Praying with First Baptist Church

A Prayer Guide for the week of May 11

Prayer of the week:

One of the ways we learn to pray is by using the examples in Scripture as a springboard and inspiration for our own prayer life. This week, consider using the words of Ephesians 1:16-17 to pray for yourself and others:

¹⁶ I do not cease to give thanks for you, remembering you in my prayers, ¹⁷ that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give you the Spirit of wisdom and of revelation in the knowledge of him,

We recognize our need for God's help in all the areas of our lives. The categories and requests listed below are intentional ways to pray for each other as a church family. For help in knowing how and what to pray for, look up the Scripture included with each item.

Ongoing prayer items in the life of our church:

- Pray for opportunities and boldness to share the gospel with loved ones (Matt. 28:19)
- Pray for conversions (John 3:3, Acts 16:14)
- Pray for the children of our church to hear and understand the gospel and be saved. (Luke 8:8)
- Pray for the preaching of God's word for faithfulness, fruitfulness, and God's glory (2 Tim. 4:2, 1
 Cor. 2:4-5, Isa. 55:10-11)
- Pray for increased one to one discipleship relationships in our church family (Matt. 28:19-20)
- Pray for unity in our diversity both on Sunday and through the week (Rom. 15:13, Eph 4:2-3)
- Pray for continued growth and joy in the gospel (1 Cor. 15:1-5, 2 Pet. 1:12)
- Pray for growth in holiness, hatred of sin and growth in humility (Prov. 8:13, 1 Pet. 1:14-16)
- Pray for honest, loving relationships in our church (Col. 3:12-13, James 5:16)
- Pray for families: marriages to thrive, parents to teach/love/discipline carefully, and children to obey (Eph. 5:22-6:4)
- Pray that giving would be faithful, joyful, consistent, and sacrificial (2 Cor. 8:9)

Prayer items outside our church:

- Pray that our elected officials would fear God, seek His wisdom, have integrity, humility, and work together for the good of society and not self. (1 Tim. 2:1-2, Rom. 13:1-7)
- Pray for fruitful ministry in other gospel-proclaiming churches in our area. (Rom. 15:20, 1 Cor. 16:1-3, Matt. 28:19-20)

- Pray that God would bring a swift end to wars going on throughout the world and establish
 peace. Pray for protection and care for the many refugees fleeing to safety. Pray that those impacted would trust in God in the midst of their suffering. (Ps. 139:23-24)
- Pray for our ministry partners locally and around the world—Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware (BCM/D), North American Mission Board (NAMB) and International Mission Board (IMB). Pray especially for those we have direct partnerships with: Jeremy McClain (Mercy of Christ Fellowship Church, DC), Joel Kurz (The Garden Church, Baltimore), Daniel and Brandy Spandler-Davison and Susanna Schriever (Bangkok City Baptist Church, Thailand). Pray the gospel would flourish and churches would be planted and strengthened through their work. Pray that God would supply their needs. (Ps 93:4, Col. 1:5-6, 1 Pet. 4:12-17)

Particular prayer items in the life of our church:

- Pray for our upcoming Members Meeting on May 18 after worship. Pray that God would continually help us to grow in unity and service to one another as fellow believers here at FBCUM and help us work together for kingdom purposes. (Eph 4:2-3)

Children's Ministry



The Children's Ministry is a program of the church that encompasses several areas: ChildLIFE, DiscipleLIFE, Awana, and VBS. Each Sunday morning our Children's DiscipleLIFE classes begin at 9am for babies through sixth grade. Followed by ChildLIFE at 10am. Excited children arrive with their parents and are checked-in to join their classmates and teachers to explore the word of God.

During the academic year from September through May, we provide the Awana program on Wednesday nights. During the summer we also have our VBS (Vacation Bible School) week. Each of these programs keep our children immersed in the word of God and brings encouragement through memorizing scripture and working through materials that brings scripture to life. There is truly nothing more rewarding than to see how children respond when they actually gain understanding in God's word. Our mission is to ensure that the gospel is heard.

