Praying with First Baptist Church

A Prayer Guide for the week of October 6

Prayer of the week:

Consider using the Apostle Paul's prayer from the book of Colossians 1:9-10 as a springboard for your own prayer time this week. This is a great prayer to use as you pray through the church directory for your church family this week.

⁹...we have not ceased to pray for you, asking that you may be filled with the knowledge of his will in all spiritual wisdom and understanding, ¹⁰ so as to walk in a manner worthy of the Lord, fully pleasing to him: bearing fruit in every good work and increasing in the knowledge of God.

We recognize our need for God's help in all the areas of our lives. The categories and requests listed below are intentional ways to pray for each other as a church family. For help in knowing how and what to pray for, look up the Scripture included with each item.

Ongoing prayer items in the life of our church:

- Pray for opportunities and boldness to share the gospel with loved ones (Matt. 28:19)
- Pray for conversions (John 3:3, Acts 16:14)
- Pray for the children of our church to hear and understand the gospel and be saved. (Luke 8:8)
- Pray for the preaching of God's word for faithfulness, fruitfulness, and God's glory (2 Tim. 4:2, 1 Cor. 2:4-5, Isa. 55:10-11)
- Pray for increased one to one discipleship relationships in our church family (Matt. 28:19-20)
- Pray for unity in our diversity both on Sunday and through the week (Rom. 15:13, Eph 4:2-3)
- Pray for continued growth and joy in the gospel (1 Cor. 15:1-5, 2 Pet. 1:12)
- Pray for growth in holiness, hatred of sin and growth in humility (Prov. 8:13, 1 Pet. 1:14-16)
- Pray for honest, loving relationships in our church (Col. 3:12-13, James 5:16)
- Pray for families: marriages to thrive, parents to teach/love/discipline carefully, and children to obey (Eph. 5:22-6:4)
- Pray that giving would be faithful, joyful, consistent, and sacrificial (2 Cor. 8:9)

Prayer items outside our church:

- Pray that our elected officials would fear God, seek His wisdom, have integrity, humility, and work together for the good of society and not self. (1 Tim. 2:1-2, Rom. 13:1-7)



Revelation: Following Our Victorious King

Revelation 20:11-15

"The Final Reckoning" - October 6, 2024



Introduction

When you think about your mortality, are you ready to face death? Are you afraid? What logic or intellectual arguments do you use to alleviate those fears? What if all your arguments and logic lead to a future of death and destruction?

Seeing the end, calibrates your thoughts and beliefs today. God's word will help you see the truth. God's word will shape how you live your last day and prepare you for the future in eternity.

Sermon Outline

- 1. See God sitting as Judge. Vs. 11
- 2. See how the end unfolds. Vs. 12-13
- 3. See who escapes the fires of Hell. Vs. 14-15

Read & Discuss

1. Read vs. 11

The throne mentioned here shows up forty-seven times in the book of Revelation. John didn't want us to miss this. We must see all of life's ups and downs, triumphs and tragedies through this lens - God is on His throne. He is working all things according to His will. He is ruling ALL things.

He will not only sit on the throne as the Sovereign One, but as Judge. This will happen after Christ returns, and it is not a trivial matter. As a result, people will be thrown into the Lake of Fire. God has authority because He is our Creator! (Revelation 4:11) This great white throne reflects God's holiness. His judgments will be just, right, appropriate and holy. (Revelation 19:2) The earth and sky flee because of His overwhelming holiness. (Revelation 6:15-17) Evil, wickedness, and rebellion must be dealt with.

How do you treat this announcement of the coming judgment? Do you take it seriously? There is a God, sitting on His throne. We will give an account for our life. Are you ready to meet this judge? Does seeing the end put things into perspective?

Additional Reading: Revelation 4 & 5

2. Read vs. 12 – 13

Have you done foolish things throughout your life? Everyone has. Here, the books were opened. These books are a record of everything that you and I have done or thought! Every motive for everything is written there. God is everywhere present. He sees all things, including our hearts. He knows all things, and He writes them down in the books. Imagine having everything you have done, said, or thought in the last seven days displayed on a screen for all to see. How would you feel? Pretty bad! Now thing about having all you've said, done or thought over the course of your life displayed on a screen.

