# Scripture Reading — Genesis 3:1-13 (ESV)

<sup>1</sup> Now the serpent was more crafty than any other beast of the field that the Lord God had made.

He said to the woman, "Did God actually say, 'You shall not eat of any tree in the garden'?" <sup>2</sup> And the woman said to the serpent, "We may eat of the fruit of the trees in the garden, <sup>3</sup> but God said, 'You shall not eat of the fruit of the tree that is in the midst of the garden, neither shall you touch it, lest you die.'" <sup>4</sup> But the serpent said to the woman, "You will not surely die. <sup>5</sup> For God knows that when you eat of it your eyes will be opened, and you will be like God, knowing good and evil." <sup>6</sup> So when the woman saw that the tree was good for food, and that it was a delight to the eyes, and that the tree was to be desired to make one wise, she took of its fruit and ate, and she also gave some to her husband who was with her, and he ate. <sup>7</sup> Then the eyes of both were opened, and they knew that they were naked. # **Praying with First Baptist Church**

A Prayer Guide for the week of March 2

# Prayer of the week:

It's often helpful to pray the Scripture as a springboard and inspiration for our own prayer life. As you pray for yourself and others this week, we encourage you to consider the brief prayer of the Apostle Paul in 2 Thessalonians 3:5:

"May the Lord direct your hearts to the love of God and to the steadfastness of Christ."

We recognize our need for God's help in all the areas of our lives. The categories and requests listed below are intentional ways to pray for each other as a church family. For help in knowing how and what to pray for, look up the Scripture included with each item.

## Ongoing prayer items in the life of our church:

- Pray for opportunities and boldness to share the gospel with loved ones (Matt. 28:19)
- Pray for conversions (John 3:3, Acts 16:14)
- Pray for the children of our church to hear and understand the gospel and be saved. (Luke 8:8)
- Pray for the preaching of God's word for faithfulness, fruitfulness, and God's glory (2 Tim. 4:2, 1 Cor. 2:4-5, Isa. 55:10-11)
- Pray for increased one to one discipleship relationships in our church family (Matt. 28:19-20)
- Pray for unity in our diversity both on Sunday and through the week (Rom. 15:13, Eph 4:2-3)
- Pray for continued growth and joy in the gospel (1 Cor. 15:1-5, 2 Pet. 1:12)
- Pray for growth in holiness, hatred of sin and growth in humility (Prov. 8:13, 1 Pet. 1:14-16)
- Pray for honest, loving relationships in our church (Col. 3:12-13, James 5:16)
- Pray for families: marriages to thrive, parents to teach/love/discipline carefully, and children to obey (Eph. 5:22-6:4)
- Pray that giving would be faithful, joyful, consistent, and sacrificial (2 Cor. 8:9)

# Prayer items outside our church:

- Pray that our elected officials would fear God, seek His wisdom, have integrity, humility, and work together for the good of society and not self. (1 Tim. 2:1-2, Rom. 13:1-7)
- Pray for fruitful ministry in other gospel-proclaiming churches in our area. (Rom. 15:20, 1 Cor. 16:1-3, Matt. 28:19-20)
- Pray that God would bring a swift end to wars going on throughout the world and establish peace. Pray for protection and care for the many refugees fleeing to safety. Pray that those impacted would trust in God in the midst of their suffering. (Ps. 139:23-24)

Pray for our ministry partners locally and around the world—Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware (BCM/D), North American Mission Board (NAMB) and International Mission Board (IMB). Pray especially for those we have direct partnerships with: Jeremy McClain (Mercy of Christ Fellowship Church, DC), Joel Kurz (The Garden Church, Baltimore), Daniel and Brandy Spandler-Davison and Susanna Schriever (Bangkok City Baptist Church, Thailand). Pray the gospel would flourish and churches would be planted and strengthened through their work. Pray that God would supply their needs. (Ps 93:4, Col. 1:5-6, 1 Pet. 4:12-17)