<u>Children's DiscipleLIFE:</u> This is the perfect time to get started. 'Promotion Sunday' is the first Sunday in June, children will be promoted to their next grade in DiscipleLIFE, which marks the beginning of their new year. This would be a great time to step up to the plate in DiscipleLIFE. DiscipleLIFE classes begin every Sunday morning at 8:45am and end at 9:50am.



As a teacher you will be equipped and prepared with everything you need to effectively lead the lesson. You will also receive visual supports and activities that will reinforce the lesson. However, if you are not ready for a full-time commitment and would like to serve, consider becoming a substitute teacher. Please note that all classes have two or more adults in the rooms so you will be able to step in without any concern. As a substitute, you may observe a class or two, to get a general feel for the curriculum and class procedure.

Ministry Spotlight: Children's Ministry

<u>ChildLIFE</u>: The ChildLIFE Ministry is also a wonderful place to serve, particularly if you enjoy working with Babies-PreK-4. This ministry provides a schedule that allows you to serve your fellow members and guests. And if you are a parent of a preschooler, you will likewise benefit from this ministry. Volunteers eagerly arrive at 9:45am and care for our babies thru PreK-4 during the worship service.



Awana Clubs: The Awana club program begins in the fall and meets on Wednesdays from 6:30pm-8pm and follows the academic year for children from PreK 3-Sixth grade. The children are registered to Awana clubs by age/grade: (Cubbies - PreK 3-4); (Sparks - K-2 Grade); (Truth and Training (T&T) - 3rd –6th Grade). Awana clubs is a great place to serve! As a leader, you are given the curriculum and

suggestions which provide children with instruction, guided activities and games. If you would enjoy engaging children with the word of God and encourage their spiritual growth, this may be the place for you.

VBS: The VBS theme is 'Magnified' which encourages us to see the bigness of God in the smallness of things! VBS will start the week of June 23 from 8:45am-12:30pm! Are you excited to see how this theme unfolds and working with children, then you are invited to volunteer for VBS! Please check out the insert in this week's bulletin for details.





Finding Joy in a Discontented World

Isaiah 12

"Joy in The Midst of Trouble" – May 11, 2025



Introduction

What can miserable Christians sing? Life has a sad, melancholy, and painful dimension that is often ignored in our churches. Regardless of times of joy or lament, the Christian faith is a singing faith. Yet there are times when the difficult times of life make it difficult to sing songs of joy.

Can you relate? Do you find is difficult to sing when you are weighed down by the circumstances of life? Do you look at others and wonder how they have it all together? Do you smile your way through? This passage of scripture will remind us why we sing? It will show us how to sing in spite of hard times. This is a hopeful and joyful song that was sung by the children of Israel in the midst of pain and suffering.

Sermon Outline

Read & Discuss

1. Read vs. 1-2

At the time of Isaiah's writing, Israel's circumstances seemed dire, but his message brought hope. God would demonstrate His kindness and keep His covenant promises to a remnant of His people. God would save His people from further judgement through a Messiah yet to come.

We can sing of the joy of salvation! Isaiah is foretelling what God's rebellious people will one day declare in the future. They **will** sing a song of thanksgiving. They **will** praise the true God even though now they follow false gods.

