# Scripture Reading — Ezekiel 37:1-14 (ESV)

<sup>1</sup>The hand of the LORD was upon me, and he brought me out in the Spirit of the LORD and set me down in the middle of the valley; it was full of bones. <sup>2</sup>And he led me around among them, and behold, there were very many on the surface of the valley, and behold, they were very dry. <sup>3</sup>And he said to me, "Son of man, can these bones live?" And I answered, "O Lord God, you know." <sup>4</sup>Then he said to me, "Prophesy over these bones, and say to them, O dry bones, hear the word of the LORD. <sup>5</sup>Thus says the Lord God to these bones: Behold, I will cause breath to enter you, and you shall live. <sup>6</sup>And I will lay sinews upon you, and will cause flesh to come upon you, and cover you with skin, and put breath in you, and you shall live, and you shall know that I am the LORD."

# **Praying with First Baptist Church**

A Prayer Guide for the week of April 20

### **Prayer of the week:**

One of the ways we learn to pray is by using the examples in Scripture as a springboard and inspiration for our own prayer life. This week, we encourage you to use the praise of the Apostle Paul from 1 Thessalonians 2:13 as a specific way to give thanks to God:

<sup>13</sup> And we also thank God constantly for this, that when you received the word of God, which you heard from us, you accepted it not as the word of men but as what it really is, the word of God, which is at work in you believers.

We recognize our need for God's help in all the areas of our lives. The categories and requests listed below are intentional ways to pray for each other as a church family. For help in knowing how and what to pray for, look up the Scripture included with each item.

### Ongoing prayer items in the life of our church:

- Pray for opportunities and boldness to share the gospel with loved ones (Matt. 28:19)
- Pray for conversions (John 3:3, Acts 16:14)
- Pray for the children of our church to hear and understand the gospel and be saved. (Luke 8:8)
- Pray for the preaching of God's word for faithfulness, fruitfulness, and God's glory (2 Tim. 4:2, 1 Cor. 2:4-5, Isa. 55:10-11)
- Pray for increased one to one discipleship relationships in our church family (Matt. 28:19-20)
- Pray for unity in our diversity both on Sunday and through the week (Rom. 15:13, Eph 4:2-3)
- Pray for continued growth and joy in the gospel (1 Cor. 15:1-5, 2 Pet. 1:12)
- Pray for growth in holiness, hatred of sin and growth in humility (Prov. 8:13, 1 Pet. 1:14-16)
- Pray for honest, loving relationships in our church (Col. 3:12-13, James 5:16)
- Pray for families: marriages to thrive, parents to teach/love/discipline carefully, and children to obey (Eph. 5:22-6:4)
- Pray that giving would be faithful, joyful, consistent, and sacrificial (2 Cor. 8:9)

## Prayer items outside our church:

- Pray that our elected officials would fear God, seek His wisdom, have integrity, humility, and work together for the good of society and not self. (1 Tim. 2:1-2, Rom. 13:1-7)
- Pray for fruitful ministry in other gospel-proclaiming churches in our area. (Rom. 15:20, 1 Cor. 16:1-3, Matt. 28:19-20)

- Pray that God would bring a swift end to wars going on throughout the world and establish peace. Pray for protection and care for the many refugees fleeing to safety. Pray that those impacted would trust in God in the midst of their suffering. (Ps. 139:23-24)
- Pray for our ministry partners locally and around the world—Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware (BCM/D), North American Mission Board (NAMB) and International Mission Board (IMB). Pray especially for those we have direct partnerships with: Jeremy McClain (Mercy of Christ Fellowship Church, DC), Joel Kurz (The Garden Church, Baltimore), Daniel and Brandy Spandler-Davison and Susanna Schriever (Bangkok City Baptist Church, Thailand). Pray the gospel would flourish and churches would be planted and strengthened through their work. Pray that God would supply their needs. (Ps 93:4, Col. 1:5-6, 1 Pet. 4:12-17)

# **ChildLIFE Ministry**

Each Sunday, something amazing happens in the Children's Ministry area. The ChildLIFE Ministry volunteers, show up at 9:45am to meet and provide care and oversee children ages, infant - PreK-4 during the worship service. Parents with preschool aged children arrive to check in their children.

How can you become involved in joining the ChildLIFE Ministry team? The team consists of Volunteers and helpers working together!

**Volunteers:** If you are a church member (for at least six months) and are an adult (18 yr.), you may qualify to be a volunteer.

**Helpers:** If you are a student (14 –17yrs.) and are a church member or a child of a church member, you may serve as a helper. Helpers must serve with adult volunteers and will be vetted by the Children's Ministry staff.

