In doing so, we stand united with Christians around the world and through the centuries by our faith in God, the Father Almighty; Jesus, his only Son; and the Holy Spirit.

A Prayer Guide for the week of July 27

### **Prayer of the week:**

Consider using the Apostle Paul's prayer from the book of Colossians 1:12 as a springboard for your own prayer time this week. If you're praying through the church directory, this is a great prayer to give thanks to God for the work He has done in the brothers and sisters in Christ in our church family.

"we have not ceased to pray for you... giving thanks to the Father,

who has qualified you to share in the inheritance of the saints in light. "

We recognize our need for God's help in all the areas of our lives. The categories and requests listed below are intentional ways to pray for each other as a church family. For help in knowing how and what to pray for, look up the Scripture included with each item.

#### Ongoing prayer items in the life of our church:

- Pray for opportunities and boldness to share the gospel with loved ones (Matt. 28:19)
- Pray for conversions (John 3:3, Acts 16:14)
- Pray for the children of our church to hear and understand the gospel and be saved. (Luke 8:8)
- Pray for the preaching of God's word for faithfulness, fruitfulness, and God's glory (2 Tim. 4:2, 1
   Cor. 2:4-5, Isa. 55:10-11)
- Pray for increased one to one discipleship relationships in our church family (Matt. 28:19-20)
- Pray for unity in our diversity both on Sunday and through the week (Rom. 15:13, Eph 4:2-3)
- Pray for continued growth and joy in the gospel (1 Cor. 15:1-5, 2 Pet. 1:12)
- Pray for growth in holiness, hatred of sin and growth in humility (Prov. 8:13, 1 Pet. 1:14-16)
- Pray for honest, loving relationships in our church (Col. 3:12-13, James 5:16)
- Pray for families: marriages to thrive, parents to teach/love/discipline carefully, and children to obey (Eph. 5:22-6:4)
- Pray that giving would be faithful, joyful, consistent, and sacrificial (2 Cor. 8:9)

### Prayer items outside our church:

- Pray that our elected officials would fear God, seek His wisdom, have integrity, humility, and work together for the good of society and not self. (1 Tim. 2:1-2, Rom. 13:1-7)

- Pray for our ministry partners locally and around the world—Baptist Convention of Maryland/ Delaware (BCM/D), North American Mission Board (NAMB) and International Mission Board (IMB). The Home Reach Ministry supports our church by providing care through regular visitation for those who are unable to attend church. This ministry brings gentle kindness and keeps members aware that their church is concerned and cares about them during this stage in their lives. We believe this is vital to keep us connected, further it provides an avenue by which the team can minister through a godly approach of sharing God's word, having a time of prayer and simply learning and listening.

Members receiving these calls for visits, know that they are very important to the life of our church and that we will keep these lines of communication open at all times because it is essential. But what if the member has succumbed to an illness that causes them to live in a long term care facility, Home Reach visits them there also. We are committed to love and serve Christ by loving and serving one another. (John 15:12)

The Home Reach Ministry team members are vital to this mission of our church. As members of the ministry schedule visits whether to a home or facility to share time together, fellowshipping and catching up with one another, we are demonstrating the love of Christ. We may notice other needs or concerns that may help



members through other ministries of our church. Our goal is to love one another as Christ loves the church. This means reaching our members and maintaining a connection wherever they are today, none should ever feel deserted or left out.

So how do you begin, Bernice McGuire has many ideas that may help you break the ice on your first visitation that will encourage you getting to know one another. These tidbits will be held in reserve for those who are seriously considering joining this ministry.

Each month volunteers visit those members unable to attend in our church. These visits are about listening, sharing, reading Gods word and praying. These members miss the fellowship



of other believers and we need to bring it to them. Monthly visits and phone calls during the week help to bring both closer together and that bond through the Spirit of the Lord will make an impact in both of members lives. The result is a genuine Christ—centered friendship develops and there is no longer a feeling of serving in a ministry but one of visiting a treasured friend.

Bernice says, at the end of the day, 'Have you felt loved today and more importantly, how have you shared the love of Christ with others?'

### Praying Psalm 62 — Wait On God

For 2 or 3 days this week, set aside 15 minutes to pray through Psalm 62. For help on how to pray the Psalm, refer back to the bulletin insert from July 6 "Singing and Praying the Psalms Guide".

**Psalm 62.** My Soul Waits for God Alone. <sup>1</sup> For God alone my soul waits in silence; from him comes my salvation. <sup>2</sup> He alone is my rock and my salvation, my fortress; I shall not be greatly shaken.

