Gospel Reading – Matthew 25: 14-30 NRSV adapted

Note about the reading: the Greek word $\delta o \tilde{u} \lambda o \zeta$ or "doulos" can be translated as slave, servant, attendant, steward, retainer, bondsperson, or someone in a servile condition. Contemporary readers should take caution not to project their Western notions of the Transatlantic slave trade onto the biblical text.

"For it is as if a man, going on a journey, summoned his slaves and entrusted his property to them; to one he gave five talents, to another two, to another one, to each according to his ability. Then he went away. At once the one who had received the five talents went off and traded with them and made five more talents. In the same way, the one who had the two talents made two more talents. But the one who had received the one talent went off and dug a hole in the ground and hid his master's money. After a long time the master of those slaves came and settled accounts with them. Then the one who had received the five talents came forward, bringing five more talents, saying, 'Master, you handed over to me five talents; see, I have made five more talents.' His master said to him, 'Well done, good and trustworthy slave; you have been trustworthy in a few things; I will put you in charge of many things; enter into the joy of your master.' And the one with the two talents also came forward, saying, 'Master, you handed over to me two talents; see, I have made two more talents.' His master said to him, 'Well done, good and trustworthy slave; you have been trustworthy in a few things; I will put you in charge of many things; enter into the joy of your master.' Then the one who had received the one talent also came forward, saying, 'Master, I knew that you were a harsh man, reaping where you did not sow and gathering where you did not scatter, so I was afraid, and I went and hid your talent in the ground. Here you have what is yours.' But his master replied, 'You're wicked and lazy! You knew, did you, that I reap where I did not sow and gather where I did not scatter? Then you ought to have invested my money with the bankers, and on my return I would have received what was my own with interest. So take the talent from him, and give it to the one with the ten talents. For to all those who have, more will be given, and

they will have an abundance, but from those who have nothing, even what they have will be taken away. As for this worthless slave, throw him into the outer darkness, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth."

OUR THEOLOGY OF GENEROSITY

Jesus assumed his followers would be giving generously and believed that giving is the most important and fundamental spiritual practice. The more closely we follow Jesus the more generous we become as individuals and as a community of faith. We expect our members to make the church the priority in their giving. Our covenant states, "We covenant together to nurture this church... by the dedication of our personal and material resources, and by all the other ways we express the significance of our lives with God and one another." As an inclusive community for spirituality and social justice, we are changing lives at MPBC, and we can't do it without you. We are depending on the financial engagement of every person to increase our impact and create sustainability.

Here's how you can start your journey of generosity:

- 1. Prayerfully reflect on what the church means to you and examine your capacity for generosity.
- 2. Start by giving something and try to make it a regular practice. Every dollar matters and each person can give something. Consistency is what matters.
- 3. Commit to increase your gift each year by a dollar amount or percentage.
- 4. Give above and beyond when you are able to help us reach our yearly goals.

YOUR GIVING JOURNEY

GROWING IN GENEROSITY

We are people on a journey of faith and our journey involves growing to become more fearless and generous as followers of Jesus for the sake of our own spiritual development and for our church. Where do you see yourself on this journey of generosity?

GIVER

is typically someone who is new to the church or getting more engaged and has made the decision to give for the first time.

CONSISTENT GIVER

is typically someone who participates in church programing beyond worship and has made the decision to give on a regular basis. This is often achieved by making a recurring gift online at https://pushpay.com/g/myersparkbaptist/.

INTENTIONAL GIVER

is typically someone who participates in church on a weekly basis and has made the decision to spend significant time reflecting on what they give their material resources to and has placed the church at the top of the list. This is often achieved by allocating 5% to 10% of one's income to the church.

COMMITTED GIVER

is typically someone who is 100% "all in" on the mission and vision of the church and/or one of the church's leaders, who has made the decision to let their giving govern their personal or family's finances by having giving determine their spending and saving, not the other way around.

SACRIFICIAL GIVER

is typically someone who is a church leader or long-time member who is constantly striving to increase their capacity to give more generously to the church. They strategize about the long-term impact of their generosity and see the sum total of their giving over their lifetime as a strategic investment in something greater than themselves.


