# **Praying with First Baptist Church**

A Prayer Guide for the week of March 16

#### Prayer of the week:

It's often helpful to pray the Scripture as a springboard and inspiration for our own prayer life. As you pray for yourself and others this week, we encourage you to consider the brief prayer of the Apostle Paul in 2 Thessalonians 3:5:

"May the Lord direct your hearts to the love of God and to the steadfastness of Christ."

We recognize our need for God's help in all the areas of our lives. The categories and requests listed below are intentional ways to pray for each other as a church family. For help in knowing how and what to pray for, look up the Scripture included with each item.

#### Ongoing prayer items in the life of our church:

- Pray for opportunities and boldness to share the gospel with loved ones (Matt. 28:19)
- Pray for conversions (John 3:3, Acts 16:14)
- Pray for the children of our church to hear and understand the gospel and be saved. (Luke 8:8)
- Pray for the preaching of God's word for faithfulness, fruitfulness, and God's glory (2 Tim. 4:2, 1 Cor. 2:4-5, Isa. 55:10-11)
- Pray for increased one to one discipleship relationships in our church family (Matt. 28:19-20)
- Pray for unity in our diversity both on Sunday and through the week (Rom. 15:13, Eph 4:2-3)
- Pray for continued growth and joy in the gospel (1 Cor. 15:1-5, 2 Pet. 1:12)
- Pray for growth in holiness, hatred of sin and growth in humility (Prov. 8:13, 1 Pet. 1:14-16)
- Pray for honest, loving relationships in our church (Col. 3:12-13, James 5:16)
- Pray for families: marriages to thrive, parents to teach/love/discipline carefully, and children to obey (Eph. 5:22-6:4)
- Pray that giving would be faithful, joyful, consistent, and sacrificial (2 Cor. 8:9)

## Prayer items outside our church:

- Pray that our elected officials would fear God, seek His wisdom, have integrity, humility, and work together for the good of society and not self. (1 Tim. 2:1-2, Rom. 13:1-7)
- Pray for fruitful ministry in other gospel-proclaiming churches in our area. (Rom. 15:20, 1 Cor. 16:1-3, Matt. 28:19-20)
- Pray that God would bring a swift end to wars going on throughout the world and establish peace. Pray for protection and care for the many refugees fleeing to safety. Pray that those impacted would trust in God in the midst of their suffering. (Ps. 139:23-24)

Pray for our ministry partners locally and around the world—Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware (BCM/D), North American Mission Board (NAMB) and International Mission Board (IMB). Pray especially for those we have direct partnerships with: Jeremy McClain (Mercy of Christ Fellowship Church, DC), Joel Kurz (The Garden Church, Baltimore), Daniel and Brandy Spandler-Davison and Susanna Schriever (Bangkok City Baptist Church, Thailand). Pray the gospel would flourish and churches would be planted and strengthened through their work. Pray that God would supply their needs. (Ps 93:4, Col. 1:5-6, 1 Pet. 4:12-17)

#### Particular prayer items in the life of our church:

- Pray for federal workers who have lost their job or are living with that possibility. Pray that they would trust God to provide for their needs. Pray that God would help them to bear good spiritual fruit even in the midst of difficult circumstances. (John 16:33; Ps. 23:1)
- Pray God would grant our congregation wisdom as we pray and make important decisions in our upcoming Members' Meeting (March 16). (Acts 14:23; 1 Peter 5:1-5; Heb 13:17)
- Pray for good spiritual fruit in the lives of our young adults from the recent event focusing on the Bible's teaching about singleness and marriage. Pray our young singles would be encouraged and strengthened in faith. Pray that godly friendships would flourish. (Heb. 10:23-24)
- Pray that God would strengthen and encourage our Deacons and Ministry Team leaders as
  they work to meet the practical needs of our church family and those in our community (1
  Samuel 12:24; Deut. 31:6). See "Ministry Spotlight" pages for highlights and prayer requests.
- Pray that God would help our church family to radically love others in the way the Bible teaches us to love. Pray that our love would reflect the sacrificial love that God has shown us through Jesus Christ. (Mt 5:43-48; John 13:35)

## 1st Timothy: Church as Pillar and Foundation of Truth

1 Timothy 3:1-13

"The Role of Elders and Deacons" – March 16, 2025



#### Introduction

Have you ever been walking with someone thinking that they know where they are going, but they are thinking the same thing about you? What happens? You get lost and have no idea where you are going. In the hustle and bustle of life, it's easy to lose sight of the "big picture" to know where we've come from and where we are going.

We are created in God's image and have the unique opportunity to reflect that image to the world. The kingdom is made of three things - a king, the people under His rule, and a place. In Genesis 1 - 2, we see Adam and Eve living in the garden of Eden under God's rule. God's rule is good and for our good. The trouble showed up in Genesis 3 when sin entered the world. Adam and Eve rejected God's rule. Satan's lie brought shame and broke their relationship with God.

Inside the kingdom of God, we, as His image bearers, reflect His glory. Outside the garden, we misrepresent God and drag His name through the mud. Why doesn't God scrap His plan? God, in His sovereignty will use, evil for good, redeeming the plan for His glory. As the Old Testament unfolds, we see God calling a people for Himself. As you continue to read, sin once again tears a nation in two, eventually leading them to exile. The problem is not the plan, it is our sinful hearts.

The prophets announced the hope of a future Redeemer. Jesus came and lived a perfect life and died for our ransom. On the third day, He rose again in victory. The good news is that anyone who comes to Jesus in repentance and faith will be clothed in the righteousness of Christ. Jesus is the focal point of the whole story. (Mark 1:15)

Now, all who trust in Christ are called sons of Abraham. Jesus is the temple and the perfect King who expresses His perfect rule of His people, experiencing His blessing. This is good news. With this in mind, how does this happen? How will people hear the good news? It is through the church. (Ephesians 3:10) But how does this work? When we look at these verses in 1 Timothy, Paul was reminding Timothy of the two offices that exist in the church - the office of an overseer (elder/pastor) and the office of a deacon. Let's see how these two offices relate.