# Particular prayer items in the life of our church:

- Praise God for several new babies being born among our church family. Pray that the children in our church would hear and understand the gospel and be saved. Pray that their families and other faithful Christian adults in the church would faithfully teach and show them how to live out God's commands. (Luke 8:8)

- Pray that a culture of discipleship, joyful hospitality, and care grows in us as a church family (1 Pt 4:9; Col. 3:16)

Pray for a keen awareness of God's presence and a desire to draw near to him. Pray for experiences of joy in Christ and in fellowship with church family. (Is. 26:3-4, Ps. 34:18, Ps. 30:1-5)

# 1st Timothy: Church as Pillar and Foundation of Truth

1 Timothy 2:11-15

"Men and Women in Worship Part 2" – March 2, 2025



#### Introduction

Authority, when abused, steals life however, authority when used well, gives life. God, in His wisdom, has designed structures of authority to cause life to flourish. We see this in society with teachers, coaches, police officers, husbands and fathers.

In this text, we see God's design for authority and structure in the church. A casual reading of this scripture may cause some women to bristle at the words. Are you tempted to skip this text or change it? Some men have used this text to demean and abuse women for selfish or evil purposes. This is wrong and why it is hard to see the good in this text.

We teach this text today because it comes after vs. 10, and ALL scripture is important to read, teach, and preach. (2 Timothy 3:16) God is good. Everything that He says and does is good and for our good. Let's look at the goodness, wisdom, and beauty of God's design.

#### **Read & Discuss**

#### 1. Read vs. 11

For the first century reader, the first part of this verse is shocking – "Let a woman learn." Yet for a woman in the 21st century, the second part of this verse is shocking – "quietly." By this, Paul had in mind a peaceful and quiet demeanor. Women should be teachable. Submission is a common Christian response. (Titus 3:1, Ephesians 5:24; 1 Timothy 3:4; Titus 2:9; James 4:7) Submission is a voluntary and willing acceptance of the leadership and responsibility of another. When we submit, we are offering a gift of trust. Does the idea of submission sound strange to you? Is it a challenge for you to submit in any of the ways mentioned in scripture?

Jesus submitted to God in His incarnation. (Philippians 2:5-8) Why did Jesus take on flesh and submit to the point of death? Mankind sinfully refused to submit to God as King. (Romans 6:23; Romans 5:8) Jesus paid the ransom for our sin. This resurrected Christ calls us to trust Him. This is the good news of Christianity. Have you come to Christ in repentance and faith?

When the entire church gathers, we should **all** listen, with submissiveness, to the teaching of God's word. (<u>Luke 10:38-42</u>) Like Jesus, Paul wanted every woman in the church to learn. Ladies, do you consider yourself a theologian? Are you aware of all of the avenues in our church whereby you can learn God's word? What are you doing to grow in the wisdom and knowledge of God?

#### 2. Read vs. 12

When the church is gathered, women are not permitted to teach. He was not saying that women are incompetent to teach or that they can't teach at all. There are many examples of women teaching. (<u>Titus 2:3</u>; <u>Colossians 3:16</u>; <u>Acts 18:26</u>) When the church gathers, the woman is to learn (vs. 11), not teach (vs. 12). She is to be submissive (vs. 11) and not exercise authority over a man (vs. 12). A woman in a church should submit to the pastors in the church and willingly learn from them.

The two activities mentioned in vs. 12 are distinct yet overlapping. They point to the limits of pastoral authority which is exercised when he preaches God's word. This verse is not hard to understand, but it could be hard to embrace, especially if you have been hurt by someone who abused their pastoral authority. (1 Timothy 6:5) Do you struggle with this due to past church experiences? Pastors must sacrifice of themselves so that life can be at work in the church. (2 Corinthians 4:12) Pray for the elders of our church to teach the whole counsel of God's word faithfully and to not abuse their authority.