**Praising God:** Reflect on all that Psalm 62 declares to be true about God: our rock, salvation, fortress, hope, glory, refuge, powerful, loving, and just Judge. How have you experienced God's care and protection? Take time to praise God for who He is.

**Confessing Sin:** Focus on the repeated words 'alone' and 'only' in Psalm 62. The psalmist burns every bridge that promise refuge but are a delusion or lie. What are God-alternatives you've hoped in, trusted in to avoid being shaken? Take time to confess sin to God.

**Following God:** Reflect on the command in v8 "Trust in Him at all times, O people; pour out your heart before Him; God is a refuge for us." In light of people, events, or circumstances that threaten your safety, take time to pour out your heart to God in prayer.

#### Things to Pray for First Baptist Church:

- 1. Pray that we preach to ourselves and to each other the truth of Psalm 62 so that our restless souls learn to 'wait in silence' (v5) for God. Who can you pray for specifically? Who might you call to encourage with the truth of Psalm 62 today?
- 2. Pray that we see through the delusion of power, money, or people that promise safety but cannot deliver—"in the balances they go up" (v9). Pray we believe true power, love, and justice belong to God alone (v11-12)

### Singing and Praying the Psalms

Psalm 62

"Wait on God" – July 27, 2025



#### Introduction

One of the pivotal events from the Old Testament is the Exodus. Not too long after the children of Israel were released from harsh bondage, they were trapped by the Red Sea. The army of Egypt was coming after them because Pharaoh had changed his mind and wanted them back. They had no earthly way of crossing the Red Sea. It didn't take too long for the children of Israel to start complaining. Moses had to remind them to fear not, stand firm, and that the Lord would fight for them.

As an outsider, it's easy to criticize the children of Israel about their complaining because we know what God is about to do for them. Do you ever grumble? Do you ever complain? Does your heart ever murmur about God's plan and His timing? A complaining heart has been poisoned by pride. Pride leads you to think how you would something better or differently. It's the same poison that Adam and Eve drank in Genesis 3.

While pride may be silent, the resulting fear and anxiety are loud. You begin asking, "what if." Do you ever feel so burdened that you feel you could buckle under the pressure? Do fear and anxiety whisper in your ear that you are not enough? That's why Psalm 62 is helpful. It's message is simple - the unshakable hope you long for is found in God alone. It gives you tools to live in confident hope by exposing the lies and pointing to refuge in God.

#### **Sermon Outline**

- 1. Know the truth. Vs. 1-4
- 2. Speak the truth. Vs. 5-8
- 3. Rest in the truth. Vs. 9-12

#### **Read & Discuss**

#### 1. Read vs. 1 – 4

In this psalm, David was on the mountaintop. Not only did he receive salvation from God, but he was trusting in God alone **as** his salvation. There was no plan B for David. Don't forget who God is - the Rock, Salvation, and Fortress. He is unmovable, and He is ready and willing to be a refuge for anyone who comes to Him. There was no other place for David to find a refuge, so the result was to wait in silence. This silence refers to a quiet restfulness of the soul, peace and confidence. He didn't panic. Under the umbrella of "God alone," there is peace. Step out from that umbrella, and your heart will become restless and anxious. Do you trust in God? Do you trust in God ALONE or do you want to keep your options open just in case God doesn't come through like you want Him to?

David faced trials during his life and reign as king. You will face trials as well. You may feel shaken, but you won't get knocked out. We don't know the exact situation David was referring to in this psalm, but often, men were out to get him. (Remember Saul, Absolom?) Their goal was to thrust him down from his high position as King, and their weapon was lies. Outside the umbrella of God's protection is a storm of falsehood and lies meant to ruin you. The enemy will create them. The more you listen, the more you will be shaken. The enemy will not announce that he is telling a lie - he mixes it with half-truths and weaves those lies into music, movies, social media, etc. Sometimes the lie is masked with a layer of religion and piety. Do you want to be unshakable? You must learn to identify lies and the voice of Satan. Today, you may know the truth, but ever since Genesis three, Satan has tried to get people to question what God really said. You must be a person of the Word! Read it. Study it. Meditate on it. Do this regularly. The more you know the truth of God's word, the more you will be able to recognize the lies. Do you have a plan to be in God's word daily?

