Praying with First Baptist Church

A Prayer Guide for the week of January 5

Prayer of the week:

One of the ways we learn to pray is by using the examples in Scripture as a springboard and inspiration for our own prayer life. This week, we encourage you to use the prayer of the Apostle Paul from the book of Ephesians 3:17b-19:

"...that you, being rooted and grounded in love,¹⁸ may have strength to comprehend with all the saints what is the breadth and length and height and depth, ¹⁹ and to know the love of Christ that surpasses knowledge, that you may be filled with all the fullness of God."

We recognize our need for God's help in all the areas of our lives. The categories and requests listed below are intentional ways to pray for each other as a church family. For help in knowing how and what to pray for, look up the Scripture included with each item.

Ongoing prayer items in the life of our church:

- Pray for opportunities and boldness to share the gospel with loved ones (Matt. 28:19)
- Pray for conversions (John 3:3, Acts 16:14)
- Pray for the children of our church to hear and understand the gospel and be saved. (Luke 8:8)
- Pray for the preaching of God's word for faithfulness, fruitfulness, and God's glory (2 Tim. 4:2, 1 Cor. 2:4-5, Isa. 55:10-11)
- Pray for increased one to one discipleship relationships in our church family (Matt. 28:19-20)
- Pray for unity in our diversity both on Sunday and through the week (Rom. 15:13, Eph 4:2-3)
- Pray for continued growth and joy in the gospel (1 Cor. 15:1-5, 2 Pet. 1:12)
- Pray for growth in holiness, hatred of sin and growth in humility (Prov. 8:13, 1 Pet. 1:14-16)
- Pray for honest, loving relationships in our church (Col. 3:12-13, James 5:16)
- Pray for families: marriages to thrive, parents to teach/love/discipline carefully, and children to obey (Eph. 5:22-6:4)
- Pray that giving would be faithful, joyful, consistent, and sacrificial (2 Cor. 8:9)

Prayer items outside our church:

- Pray that our elected officials would fear God, seek His wisdom, have integrity, humility, and work together for the good of society and not self. (1 Tim. 2:1-2, Rom. 13:1-7)
- Pray for fruitful ministry in other gospel-proclaiming churches in our area. (Rom. 15:20, 1 Cor. 16:1-3, Matt. 28:19-20)

- Pray that God would bring a swift end to wars going on throughout the world and establish peace. Pray for protection and care for the many refugees fleeing to safety. Pray that those impacted would trust in God in the midst of their suffering. (Ps. 139:23-24)
- Pray for our ministry partners locally and around the world—Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware (BCM/D), North American Mission Board (NAMB) and International Mission Board (IMB). Pray especially for those we are directly involved with: Jeremy McClain (Mercy of Christ Fellowship Church, DC), Joel Kurz (The Garden Church, Baltimore), Daniel and Brandy Spandler-Davison and Susanna Schriever (Bangkok City Baptist Church, Thailand). Pray the gospel would flourish and churches would be planted and strengthened through their work. Pray that God would supply their needs. (Ps 93:4, Col. 1:5-6, 1 Pet. 4:12-17)

God's Word for God's People

John 2:1-11

"Believing Jesus" – January 5, 2025



Introduction

Have you ever missed an important sign? Maybe you missed your exit because you didn't see the directional sign, or you got a ticket because you didn't see a speed limit sign. A sign is given to us for a purpose. If we miss the sign we are not absolved of our responsibility. This miracle at Cana was a sign.

Why do we miss signs? We miss signs because we are simply not paying attention. We miss signs because of our ego. We miss signs because we don't believe what the sign says. We miss signs because we believe the sign itself is the destination. Here, we see a sign that Jesus gives us. It is possible that some might come to Jesus just to "get the wine," but Jesus IS the wine. He is the destination. The signs point to greater spiritual realities so that we might believe.

Previously in the book of John, we see that Jesus had gathered His disciples. Now, He was giving them a sign so that might be confident that they were following the right person. This was a wedding - a time of joy, life, love. This was the story into which we are drawn. At a wedding, the groom was responsible for having enough wine for all to partake in during the days of celebration. If they ran out, it would have brought great shame to the groom and subsequently, to the bride and her family.