## What are the expectations for our team members:

- Loving the children as Christ loves them.
- Striving to set an example of proper Christian conduct in the way we live our lives
- Ministering to the children
- Understanding that the privilege of serving in the ChildLIFE Ministry embodies responsibilities to God for ministering to and caring for the children.
- To have the heart of a servant, following Christ's example

# **Ministry Spotlight: ChildLIFE**

We take safety very seriously in the Children's Ministry area and have developed our Children's Ministry Guidelines which are available for any member of FBCUM considering participating in the Children's Ministry.

All of our volunteers are required to have the following:

- Background Checks
- Training
- Read and review the Children's Ministry Guidelines for Care, Instruction and Protection and sign affirming adherence to the policy
- Implement secure check-in/check-out procedures
- Ensure proper volunteer/child ratios that optimize safety with a minimum of two adult volunteers/room.
- Rooms equipped with a basic first aid kit
- Adherence to a healthy child policy for admittance to ChildLIFE
- Follow procedures for ChildLIFE
- Repeat the screening procedures every three years.

Why so many policies? They provide assurance that every volunteer and child will be safe and parents will have peace of mind knowing that their child/ren are in a loving-caring environment.

If you are an adult church member (for at least six months) or a teen (14-17 yrs.) member or a child of a church member, consider serving in the ChildLIFE Ministry. To make an inquiry about serving, please contact the church office or Ashley Meekins-Smith for more information.

This is a place where you get rewarded with smiles of little ones, the appreciation of parents, and the privilege of glorifying the Lord all at the same time.

## 1st Timothy: Church as Pillar and Foundation of Truth

1 Timothy 3:16 & 2 Timothy 2:8-13

"Remember the Risen Jesus" – April 20, 2025



#### Introduction

When we see Jesus in the New Testament, we see people asking "who is He?" This question is still hotly debated today, over 2000 years after Jesus walked the earth. When we read Matthew, Mark, Luke and John, we see clearly. The gospels tell us that Jesus is the Son of God.

The Old Testament prophets spoke of a Messiah that would come. He would be the chosen, anointed King. The claim that Jesus is the Son of God is the claim that He is King. But He is not an ordinary King. He is a king without borders or term limits. He came to bring freedom, peace, and justice. He came with authority to heal, teach, and forgive sin. Jesus is God. He has the authority to tell us what is right and wrong and the authority to judge.

This claim is a monumental claim. Is it really true? Is Jesus who He claims to be? That is what Easter is about. Today is an opportunity to celebrate the resurrection.

#### **Sermon Outline**

- 1. The resurrection declares that Jesus IS the Son of God. 1 Timothy 3:16
- 2. Be strengthened by the risen Christ. 2 Timothy 2:8-13

#### **Read & Discuss**

#### 1. Read 1 Timothy 3:16

As we have worked our way through the book of 1 Timothy, we have unpacked this verse. The "mystery that is part of God's plan which is now revealed" is the gospel. The church is tasked with proclaiming and guarding the gospel.

The second line in Verse 16, Paul says that Jesus was *vindicated by the Spirit*. During His earthly ministry, Jesus was misunderstood. He was betrayed, arrested, denied, beaten, and put to death. When He was put in the tomb, it seemed that all he claimed to be might be untrue. But If the resurrection is not true, the claims of Christianity are made in vain. (1 Corinthians 15:17)

Is there any evidence that can make this miracle something rational that we can believe today? Yes! First, consider the empty tomb. Jesus appeared to His disciples, eating and talking with them. He appeared to over 500 people before the ascension. If he appeared to people then He was not in the tomb. It was empty!

History shows the evidence of the resurrection. The church was soon established after the resurrection, and the fearful disciples were transformed into fearless preachers willing to give their lives for the gospel. The Jewish converts suddenly made the shift in celebrating and worshiping on Sunday. How do you account for all of these things? The best explanation is that Jesus rose from the dead.

Jesus told the disciples that His death and resurrection would happen. He was more than just a good moral teacher. Normal people don't predict their own death and subsequent resurrection. As C. S. Lewis put it: He was either a liar, lunatic or Lord. His resurrection declares that He is the Son of God - He is Lord.

Well, so what? We have to ask, how does the resurrection benefit us today? Following Jesus is hard work. Paul knew that Timothy was tired, possibly discouraged and would suffer for the cause of Christ. (2 Timothy 2:1) Can you relate to Timothy? Are you tired and discouraged in your service for the Lord?

#### 2. Read 2 Timothy 2:8-13

In the demands and discouragements of life, it's easy to lose hope. In order to provide the strength that we need, Paul says to remember Jesus Christ who has risen from the dead. The resurrection is the lynch pin of Christianity. It changes everything for us. There are four ways the resurrection benefits us today that give us hope.