You must be an active, careful, biblical thinker. You cannot turn off your mind. While rest is good and important after a long day, you must not turn your brain off. You can't be passive. As you take in music, television, movies, etc. you should ask two questions: What is this saying? Is it true according to the standard of God's word? Being overwhelmed and anxious may lead you to feel like David - a leaning wall, a tottering fence that could be pushed over very easily. Have you felt like that before? Go to God!

#### 2. Read vs. 5 - 8

Verses 5-7 are very similar to verses 1 and 2. At the beginning of the psalm David was speaking to the congregation. In verse five, David was speaking to himself. David was modeling the skill of speaking the truth to

yourself.

Dr. Martin Lloyd Jones states that most of your unhappiness in life is a result of you listening to yourself instead of talking to yourself. You must know how to handle yourself. Address yourself. Preach to yourself. Remind yourself of Who God is and what He has done and what He has pledged to do. (From his book, *Spiritual Depression*) Stand up and fight! It is important that we encourage, remind, and help each other to fight.

In verse eight, David instructs us HOW to trust in God at all times! Do you think that your prayers are not good enough? Do you think you have to use the right words or make your heart clean before you pray? No! POUR OUT your heart. Open your heart completely even if your prayer is full of needs. You cannot overburden God. He wants to hear you; He is happy to hear you. You will not shock God.

This psalm was written for us to read, pray, and sing. David had fought to trust God. Then once his soul returned to rest, he could instruct the congregation. We are called to care for and love one another. We are called to carry each other's burdens. Do you find that the burdens of others are too heavy to carry? Maybe you have you stepped out from the umbrella of "God alone." As we care for each other, we must remember that we are not the rock. Our responsibility is to point each other to THE Rock who has no problem carrying those burdens. Do you trust in God as you care for others?

#### 3. Read vs. 16 – 23

David was looking for a reliable, trustworthy refuge. In these verses, David gave us a picture of scales. On one side he put God and on the other, he put three earthly securities - power (vs. 3), people (vs. 9), and money (vs. 10). Power fails and fades. People are a delusion. Wealth is uncertain. (1 Timothy 6:17) None of these three are a trustworthy refuge.

In verses 11 and 12, we see three reasons to trust God alone - God's power, love and justice. Power belongs to God - governments, kingdoms, people - all belong to Him. His power isn't derived or borrowed. He has an infinite supply of it. God's love is covenantal - He isn't going anywhere. One day, God will sit on the throne to judge. He sees every injustice and one day, will make it right. The scales are overwhelmingly tipped in favor of God. Why do people step out from the umbrella of God alone? They see the earthly things that might satisfy.

You may think that you identify with David – people against you, threats all around, but you are meant to identify with the enemy because they rejected God's rule. In getting David off of the throne, they were trying to get God off of the throne. We all do the same thing. This is the bad news. Left to yourself, you are in trouble. How can God's coming judgment go from bad news to good news? How can we go from identifying with the enemy to identifying with David? We need to look at David as a signpost to a better King - Jesus. The good news of the gospel reminds us that everything is not as it seems. The religious leaders thought they defeated Jesus by crucifying him, but Jesus rose again on the third day in power and victory. His death satisfied the demands of God's justice and shows His steadfast love. We can be forgiven. What will **you** do with God's anointed - Jesus? There are two ways to live. Turn from your sin and self-reliance and trust in Christ. The noise of your guilt and shame will be silenced.

#### **Prayer of Response**

- 1) After hearing God's Word, what sin do I need to confess? From what do I need to repent?
- 2) How should my life be lived this week based on what I have heard? What should I understand, believe, desire, or do?

### Family Guide for week of July 27th, 2025

#### Suggestions on getting started:

- Decide on a time & place (breakfast, dinner, before bed, etc.)
- Start simple and short (ten minutes or less). Start with three things: 1) Read God's word, 2) Pray together and 3) Sing together. Scripture memory and catechism questions are optional if you have the time. Better to start small than bite off more than you can chew and give up.
- Be flexible. It doesn't need to look cookie-cutter similar for every family. Know yourself and know your kids: their personality, age, maturity, etc. [For younger kids consider starting with a good children's Bible like <u>The Big Picture Story</u> <u>Bible</u>.]
- If you don't know the answer to a question someone has, don't act like you
  do! Say something like, "Great question, let me look into that." Study, ask a
  pastor or Christian friend and get back to them.
- Embrace the chaos. Kids are kids don't expect it to be a perfect roundtable discussion with quiet, attentive children every time. Be patient and persistent. Patterns and habits help to set expectations over time.