On that day the books will be open. People will be judged according to what they have done. Who is going to stand before God on this day? The great and the dead. For the dead to be standing, there must be a resurrection. God will raise them. All the graves will be open. Everyone will be there! (John 5:28-29)

Imagine that today is your last day. If God asks you, "Why should I let you into My Heaven?", what would you say? If it has anything to do with the good things you have done, that will not be the right answer. There is no scale where your good deeds outweigh the bad. Your hope cannot be those good deeds. Your sin is still in the books. There is no bell curve, or comparison to the person sitting next to you. Our hope cannot be in good deeds or comparisons. The standard is the perfection of God. What is your hope? How can you answer God?

The only way out of the Lake of Fire is to have your name written in the Book of Life! Do you see this holy, mighty Judge sitting on His throne? Are you ready? Are you living today knowing that this final day is coming? God wants us to be ready!

3. Read vs. 14 – 15

The first death is our physical death. All will be raised to stand before the Judge. The second death is different. It is the Lake of Fire. It is not a joke nor to be taken lightly. Those who are in the Lake of Fire are tormented day and night forever. (Revelation 20:10)

What is it about having your name in the book of life that saves you from this judgment? (Revelation 13:8) The Bible is clear. Jesus, the Lamb of God, was slain on our behalf. (Colossian 2:13-14) The record of debt is canceled by the blood of Jesus! On the cross, the Lamb of God, took the book, set it aside and nailed it to the cross. All your sins - past, present and future - are paid for!! Jesus endured the equivalent of Hell so that we could be forgiven.

Whose names are written in the book of Life? Those who have seen their guilt and know their need of a Savior, taking refuge in the Lamb will find their name in the book of Life. Do you see what is written in the books about your life? Do you see how Jesus is the only way of escape? If so, what are you waiting for? Come to Jesus in repentance and faith. Jesus will NEVER cast out anyone who comes to Him. (John 6:37) Don't let anything distract you or hold you back. Turn from living for yourself and come to Jesus.

Four applications for how seeing the end can help you:

- 1. It shows us that life has meaning. There is a God, and He is writing history. (1 Corinthians 15:58)
- 2. It urges us to strive for holiness. We don't have to succumb to the pressure to conform to the world. We are set free and made new creations. (1 John 3:2-3)
- 3. We can be patient when we are wronged. Justice delayed can feel like justice denied. The books remind us that no one will get away with sin. (Romans 12:19) God will make the wrong right.
- 4. It reminds us of the urgency of sharing the gospel. If Hell is real, and it is, and if God has shown us how to escape the fires of hell through Jesus, we should tell others about the Good News as much as possible?

Prayer of Response

- 1) After hearing God's Word, what sin do I need to confess? From what do I need to repent?
- 2) How should my life be lived this week based on what I have heard? What should I understand, believe, desire, or do?

Spend time praying together in response to God's word asking for His help and greater faith to follow Him in the week to come. If you missed the sermon on Sunday or would like to listen again, visit our website at fbcum.org

Family Guide for week of October 6th, 2024

Deuteronomy 6:6–7 And these words that I command you today shall be on your heart. You shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, and when you walk by the way, and when you lie down, and when you rise.



Suggestions on getting started:

- Decide on a time & place (breakfast, dinner, before bed, etc...)
- Start simple and short (ten minutes or less). Start with three things: 1) Read God's word, 2) Pray together and 3) Sing together. Scripture memory and catechism questions are optional if you have the time. Better to start small than bite off more than you can chew and give up.
- Be flexible. It doesn't need to look cookie-cutter similar for every family. Know yourself and know your kids: their personality, age, maturity, etc. [For younger kids consider starting with a good children's Bible like <u>The Big Picture Story</u> <u>Bible</u>.]
- If you don't know the answer to a question someone has, don't act like you
 do! Say something like, "Great question, let me look into that." Study, ask a
 pastor or Christian friend and get back to them.
- Embrace the chaos. Kids are kids don't expect it to be a perfect roundtable discussion with quiet, attentive children every time. Be patient and persistent. Patterns and habits help to set expectations over time.