Jesus was being directed by His Father. We are about to see a sign. This sign is given so thy we might believe that Jesus is the Christ. You don't want to miss Jesus, but in our flesh, it is possible to do just that. What does it mean to believe? Here are three lessons in believing.

Sermon Outline

- 1. Trust Jesus with your problem. Vs. 1-5
- 2. Follow Jesus with your actions. Vs. 6-8
- 3. Entrust Jesus with your life. Vs 9-11

Read & Discuss

1. Read vs. 1 – 5

Mary cared about the need. Mary was persistent in her request to Jesus, yet she didn't know what Jesus was going to do. She just knew that she had to take her problem to Him. She knew Who Jesus was and that He was able! Do you try to take matters in your own hands, or do you take your problems to Jesus? Are you currently facing some problems? Are you exhausted trying to fix it yourself? Jesus can take every situation in your life and use it for your good and His glory.

Our greatest problem is sin - the sin that separates us from God. How could it be fixed? Jesus! Have you trusted Jesus with your sin problem?

2. Read Vs. 6 – 8

The servants couldn't provide wine, but they could follow every instruction that Jesus gave. Even though Jesus instructions didn't make sense to them, they did what He said. Obedience to Jesus doesn't always make sense. We must act according to His wisdom not ours. We must obey because we are called to do so. When you are tempted to sin, are you able to trust Jesus and obey His commands? Do you trust Jesus enough to obey even when it doesn't make sense?

You can't do it by yourself. Only God can do what God can do, but you are called to do what you can do - obey God. Turn from sin. Flee from temptation. Love your neighbor. Then watch God do what God can do. He gives faith. He replaces desires. He gives us the Holy Spirit. We can trust Him.

Jesus was doing something specifically for the disciples so that they would know that they were believing the right person. (John 20:31) Do you believe that Jesus is the Christ?

3. Read vs. 9 - 10

The disciples followed Jesus. They gave their lives for Jesus. Every step of the way, they believed. You cannot trust if you don't know. You won't obey Jesus if you do not believe who He says He is. These signs are God's kindness to us. Jesus stepped into time and healed the sick, raised the dead, etc. so that we might believe. While we can't physically see the things the disciples saw, Jesus has shown us that we can trust Him. This is the reason for the signs – they point us to Jesus.

Jesus' true glory is not seen in the wine, but the wine is a taste of the glory that is to come. Jesus took the old basins that were used for cleansing (that could never truly and completely cleanse) and filled them with something far better. A new era had begun. What Jesus brings is fullness of joy and life. He was ushering in the new covenant. We are His bride. He is our Groom. The life He brings is better! One day, we will feast forever with Him! Until then, we trust and obey. What is going on in your life right now that you need to come to Jesus with and trust Him?

Prayer of Response

- 1) After hearing God's Word, what sin do I need to confess? From what do I need to repent?
- 2) How should my life be lived this week based on what I have heard? What should I understand, believe, desire, or do?

Family Guide for week of January 5th, 2025

Suggestions on getting started:

- Decide on a time & place (breakfast, dinner, before bed, etc...)
- Start simple and short (ten minutes or less). Start with three things: 1) Read God's word, 2) Pray together and 3) Sing together. Scripture memory and catechism questions are optional if you have the time. Better to start small than bite off more than you can chew and give up.
- Be flexible. It doesn't need to look cookie-cutter similar for every family. Know yourself and know your kids: their personality, age, maturity, etc. [For younger kids consider starting with a good children's Bible like <u>The Big Picture Story</u> <u>Bible</u>.]
- If you don't know the answer to a question someone has, don't act like you
 do! Say something like, "Great question, let me look into that." Study, ask a
 pastor or Christian friend and get back to them.
- Embrace the chaos. Kids are kids don't expect it to be a perfect roundtable discussion with quiet, attentive children every time. Be patient and persistent. Patterns and habits help to set expectations over time.
