Praying with First Baptist Church

A Prayer Guide for the week of May 12

Prayer of the week:

One of the ways we learn to pray is by using the examples in Scripture as a springboard and inspiration for our own prayer life. This week, consider using the words of Ephesians 1:16-17 to pray for yourself and others:

¹⁶ I do not cease to give thanks for you, remembering you in my prayers, ¹⁷ that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give you the Spirit of wisdom and of revelation in the knowledge of him,

We recognize our need for God's help in all the areas of our lives. The categories and requests listed below are intentional ways to pray for each other as a church family. For help in knowing how and what to pray for, look up the Scripture included with each item.

Ongoing prayer items in the life of our church:

- Pray for opportunities and boldness to share the gospel with loved ones (Matt. 28:19)
- Pray for conversions (John 3:3, Acts 16:14)
- Pray for the children of our church to hear and understand the gospel and be saved. (Luke 8:8)
- Pray for the preaching of God's word for faithfulness, fruitfulness, and God's glory (2 Tim. 4:2, 1 Cor. 2:4-5, Isa. 55:10-11)
- Pray for increased one to one discipleship relationships in our church family (Matt. 28:19-20)
- Pray for unity in our diversity both on Sunday and through the week (Rom. 15:13, Eph 4:2-3)
- Pray for continued growth and joy in the gospel (1 Cor. 15:1-5, 2 Pet. 1:12)
- Pray for growth in holiness, hatred of sin and growth in humility (Prov. 8:13, 1 Pet. 1:14-16)
- Pray for honest, loving relationships in our church (Col. 3:12-13, James 5:16)
- Pray for families: marriages to thrive, parents to teach/love/discipline carefully, and children to obey (Eph. 5:22-6:4)
- Pray that giving would be faithful, joyful, consistent, and sacrificial (2 Cor. 8:9)

Prayer items outside our church:

- Pray that our elected officials would fear God, seek His wisdom, have integrity, humility, and work together for the good of society and not self. (1 Tim. 2:1-2, Rom. 13:1-7)
- Pray for fruitful ministry in other gospel-proclaiming churches in our area. (Rom. 15:20, 1 Cor. 16:1-3, Matt. 28:19-20)

- Pray that God would bring a swift end to wars going on throughout the world and establish peace. Pray for protection and care for the many refugees fleeing to safety. Pray that those impacted would trust in God in the midst of their suffering. (Ps. 139:23-24)
- Pray for our ministry partners locally and around the world—Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware (BCM/D), North American Mission Board (NAMB) and International Mission Board (IMB). Pray especially for those we are directly involved with: Jeremy McClain (Mercy of Christ Fellowship Church, DC), Joel Kurz (The Garden Church, Baltimore), Daniel and Brandy Spandler-Davison and Susanna Schriever (Bangkok City Baptist Church, Thailand). Pray the gospel would flourish and churches would be planted and strengthened through their work. Pray that God would supply their needs. (Ps 93:4, Col. 1:5-6, 1 Pet. 4:12-17)

Particular prayer items in the life of our church:

- Pray for our upcoming Members Meeting on May 19 after worship. Pray that God would continually help us to grow in unity and service to one another as fellow believers here at FBCUM and help us work together for kingdom purposes. (Eph 4:2-3)
- Pray for teachers and students in our church family who are completing their final weeks of classes for the school year. Pray that God would help them to finish well and give them physical and spiritual strength to endure. See a list of our out-of-town college students toward the back of the church directory.
- Pray that we know a profound contentment no matter what circumstances we find ourselves in a contentment from knowing God is our help. (Heb. 13:5-6)
- Pray that God would renew our strength when we're weary and use our weakness to display His power. (2 Cor. 12:9)
- Pray that a culture of discipleship, joyful hospitality, and care grows in us as a church family (1 Pt 4:9; Col. 3:16)
- Pray for those in our church family who are going through a significant time of suffering—physically or mentally. Pray for peace. Pray for a keen awareness of God's presence and a desire to draw near to him. Pray for experiences of joy in Christ and in fellowship with church family. (Is. 26:3-4, Ps. 34:18, Ps. 30:1-5)
- Pray that God would help us comprehend his good design for the church and center our lives around it for the sake of his glory being made known. (Eph 3:10; 3:21)

Revelation: Following Our Victorious King

Revelation 7:1-17

"Salvation Belongs to Our God" – May 12, 2024



Introduction

The Christian life is a marathon. It calls for endurance and perseverance. Trials, tragedies, temptations, as well as the enemy cause Christians to be weary, wondering if they will ever make it. Revelation 7 equips and encourages us for the race.

In chapter six, we see the first six seals opened - the sixth seal tells us about the end of history and the final judgment. Before the seventh seal is open in chapter eight, chapter seven answers the question at the end of chapter six – "Who can stand?"