#### Sermon Outline and Discussion

#### 1. What is the role of the Elders?

Elders are to know the sheep, feed the sheep, lead the sheep, and protect the sheep. The metaphor that scripture uses for an elder is "shepherd." The church is the sheep. This is modeled by the perfect Shepherd. (<u>Psalm 23</u>).

Shepherds **know** the sheep. Jesus knows us in a unique way. He paid for the church with His blood, but undershepherds must know the flock - know where you are thriving to be able to rejoice with you and where you are hurting to care for you. They should know you better to help you follow Jesus better. When one of our elders contacts you, it is an attempt to better know you so that they can better care for you. (John 10:14-15; Acts 20:28) Is there something that the elders should know about you to better care for you?

Shepherds **feed** the sheep with God's word. Just as we need food and water to survive physically, how much more do we need a regular diet of God's word to live and survive spiritually. One way a pastor feeds the flock is by preaching. One of the qualifications of an elder is that he must be able to teach. This could happen in a one-one counseling session, a small group, in a home visit, etc. (Matthew 4:4; Psalm 23:2; 1 Timothy 3:2)

Shepherds **lead** the sheep. Elders are called to direct the affairs of the church with an open bible. God shepherds us this way, leading us to bless us and restore us for our good. He also exercises His authority in our life for His glory as well. Elders lead; they don't lord over the flock. Elders lead by example. It isn't a perfect example; pray for your elders. (Psalm 23:3; 1 Timothy 3:2; 1 Peter 5:2-3) Do you pray for your elders?

Shepherds are called to protect the sheep from theological error. They proclaim the truth of God's word and

warn about false teaching. Pastors must also protect the sheep from straying. (Acts 20:28-29; 1 Timothy 1:3b; 1 Thessalonians 5:14) Have you run away from the church for some reason? You need the church! Elders need different tools as they oversee the flock, and they must undergird everything with prayer. Is there any way that the elders can lift you up in prayer? Let them know.

#### 2. What is the role of the Deacons?

We see their role in <u>Acts 6:1-7</u>. Deacons spot and meet tangible needs, protect church unity, and serve and support the ministry of elders.

In Acts 6, there was a group of widows being overlooked. This was urgent and important. If the apostles gave time and attention to this, it would mean that they would neglect their ministry. The seven men selected took the initiative to **meet the need** to free up the apostles for their ministry of teaching and prayer. This role is crucial for the life of a church.

Deacons **protect the unity** of the church. Unity was at stake in Acts 6. Deacons help to bring resolution to problem, not wreak havoc. They must be mature and peacemaking.

Deacons serve and **support the ministry** of the elders. They free up the elders by fulfilling ongoing needs. We praise God for the deacons serving in our church. How can you be involved in one of our Deacon-led ministries?

#### 3. How do Elders and Deacons relate?

Elders and Deacons are different offices. (Philippians 1:1) Elders and Deacons exercise different authorities. (Acts 20:28; 1 Timothy 3:10) Elders practice pastoral authority. Deacons practice administrative authority. Deacons lead in their area of responsibility under the authority of the elders in a complementary way for the benefit of the congregation. Elders serve by leading. Deacons lead by serving. Deacons support the destination set by the elders using the word of God.

Elders and Deacons work together for a common goal. (Ephesians 4:11b-13) All are involved in ministry - elders, deacons, church members to build up the body of Christ.

#### 4. Why does it matter?

We want to honor God's name and bring Him glory. (<u>Matthew 28:18-20a</u>) In the Bible, "keys" are a metaphor of authority. Jesus gave authority to the church. In issues of membership and doctrine, elders are called to teach and lead. The final authority is the congregation. We are to proclaim the good news, bring people into the church, and teach them to obey God's word. This is all for the glory of God! Elders work together with the congregation to this end. (<u>Ephesians 3:8-10</u>) Is there someone with whom you can share the gospel this week?

#### **Prayer of Response**

- 1) After hearing God's Word, what sin do I need to confess? From what do I need to repent?
- 2) How should my life be lived this week based on what I have heard? What should I understand, believe, desire, or do?

Spend time praying together in response to God's word asking for His help and greater faith to follow Him in the week to come. If you missed the sermon on Sunday or would like to listen again, visit our website at fbcum.org

# Family Guide for week of March 16th, 2025

Deuteronomy 6:6–7 And these words that I command you today shall be on your heart. You shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, and when you walk by the way, and when you lie down, and when you rise.



#### Suggestions on getting started:

- Decide on a time & place (breakfast, dinner, before bed, etc.)
- Start simple and short (ten minutes or less). Start with three things: 1) Read God's word, 2) Pray together and 3) Sing together. Scripture memory and catechism questions are optional if you have the time. Better to start small than bite off more than you can chew and give up.
- Be flexible. It doesn't need to look cookie-cutter similar for every family. Know yourself and know your kids: their personality, age, maturity, etc. [For younger kids consider starting with a good children's Bible like <u>The Big Picture Story</u> <u>Bible</u>.]
- If you don't know the answer to a question someone has, don't act like you
  do! Say something like, "Great question, let me look into that." Study, ask a
  pastor or Christian friend and get back to them.
- Embrace the chaos. Kids are kids don't expect it to be a perfect roundtable discussion with quiet, attentive children every time. Be patient and persistent. Patterns and habits help to set expectations over time.
