Praying with First Baptist Church

A Prayer Guide for the week of August 24

Prayer of the week:

One way we learn to pray is by using the examples in Scripture as a springboard and inspiration for our own prayer life. This week, we encourage you to use the prayer of the Apostle Paul from the book of Romans 15:5-6:

" ⁵ May the God of endurance and encouragement grant you to live in such harmony with one another, in accord with Christ Jesus, ⁶ that together you may with one voice glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ."

We recognize our need for God's help in all the areas of our lives. The categories and requests listed below are intentional ways to pray for each other as a church family. For help in knowing how and what to pray for, look up the Scripture included with each item.

Ongoing prayer items in the life of our church:

- Pray for opportunities and boldness to share the gospel with loved ones (Matt. 28:19)
- Pray for conversions (John 3:3, Acts 16:14)
- Pray for the children of our church to hear and understand the gospel and be saved. (Luke 8:8)
- Pray for the preaching of God's word for faithfulness, fruitfulness, and God's glory (2 Tim. 4:2, 1 Cor. 2:4-5, Isa. 55:10-11)
- Pray for increased one to one discipleship relationships in our church family (Matt. 28:19-20)
- Pray for unity in our diversity both on Sunday and through the week (Rom. 15:13, Eph 4:2-3)
- Pray for continued growth and joy in the gospel (1 Cor. 15:1-5, 2 Pet. 1:12)
- Pray for growth in holiness, hatred of sin and growth in humility (Prov. 8:13, 1 Pet. 1:14-16)
- Pray for honest, loving relationships in our church (Col. 3:12-13, James 5:16)
- Pray for families: marriages to thrive, parents to teach/love/discipline carefully, and children to obey (Eph. 5:22-6:4)
- Pray that giving would be faithful, joyful, consistent, and sacrificial (2 Cor. 8:9)

Prayer items outside our church:

- Pray that our elected officials would fear God, seek His wisdom, have integrity, humility, and work together for the good of society and not self. (1 Tim. 2:1-2, Rom. 13:1-7)
- Pray for fruitful ministry in other gospel-proclaiming churches in our area. (Rom. 15:20, 1 Cor. 16:1-3, Matt. 28:19-20)
- Pray that God would bring a swift end to wars going on throughout the world and establish peace.
 Pray for protection and care for the many refugees fleeing to safety. Pray that those impacted would trust in God in the midst of their suffering. (Ps. 139:23-24)

 Pray for our ministry partners locally and around the world—Baptist Convention of Maryland/ Delaware (BCM/D), North American Mission Board (NAMB) and International Mission Board (IMB). Pray especially for those we have direct partnerships with: Jeremy McClain (Mercy of Christ Fellowship Church, DC), Joel Kurz (The Garden Church, Baltimore), Daniel and Brandy Spandler-Davison and Susanna Schriever (Bangkok City Baptist Church, Thailand). Pray the gospel would flourish and churches would be planted and strengthened through their work. Pray that God would supply their needs. (Ps 93:4, Col. 1:5-6, 1 Pet. 4:12-17)

Particular prayer items in the life of our church:

- Pray that good fruit would come from our Members Meeting this afternoon. Pray that God would continually help us to grow in unity and service to one another as fellow believers here at FBCUM and help us work together for kingdom purposes. (Eph 4:2-3)
- Pray for teachers and students in our church family who are going back to school in the coming weeks. Pray they would depend on God and trust Him as they start a new school year. Pray that learning and teaching would be done with excellence to the glory of God (Prov. 3:5-6; 1 Cor. 10:31). See a list of out-of-town college students toward the back of your church directory.
- Pray that God brings good spiritual fruit in the lives of our children and students through Vacation Bible School (June 23-27) and Youth Summer Camp (July 13-17). (Gal 5:22-23)
- Pray that our church family would not grow weary of doing good. Pray that we would live and interact with one another in a way that reveals God's steadfast love and mercy to the world. (Gal 6:9)
- Pray that we know a profound contentment no matter what circumstances we find ourselves in

 a contentment from knowing God is our help. (Heb. 13:5-6)
- Pray God would guard our church from fear, anxiety, and disunity. Pray that we would trust that God is good and be assured that He is in control. (John 13:34-35)
- Pray that God would help us comprehend his good design for the church and center our lives around it for the sake of his glory being made known. (Eph 3:10; 3:21)

Meal Train Ministry

Meet Morgan Neptune, who leads this ministry and is very passionate about the Meal Train Ministry because, she was personally blessed through this ministry not long after joining First Baptist Church of Upper Marlboro. Morgan's personal testimony: "About a month or two after my husband and I became members of FBCUM, we welcomed our little girl into the world and were recipients of a Meal Train. I know firsthand what a blessing this act of kindness can be by so many church members. We were truly touched. It was also an amazing opportunity to meet our church family that I may not have

otherwise met. I was honored when asked to take over heading up the Meal Train ministry. It has been such an incredible privilege. "

A Meal Train is a ministry for our church family to support each other by coordinating and providing meals for someone who may need extra support during a trying time. It provides an opportunity to demonstrate the love of Christ to members of our church.