- 1. The resurrection means that **there is good news for our guilt and shame**. Vs. 8 Jesus' resurrection is an essential part of the good news being the good news. His death was not enough. Jesus' resurrection announces victory over sin and death. His resurrection shows that His death paid the price in full. Are you taking refuge in Jesus? Are there days when guilt hangs over our head? Do you still feel unclean because of your shameful past? Jesus' resurrection is the receipt PAID IN FULL. No matter how you feel, everything necessary for your redemption was accomplished by Jesus. (Romans 4:25) We are declared NOT GUILTY not because of our good deeds, but because of what Jesus has done for us. In Christ our guilt is gone and our shame is washed clean. His victory becomes our victory.
- 2. The resurrection means that **there is hope for our mission as a church**. VS. 9 Paul was in prison, bound by chains. BUT the word of God is not bound! Do you feel bound sometime by fear or lack of biblical knowledge? Remember the word of God is not bound because Jesus is not bound by the grave. The word will accomplish its purpose. This is illustrated in <a href="Ezekiel 37:1-14">Ezekiel 37:1-14</a>. Left to Ezekiel's restraints, these bones could not live, but the word of God is not bound by our circumstances or lack of ability. It's powerful. Jesus promised that He would build His church and the gates of Hell would not prevail against it. (<a href="Matthew 16:18">Matthew 16:18</a>) How is this possible? Jesus conquered death. We are fellow workers, but it is Jesus' church. He purchased it with His blood, and He rose from the dead.
- 3. The resurrection means that **there is hope for our Christian life**. Vs. 11-12 Do you see the phrase "with Him?" This refers to Jesus Christ, risen from the dead. When we hear the gospel and by the grace of God, turn from our sin and trust in Christ, our sin is nailed to the cross. Before, we were separated from God because of sin, but now, nothing can separate us from a holy God. Our old self is dead, and we are united to Christ, by faith, to walk in newness of life. God is with you. He is the eternal King of kings with authority to help you in your Christian life. We don't have to lose hope. Remember Jesus risen from the dead. We not only have hope in this life, but we have a future hope to reign with Him. Physical death is not the end. We age and get sick and die. But Jesus' resurrection was a bodily resurrection which guarantees ours as well. (1 Corinthians 15:53-58)
- 4. The resurrection is **a loving call to "get off the fence."** Vs. 12-13 Trusting Jesus is a big thing. He wants our whole life, our whole self. Do you believe that Jesus is who He says He is? The religious leaders in Jesus' day wanted miracles a sign. No sign would be given except the miracle of the resurrection. This proves and declares that Jesus **IS** the Son of God. God has given us all the evidence to know that Jesus is the Son of God. That means, no more excuses, no more waiting, no more sitting on the fence. If we persist in faithlessness, God cannot deny Himself. He will do exactly as He promised and judge. Please hear this loving warning. But it is also a loving encouragement. If you have drifted from God or denied Him in your sin and rebellion and you are still alive, this is loving encouragement to come to Jesus in repentance, faith and trust. His faithfulness to forgive triumphs over our faithlessness. Jesus will receive you with open arms.

Who do you say that Jesus is? Your answer to this and what you do with it is the most important thing you will ever do in this life. One day, we will give an account for our life. To do nothing and stay on the fence is to deny Him as Lord. There is only one way to answer a King - that is to submit. Come to Jesus. He promises to save all who come in faith.

#### **Prayer of Response**

- 1) After hearing God's Word, what sin do I need to confess? From what do I need to repent?
- 2) How should my life be lived this week based on what I have heard? What should I understand, believe, desire, or do?

## Suggestions on getting started:

- Decide on a time & place (breakfast, dinner, before bed, etc.)
- Start simple and short (ten minutes or less). Start with three things: 1) Read God's word, 2) Pray together and 3) Sing together. Scripture memory and catechism questions are optional if you have the time. Better to start small than bite off more than you can chew and give up.
- Be flexible. It doesn't need to look cookie-cutter similar for every family. Know yourself and know your kids: their personality, age, maturity, etc. [For younger kids consider starting with a good children's Bible like <u>The Big Picture Story</u> <u>Bible</u>.]
- If you don't know the answer to a question someone has, don't act like you
  do! Say something like, "Great question, let me look into that." Study, ask a
  pastor or Christian friend and get back to them.
- Embrace the chaos. Kids are kids don't expect it to be a perfect roundtable discussion with quiet, attentive children every time. Be patient and persistent. Patterns and habits help to set expectations over time.