How and when would their pride change into humility? "In that day..." points to the future day of the coming Messiah. (Isaiah 7:14; 9:6-7) This anointed King would be the reason for praise and thankfulness. God was going to judge His people. "His anger has not turned away." (Isaiah 5:25; 9:11-12, 17, 21; 10:4) However, God's anger sin is not appeased by judgment. He wants people to turn to Him. (Ezekiel 33:1)

God cannot tolerate sin. He punishes sin rightly and justly. Mankind has sinned against a holy God. That is a crime deserving of eternal punishment. Only by the death of Jesus, could God's wrath be appeased. (Isaiah 53) This is the good news. Jesus took our place. Jesus took the full wrath of God on Himself, willingly dying in our place. He rose again on the third day, having satisfied God's wrath with His sacrifice. He conquered sin, death and Satan. Our salvation is entirely dependent on Him!! This is our blessed assurance. We can know and believe in God's salvation through Jesus. (Isaiah 43:10) Is this your testimony? Is God your salvation? Will you trust and not be afraid? Is He your strength and song? Do you have peace with God? Come to Jesus in repentance and faith. If you have come to Jesus, have you forgotten the joy of your salvation? You can hope in God. (Psalm 42:11)

2. Read vs. 3-4

God would satisfy their parched souls. He gives living water as the source of life. (<u>Isaiah 55:1</u>; <u>John 7:37</u>) Salvation is available to each one as an individual.

God is the source of growth - sanctification. We continually draw His living water as He constantly provides. We can enjoy the benefits of salvation in gospel community. We need each other. We are a community of individuals that God has brought together to reap the benefits of salvation - to exhort and encourage each other.

Sometimes, as individuals in extremely difficult circumstances, we have no words to say, much less sing. But

together we rejoice with those who rejoice and weep with those who weep. We point each other to our source and supply of life - Jesus Christ. The local church is a well of salvation for our parched souls. (Psalm 30:11-12) Has there been a difficult time in your life through which the body of Christ has been a support and encouragement?

Isn't it a joy to be a member of a church body? Are you thankful for the well of FBC Upper Marlboro? How often do you draw from the wells of salvation? There is only one way to Jesus, but many wells to encourage and to refresh us along the way. Is there someone that has encouraged you? Is there someone who needs your encouragement? Are you looking for satisfaction in other places? Jesus is the only one who can satisfy. (John 4:13)

3. Read vs. 5-6

Evangelism is the natural overflow of our salvation and worship. Who will you lead to Jesus Christ? Who in your life needs to hear the good news proclaimed?

What should you proclaim? We should proclaim **His works among the people**. We can make known His eternal plan from the very beginning. We should proclaim **the greatness of Christ in our midst**. The reason we exist is to proclaim the good news. Finally, we proclaim **His return**. Our great Lord is coming back to rule and reign in the new Heavens and the new Earth. He is coming to claim His bride. This is our hope! We can always look above and forward because on that day when every knee will bow and tongue confess that Jesus is Lord.

This is a song that we will sing in future glory, but is it also a song we can sing today especially in times of trouble. One day, all our sorrows will be turned to laughter. (<u>Isaiah 25:8</u>) So, what can miserable, weary, restless Christians sing? We can sing of the joy of salvation, the joy of corporate worship, and the joy of evangelism. He has not left us alone. Remember that your joy is in Him.

Prayer of Response

- 1) After hearing God's Word, what sin do I need to confess? From what do I need to repent?
- 2) How should my life be lived this week based on what I have heard? What should I understand, believe, desire, or do?

Suggestions on getting started:

- Decide on a time & place (breakfast, dinner, before bed, etc.)
- Start simple and short (ten minutes or less). Start with three things: 1) Read God's word, 2) Pray together and 3) Sing together. Scripture memory and catechism questions are optional if you have the time. Better to start small than bite off more than you can chew and give up.
- Be flexible. It doesn't need to look cookie-cutter similar for every family. Know yourself and know your kids: their personality, age, maturity, etc. [For younger kids consider starting with a good children's Bible like <u>The Big Picture Story</u> <u>Bible</u>.]
- If you don't know the answer to a question someone has, don't act like you
 do! Say something like, "Great question, let me look into that." Study, ask a
 pastor or Christian friend and get back to them.
- Embrace the chaos. Kids are kids don't expect it to be a perfect roundtable discussion with quiet, attentive children every time. Be patient and persistent. Patterns and habits help to set expectations over time.
