Praying with First Baptist Church

A Prayer Guide for the week of April 21

Prayer of the week:

One of the ways we learn to pray is by using the examples in Scripture as a springboard and inspiration for our own prayer life. This week, we encourage you to use the praise of the Apostle Paul from 1 Thessalonians 2:13 as a specific way to give thanks to God:

¹³ And we also thank God constantly for this, that when you received the word of God, which you heard from us, you accepted it not as the word of men but as what it really is, the word of God, which is at work in you believers.

We recognize our need for God's help in all the areas of our lives. The categories and requests listed below are intentional ways to pray for each other as a church family. For help in knowing how and what to pray for, look up the Scripture included with each item.

Ongoing prayer items in the life of our church:

- Pray for opportunities and boldness to share the gospel with loved ones (Matt. 28:19)
- Pray for conversions (John 3:3, Acts 16:14)
- Pray for the children of our church to hear and understand the gospel and be saved. (Luke 8:8)
- Pray for the preaching of God's word for faithfulness, fruitfulness, and God's glory (2 Tim. 4:2, 1 Cor. 2:4-5, Isa. 55:10-11)
- Pray for increased one to one discipleship relationships in our church family (Matt. 28:19-20)
- Pray for unity in our diversity both on Sunday and through the week (Rom. 15:13, Eph 4:2-3)
- Pray for continued growth and joy in the gospel (1 Cor. 15:1-5, 2 Pet. 1:12)
- Pray for growth in holiness, hatred of sin and growth in humility (Prov. 8:13, 1 Pet. 1:14-16)
- Pray for honest, loving relationships in our church (Col. 3:12-13, James 5:16)
- Pray for families: marriages to thrive, parents to teach/love/discipline carefully, and children to obey (Eph. 5:22-6:4)
- Pray that giving would be faithful, joyful, consistent, and sacrificial (2 Cor. 8:9)

Prayer items outside our church:

- Pray that our elected officials would fear God, seek His wisdom, have integrity, humility, and work together for the good of society and not self. (1 Tim. 2:1-2, Rom. 13:1-7)
- Pray for fruitful ministry in other gospel-proclaiming churches in our area. (Rom. 15:20, 1 Cor. 16:1-3, Matt. 28:19-20)

- Pray that God would bring a swift end to wars going on throughout the world and establish peace. Pray for protection and care for the many refugees fleeing to safety. Pray that those impacted would trust in God in the midst of their suffering. (Ps. 139:23-24)
- Pray for our ministry partners locally and around the world—Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware (BCM/D), North American Mission Board (NAMB) and International Mission Board (IMB). Pray especially for those we are directly involved with: Jeremy McClain (Mercy of Christ Fellowship Church, DC), Joel Kurz (The Garden Church, Baltimore), Daniel and Brandy Spandler-Davison and Susanna Schriever (Bangkok City Baptist Church, Thailand). Pray the gospel would flourish and churches would be planted and strengthened through their work. Pray that God would supply their needs. (Ps 93:4, Col. 1:5-6, 1 Pet. 4:12-17)

Particular prayer items in the life of our church:

- Pray that God would deepen our desire for prayer as a church family. May we not grow weary or apathetic in bringing our concerns to Him. May God help us to sense His presence and power as we pray. (Rom 12:12, Col 4:2)
- Pray that we know a profound contentment no matter what circumstances we find ourselves in a contentment from knowing God is our help. (Heb. 13:5-6)
- Pray that God would renew our strength when we're weary and use our weakness to display His power. (2 Cor. 12:9)
- Pray that a culture of discipleship, joyful hospitality, and care grows in us as a church family (1 Pt 4:9; Col. 3:16)
- Pray for those in our church family who are going through a significant time of suffering—physically or mentally. Pray for peace. Pray for a keen awareness of God's presence and a desire to draw near to him. Pray for experiences of joy in Christ and in fellowship with church family. (Is. 26:3-4, Ps. 34:18, Ps. 30:1-5)
- Pray that God would help us comprehend his good design for the church and center our lives around it for the sake of his glory being made known. (Eph 3:10; 3:21)

Family Guide for week of April 21st

Deuteronomy 6:6–7 And these words that I command you today shall be on your heart. You shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, and when you walk by the way, and when you lie down, and when you rise.



Suggestions on getting started:

- Decide on a time & place (breakfast, dinner, before bed, etc...)
- Start simple and short (ten minutes or less). Start with three things: 1) Read God's word, 2) Pray together and 3) Sing together. Scripture memory and catechism questions are optional if you have the time. Better to start small than bite off more than you can chew and give up.
- Be flexible. It doesn't need to look cookie-cutter similar for every family. Know yourself and know your kids: their personality, age, maturity, etc. [For younger kids consider starting with a good children's Bible like <u>The Big Picture Story</u> <u>Bible</u>.]
- If you don't know the answer to a question someone has, don't act like you
 do! Say something like, "Great question, let me look into that." Study, ask a
 pastor or Christian friend and get back to them.
- Embrace the chaos. Kids are kids don't expect it to be a perfect roundtable discussion with quiet, attentive children every time. Be patient and persistent. Patterns and habits help to set expectations over time.

Praying with Paul

Philippians 1:3-11 "Praying for Discernment" April 21, 2024



Introduction

It is critical for each member of the body of Christ to work together for a common goal. To win the race, we must act as a single entity working together. Paul's letter to the Philippians is a call to partnership - a shared commitment to the gospel. It isn't just about being in the same boat but working together under the guidance and instruction of Christ.

If Paul is giving this encouragement to a church that he desires to see together, how are we as a church growing together in Christ? Are we in sync or are we each rowing at our own pace and in our own direction? How can we actively cultivate a true partnership in the gospel?

Sermon Outline

- 1. We must encourage gospel commitment. Vs. 3-5
- 2. We are to develop partnerships of grace. Vs. 6-8
- 3. We are to be fruitful in the righteousness of Christ. Vs. 9-11

Read & Discuss

1. Read vs. 3-5

Paul wrote this letter from prison. He had been to Philippi where many were converted, and they had labored with him in the gospel. He wrote to them to help them understand his situation and to encourage them. He encouraged them to keep the gospel going.

Is there someone you can contact this week to encourage them in their faith? What evidences of grace can you point out in others? Paul found joy in thinking of them because of his partnership with them in the gospel. We are not alone in our service for the Lord. Our lives are intertwined with God, and we are partners in the gospel. How are you involved in the ministry of the church?

Additional Reading: Acts 16

2. Read vs. 6-8

Grace helps us live in accordance with what God has called us to do. We must show grace to one another since we have received the grace of God through Jesus. We are vessels in ministry, but God works in and through us.

Paul commended them for their gifts to him, assisting him in his ministry. They gave freely. How are you being challenged in your stewardship of your time, talent and treasure? Our own church has many global partnerships. Your prayers and contributions further the gospel around the world. Are you nurturing others in the gospel?

3. Read vs. 9-11

Paul prays that their love would abound more in knowledge and discernment. There were many things that Paul could have prayed for, but he focused on spiritual fruit. Love comes under the guidance and authority of the Holy Spirit. (Galatians 5:22-23) Paul wanted them to be aligned with what God said, not the world. He wanted the best for them as they were growing in their faith to the glory of God alone. What things are you doing that promote spiritual growth in your life?

Prayer of Response

- 1) After hearing God's Word, what sin do I need to confess? From what do I need to repent?
- 2) How should my life be lived this week based on what I have heard? What should I understand, believe, desire, or do?