What is the Meal Train process? When a request is made, a Meal Train is created. Details are provided regarding any food allergies or any dietary restrictions and desired dates for delivery. Once this information is secured, the Meal Train is formally submitted by email with a link to the page. Meal Train participants open the link and review the details along with the dates that the



meals are to be provided to the family or individual. Meal Train participants may select from the list of dates when they are available to provide a meal, and deliver. This process prevents confusion and both the recipient and the participant will know what is scheduled for that date. There is no obligation to participate on any given Meal Train. The more people we have on the Meal Train, allows a very successful outcome because those unavailable to serve this time may be available to serve next time.

Ministry Spotlight

If you are a busy person and are looking for a ministry that you can join to help when there is a need, this may be perfect for you. The Meal Train is an, as needed ministry, which means there are no additional time requirements, no meetings and no training. There are no requirements to participate on every Meal Train and <u>you don't even have to like to cook!</u> The Meal Train also offers an option to send a gift card in lieu of cooking and dropping off a meal.



Does this sound like the perfect opportunity for you to serve? If you have a caring and giving heart that desires to serve and support our church family, this is a place for you.

To join the Meal Train Ministry, contact <u>Morgan Neptune</u> and let her know you are interested, provide her with your email address, then you will be added to her list of participants, and you will be included on the next Meal Train that is circulated. It is that simple!

Praying Psalm 95 — The Lord Is a Great God

For 2 or 3 days this week, set aside 15 minutes to pray through Psalm 51. For help on how to pray the Psalms, refer back to the bulletin insert from July 6 "Singing and Praying the Psalms".

Psalm 95. LET Us SING SONGS OF PRAISE. ¹ Oh come, let us sing to the LORD; let us make a joyful noise to the rock of our salvation! ² Let us come into his presence with thanksgiving; let us make a joyful noise to him with songs of praise! ³ For the LORD is a great God, and a great King above all gods. ⁴ In his hand are the depths of the earth; the heights of the mountains are his also. ⁵ The sea is his, for he made it, and his hands formed the dry land.

⁶Oh come, let us worship and bow down; let us kneel before the LORD, our Maker! ⁷ For he is our God, and we are the people of his pasture, and the sheep of his hand. Today, if you hear his voice, ⁸ do not harden your hearts, as at Meribah, as on the day at Massah in the wilderness, ⁹ when your fathers put me to the test and put me to the proof, though they had seen my work. ¹⁰ For forty years I loathed that generation and said, "They are a people who go astray in their heart, and they have not known my ways." ¹¹ Therefore I swore in my wrath, "They shall not enter my rest."

Praising God: Take some time to speak praise to God as you consider the various ways the psalmist deems Him worthy; "the rock of our salvation" (v1), "the Lord is a great God, and a great king above all gods" (v3), all the earth is under his authority because he made it (vv4-5), he is "our Maker... our God" and he loving cares for us like a good shepherd (v7).

Confessing Sin: Honestly acknowledge to God ways that you have hardened your heart against Him (i.e. tested Him, repressed the truth in order to live your own way, chosen not to trust Him, etc.) (vv8-9). Confess to Him any ways that you have gone astray in your heart (v10).


Following God: Make a choice today to hear God's voice (v7—line d), through His word, by the power of the Holy Spirit, and to follow that truth. Ask for His help to push aside and make quite other voices (the world, the devil, your own inner monologue) that often compete for our heart's attention with lies or half-truths. Pray that others you know and love would hear His voice for the first time and never know His righteous wrath (v11).

Things to Pray for First Baptist Church:

- **1.** Pray that our church would faithfully exalt and worship God as the King of kings in our public worship and in our family worship. Pray that we would be ever-growing in our desire to sing praise to our glorious God. (vv1-6)
- 2. Pray that we would continually know and feel God's presence and care as His beloved people. (v7)
- **3.** Pray that we would be attentive to the voice of the Lord—not hardening our hearts or putting Him to the test, but trusting His Word as those who have seen His work in our own hearts and in the hearts of others. (vv7-10)

Singing and Praying the Psalms

Psalm 95

"The Lord is A Great God" – August 24, 2025



Introduction

Has there ever been a time in your life when God provided for you in such a way that overwhelmed you with praise? Do you take God's provisions for granted? Have you forgotten His truths and promises? Circumstances can change, but the promises of God are sure. To whom do you cry out when in need? To whom do you give praise for provision?