Sermon Outline

- 1. Rest assured; God will rescue all His people. Vs. 1-12
- 2. Fuel your running with worship. Vs. 13-17

Read & Discuss

1. Read vs. 1-12

Chapter seven begins with the next vision that God showed John. The four winds are the winds of judgment. The angels hold back the winds of God's judgment, so they don't completely destroy the earth. There is a day of judgment coming. God is not slow to fulfill that promise of judgment. He is patient. In restraining His final judgment, God gives you and me time to come to Him in faith and repentance.

In verses four through eight, we are told the number of the sealed. In verses nine through twelve, we see a great multitude from every nation, tribe, and tongue. There are several views on the interpretation of these verses. As a church, we must agree that Jesus is coming back. We must agree that He will sit on the throne and judge the earth. We can disagree on some of the peripheral issues.

Remember this is apocalyptic literature. The number of the sealed is meant to be read symbolically. We are meant to read this as a complete number of Christians from the Old Testament and the New Testament - a battalion of the redeemed. When God called Abraham in Genesis 12, He said that through him, all the nations of the earth will be blessed. (Genesis 22:18; Galatians 3:7; Romans 2:28-29) The church of Jesus Christ is made up of all those who repent and trust in Jesus as Messiah. We can't see who is "sealed." We don't know who will trust in Jesus. We can't see what God sees. God knows the number - we don't. So, we share the gospel with confidence. With whom do you need to share the good news of the gospel with today?

What is the seal? It is God's name, and God's name represents God's character. When one hears the gospel and comes to faith in Christ, they are sealed with the Holy Spirit. (Ephesians 1:13) When God puts His name on you, He is saying, "They belong to me." He will protect you till the end. Jesus bought us with the price of His life. He put His name on us. We belong to Him, and He will protect His own.

So, who can stand on the great and terrible day of judgment? Those who are sealed by God and clothed in white robes! Salvation belongs to God. (<u>Jonah 2:9</u>) It is given to us by grace! God knows, numbers, and cares for His people. He knows your name. He knows everything that is happening in your life, and He cares. Because of this, we can know that not one of His sheep will be snatched from His strong hand. (<u>John 10:1-30</u>) God will rescue all His people. If you belong to Jesus, you are going to make it!! Are there circumstances in your life that tempt you to doubt whether you will make it? What are they? Do you see the finish line? You will make it one day, but what about now?

2. Read vs. 13-17

After the vision of a redeemed people, the elder questions John about who these people are. They have come out of the great tribulation - the period of time that happens between Jesus first coming and His second coming. Remember, this has been written to the seven churches in Asia who represent all churches. He is telling those churches to get ready for tribulation. (Revelation 2:9-10) In this world, you will have tribulation. (John 16:33, Acts 14:22, Matthew 24:21) When the kingdom of God clashes with the kingdom of this world, there will be tribulation.

When we see the value of our future reward, we can make it through tribulation. Knowing what is to come makes the journey worth it. Don't forget where we are going and the value of the reward. We are comforted by worship. What does it mean to worship? Verses 10-12 give us a glimpse.

Blessing is what you get excited about. It naturally invokes praise. Glory is what you deem beautiful. Wisdom is the path that you see is good and life-giving. Honor is what you value, prize, and treasure. Thanksgiving is an overflow of gratitude. Power and strength (might) are where you look for protection. In this scripture, all seven of these terms have the same object - God.

We worship 24/7. We always value, praise, bless or honor something. The question is not, "will you worship?" It is, "what are you worshiping?" In what do you find worth? What is valuable to you? What gets you out of bed in the morning? What is life-giving to you? What are the things you are thankful for? If you worship anything but God, you will run out of gas. We must fix our eyes on Jesus. (Hebrews. 12:1-2)

Prayer of Response

- 1) After hearing God's Word, what sin do I need to confess? From what do I need to repent?
- 2) How should my life be lived this week based on what I have heard? What should I understand, believe, desire, or do?

Spend time praying together in response to God's word asking for His help and greater faith to follow Him in the week to come. If you missed the sermon on Sunday or would like to listen again, visit our website at fbcum.org

Family Guide for week of May 12th

Suggestions on getting started:

- Decide on a time & place (breakfast, dinner, before bed, etc...)
- Start simple and short (ten minutes or less). Start with three things: 1) Read God's word, 2) Pray together and 3) Sing together. Scripture memory and catechism questions are optional if you have the time. Better to start small than bite off more than you can chew and give up.
- Be flexible. It doesn't need to look cookie-cutter similar for every family. Know yourself and know your kids: their personality, age, maturity, etc. [For younger kids consider starting with a good children's Bible like <u>The Big Picture Story</u> <u>Bible</u>.]
- If you don't know the answer to a question someone has, don't act like you
 do! Say something like, "Great question, let me look into that." Study, ask a
 pastor or Christian friend and get back to them.
- Embrace the chaos. Kids are kids don't expect it to be a perfect roundtable discussion with quiet, attentive children every time. Be patient and persistent. Patterns and habits help to set expectations over time.