Women are not to be elders and pastors, but why? What if a woman feels called to be a pastor? What about the culture of Ephesus? Is Paul addressing a localized issue? Paul gives the answer (the reasons) in vs. 13 and 14.

#### 3. Read vs. 13-14

Paul went back to Genesis 1 – 3, grounding his commands in God's created order. For that reason, Paul's instructions for gender roles in the church were not limited by the culture then. Gender roles are not as a result of sin but God's good design from the beginning. Men and women are created equal but have different roles.

Adam was called to lead. Eve was created from Adam as a helper. They worked together to care for creation and to fill the earth with God's glory by being fruitful and multiplying. Paul was not saying that women were inferior to men.

When you and I meet someone, we ask their name. What is the second question that you typically ask? "What do you do?" The world has based human significance on what we do as a job or our role. Yet our value is not found in that. It is found in the fact that we are made, equally, in God's image. The most value identifying thing about you, whether you are male or female, is that you are made in the image of God - equal in value and significance.

When God's design is rejected or ignored, things go wrong. Eve was deceived and Adam was not. What is Paul getting at? If we review Genesis 3, we see a conversation between the serpent and Eve. Where was Adam? He was there - the whole time. He was given the responsibility to lead and protect, but he did nothing while the serpent was talking to Eve. The fact that Adam was not deceived is not a compliment. His sin, as the leader was blatant. (Romans 5:12-21) The problem being highlighted here is that the role that God gave Adam and Eve had been reversed. The serpent wanted them to question God's good design.

Additional Reading: Genesis 1 - 3

#### 4. Read vs. 15

Paul was not saying that you are saved by having babies nor is he contradicting what he had written in other passages. Salvation is by faith alone, by grace alone, in Christ alone. We are saved by "the" childbirth. God will raise up a Savior. (Genesis 3:15)

The point is not childbearing itself. Paul picked the most obvious womanly trait - bearing children - to say, "embrace your womanliness!" Don't try to be a man and grasp for their responsibilities in the church. Rejoice in who God made you to be and be content in this. It is indispensable and glorious. Women – do you rejoice in your womanliness?

Remember the goodness of God - all that He does and says is good, and our value is not in our role. We are made in God's image. Just as Paul warned us about the danger of being deceived as Eve was, we should not add to God's word. Paul's prohibitions are clear and good, but we should also avoid adding restrictions that are not in this word. Do you shy away from scripture that is confusing to you or that you can't explain?

We have been blessed with a wonderful group of strong, godly women here at First Baptist. As a church, we are to protect and display the Gospel to the world. (1 Timothy 3:15) To a world that is confused about gender roles, we are to display something different. Our hope is that many will come to know the glorious God that we know. (1 Timothy 2:4)

#### **Prayer of Response**

- 1) After hearing God's Word, what sin do I need to confess? From what do I need to repent?
- 2) How should my life be lived this week based on what I have heard? What should I understand, believe, desire, or do?

# Family Guide for week of March 2nd, 2025

Deuteronomy 6:6–7 And these words that I command you today shall be on your heart. You shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, and when you walk by the way, and when you lie down, and when you rise.



## Suggestions on getting started:

- Decide on a time & place (breakfast, dinner, before bed, etc.)
- Start simple and short (ten minutes or less). Start with three things: 1) Read God's word, 2) Pray together and 3) Sing together. Scripture memory and catechism questions are optional if you have the time. Better to start small than bite off more than you can chew and give up.
- Be flexible. It doesn't need to look cookie-cutter similar for every family. Know yourself and know your kids: their personality, age, maturity, etc. [For younger kids consider starting with a good children's Bible like <u>The Big Picture Story</u> <u>Bible</u>.]
- If you don't know the answer to a question someone has, don't act like you
  do! Say something like, "Great question, let me look into that." Study, ask a
  pastor or Christian friend and get back to them.
- Embrace the chaos. Kids are kids don't expect it to be a perfect roundtable discussion with quiet, attentive children every time. Be patient and persistent. Patterns and habits help to set expectations over time.
