Studies from The Robert Webber Institute for Worship Studies (Jacksonville, FL). He is a member of the American Choral Directors Association (ACDA), Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, Inc., and Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia Fraternity.