Sermon Outline

- 1. A call to worship with joy vs. 1-5
- 2. A call to reverence vs. 6-7a
- 3. A call to obedience vs. 7b 11

Read & Discuss

1. Read vs. 1-5

We all need encouragement. Sometimes it's easier to grumble for what we don't have instead of recognizing the provision of God. The human heart needs intentional work to praise God for all He has done and provided for us instead of being in the weeds of grumbling. Praise is the "weed killer" for our heart.

In the Psalm, David was encouraging all of Israel to praise the Lord based on God's character and promises. God is the unwavering, immovable Savior of His people. When you gather to worship, you come boldly for what He has done and expectantly for what He will do. You can come with joy and thanksgiving instead of fear. For what things are you thankful? Take time to list those things and to thank God.

The LORD is a great God; He is the only God. He is King over ALL. All other kings reign for a short time and are given their authority of God. God has dominion over all things. He reigns forever. You should not make the creation big and the Creator small. He is a great God. You should praise and worship God for His good gifts. He has given them for your enjoyment.

Hear God. Feed yourself on His word. It is His word that will do a work in your spirit. It may not be immediate, but it is working. What is your plan for a regular diet of God's word?

2. Read vs. 6 – 7a

As the discipline of praising God digs deep in your hearts, you respond in humility because of Who God is. Bowing down puts you in a vulnerable position, but you declare His authority. You don't come in pride or fear, but in reverence. You should reflect God in all you do, and you were created to know Him and love Him.

Your actions demonstrate what you worship. Is God enthroned in your heart? When God has a proper place in your heart, you are softened to the things of God. His will overrides your own. You will see things as God sees them. What do you see in your heart when you feelings are exposed?

The God of the universe is your God. You have Him, and He has you!! You are part of His flock. He makes a way, provides, protects, and opens doors for you. You have security in God your Shepherd. (Psalm 23; John 10) You are secure in His hands. As Maker, He knows your need. As Shepherd, He calls. Are you listening?

As you hear His word, be a doer of the word. Examine yourself. Are you doing what God says you are

3. Read vs. 7b - 11

"Today, if you hear His voice" indicates urgency. You are not guaranteed tomorrow. God's warnings are His grace to you. The children of Israel grumbled about what they did not have. (Exodus 17:1-7) They refused to believe the truth about God who called them out of Egypt. They grumbled to Moses, but they really grumbled to God. When times were not favorable to them, their hearts were exposed.

When times in your life aren't favorable, what is exposed in your heart? Do you think that you would never be like the Israelites? They were without water for five days. How are you without some of the conveniences of life - the internet, media, etc. God provided. They did not believe. Praise and thanksgiving are an antidote for grumbling and unbelief.

Your actions and words have power. They influence the next generation. Don't grumble and complain. Speak the truth – the truth about God and His word. One day, you will give an account of every word you speak. How has God proven Himself faithful to you in the past?

God desires to save. (2 Peter 3:9) God wants you to hear and respond in obedience. He is faithful. He is patient. He cared for the children of Israel in the wilderness, yet they questioned His motives. Have your motives ever been inquisition by those to whom you have been kind and faithful?

God is faithful. He speaks the truth. He has sent His Son to pay the price for our sin and given living water that satisfies. He rose to conquer sin and death. Don't waste your life in another way. He is the only way. Come to Jesus now. Enter His rest.

Prayer of Response

- 1) After hearing God's Word, what sin do I need to confess? From what do I need to repent?
- 2) How should my life be lived this week based on what I have heard? What should I understand, believe, desire, or do?

Suggestions on getting started:

- Decide on a time & place (breakfast, dinner, before bed, etc.)
- Start simple and short (ten minutes or less). Start with three things: 1) Read God's word, 2) Pray together and 3) Sing together. Scripture memory and catechism questions are optional if you have the time. Better to start small than bite off more than you can chew and give up.
- Be flexible. It doesn't need to look cookie-cutter similar for every family. Know yourself and know your kids: their personality, age, maturity, etc. [For younger kids consider starting with a good children's Bible like <u>The Big Picture Story</u> <u>Bible</u>.]
- If you don't know the answer to a question someone has, don't act like you
 do! Say something like, "Great question, let me look into that." Study, ask a
 pastor or Christian friend and get back to them.
- Embrace the chaos. Kids are kids don't expect it to be a perfect roundtable discussion with quiet, attentive children every time. Be patient and persistent. Patterns and habits help to set expectations over time.
