A Prayer Guide for the week of October 19

Prayer of the week:

Consider using the Apostle Paul's prayer from the book of Philippians 1:3-6 as a springboard for your own prayer time this week. This is a great prayer to use as you pray through the church directory for your church family this week.

³ I thank my God in all my remembrance of you, ⁴ always in every prayer of mine for you all making my prayer with joy, ⁵ because of your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now. ⁶ And I am sure of this, that he who began a good work in you will bring it to completion at the day of Jesus Christ.

We recognize our need for God's help in all the areas of our lives. The categories and requests listed below are intentional ways to pray for each other as a church family. For help in knowing how and what to pray for, look up the Scripture included with each item.

Ongoing prayer items in the life of our church:

- Pray for conversions (John 3:3, Acts 16:14)

- Pray for continued growth and joy in the gospel (1 Cor. 15:1-5, 2 Pet. 1:12)
- Pray for growth in holiness, hatred of sin and growth in humility (Prov. 8:13, 1 Pet. 1:14-16)
- Pray for honest, loving relationships in our church (Col. 3:12-13, James 5:16)
- Pray for families: marriages to thrive, parents to teach/love/discipline carefully, and children to obey (Eph. 5:22-6:4)

Praying & Crocheting Ministry

Praying and Crocheting is a labor of love that began as a result of the title of our DiscipleLife class quarterly, 'The Scarlet Thread.' Our class-members each received a skein of scarlet (Cherry Red) yarn and a crochet hook, a pattern followed with the blessing of some (very patient) crafters in the class that taught us how to create a Granny Square (6 inches). This Granny square was duplicated by each member in the class and then combined to create a two large af-

ghans that were donated for a silent auction where the proceeds were given to the Global Hunger Fund. We were delight-

ed to see the work of our hands, by God's grace be transformed into something profitable for the body of Christ. Some that were new to crocheting started talking and pursued continuing the crocheting. Thus the beginning of **Praying & Crocheting**.



We started meeting once a month on the second Tuesday and slowly learned how to do a little more than Granny Squares. We decided to start with reading a Psalm each month and as we read the Psalms we would discuss what the Lord was revealing to us and how we could apply the wisdom, joy, encouragement and faithfulness of God to situations in our lives. We were encouraged. Our craft leaders desired to stretch us to pursue new stitches and to focus on the obedience that it takes to follow a pattern, just as we walk with Christ.

Our growth continued as we provided crocheted hats and scarves to the Christmas Store, which was an outreach for our Church. This was quite a challenge for some of us. But by faithfully following the patterns and wrestling through ripping out stitches and trying again, we were able to produce some beautiful sets that were shopped for during the Christmas Store. Well, activities increased and we were crocheting for a pregnancy center and World Vision we were told which countries received our products. We continued to study God's word and spend time seeking support from others in the group to learn new patterns and trusted God that with Him we could do it. The joy it brought to us to meet a challenge and to see how God provided things right on time.

Ministry Spotlight

Today we continue our journey of bringing hugs through our creations. Some of you may not seek to work with your hands, but we hope you will pray for us as we serve. If you would like to support our efforts through crocheting, but are not able to attend a meeting once per month, just let me know. Most of our creativity happens when we are away. So, we look forward to meeting crafters that can crochet, cross-stitch,



and knitters are welcome also. We have set some lofty goals this year, such as hats and scarves for those in need, prayer shawls, afghans for our grieving church members and seniors going away to college, stuffed animals for Operation Christmas Child, baby blankets, and book marks.



Meetings will resume in January 2026 - as we come together to share the Word, plan future projects, and challenge one another to grow spiritually and in our crafts! If you are interested and want to give this a try, join us! All of the items that we create, we give honor and praise to the Lord and we pray for the recipients. The Gospel of Luke: Confidence about Jesus

Luke 1:5-25

"God Takes Away Our Disgrace" – October 19, 2025



Introduction

As Martin Luther was walking home from college, there was a thunder storm. A lightning bolt struck too close to him, and he cried out in fear, declaring that he would become a monk. Fifteen years later, while standing before a council that would decide his fate, he bravely declared, "I must walk in the fear of the Lord. Here I stand; I can do no other." Over the course of those 15 years, he changed. What brought about his transformation?

Do you have this confidence? You want it, but then tragedy strikes, and life doesn't turn out how you had hoped, after a while, you may ask, "God, are you here? Do you care? Are you in control? Do you see?" We want to believe that God is in control, but when people round us are drowning in disappointment and discouragement, we question.

Dr. Luke has made a complete and accurate account of Jesus, so that you may have certainty. (1:4) He wanted to create a rock solid confidence that overcomes the storms of life. How can you have certainty in uncertain times?

Read & Discuss

1. Read Vs. 5 - 12

Luke began with a time marker - "In the days of Herod" who was a ruthless tyrant, but Luke moved quickly to this humble couple - Zechariah and Elizabeth. They were a godly couple, but they had no children. This was devastating. Children provided security as well as carrying on the family name. A room full of children was a blessing to the Lord. This left Elizabeth disgraced. She was a nobody. What made things worse, people may have thought that she was cursed due to her barrenness, bringing reproach.

Luke invites us in the pain and experience of this couple. He wants us to look at how they feel. They would have prayed and tried and waited to have a child, but the years passed by. The timetable of God's plan was longer than the one they had for themselves. Now, they were advanced in years which meant the death of a dream. Life had not turned out as they expected, and it wasn't as a result of any blatant sin. Sometimes we don't know why something is happening or not happening in the lives of people. Sometimes, it isn't for us to know the reason. It is just best to sit with someone in their grief. Even though they had this disappointment, they didn't give up. They kept following God, obeying day by day. In this process of mundane obedience, the unexpected happened. In your despair and disappointment, are you tempted to give up?

Many priests waited all of their entire life and never had a chance to do what Zechariah was about to do. It was a big deal. It wasn't luck or chance. Every decision is from the Lord. It was the providence of God. (<u>Proverbs 16:33</u>) God was about to do something new.

There was Zechariah in the Holy of Holies. It was a once in a lifetime moment. It was intensely private, yet the people were waiting outside the curtain. The tension was building. The people had not heard from God for 400 years. Then an angel appeared at the right side of the altar of incense. This was not what Zechariah expected. After all of these years of waiting, they may have felt forgotten by God. Waiting is hard. In the pain of your trials, do you feel as if God has forgotten you? Just as God had not forgotten this couple, He had not forgotten His people. He has not forgotten you! You may be confused and have questions, but God has not forgotten you.

Do you want certainty? You will not find it in political leaders or even a king. They come and go. Kingdoms rise and fall. The king could not help this couple have a baby or the bring redemption to God's people. There are a lot of voices in the world that try to offer certainty, but even the best advice cannot offer the certainty for which our hearts long. You can only find certainty in a sovereign God.

2. Read Vs. 13 - 18

God blessed the couple with a son, but John the Baptist would open the door for Jesus who would redeem the world from sin. While this was a personal story, it is also a global story. The angel Gabriel represented God's word. You don't need an angel to show up for you to be frightened by God's word. If you are a Christian and take God's word seriously, do His words to you about money, friendship, sex, power may make you nervous? You must hold all that you hold valuable with an open hand and keep walking with Jesus.

How can you follow God's word when sometimes, it can be costly? Following Jesus demands counting the cost, but you shouldn't think about begrudgingly. Jesus describes it this way in <u>Matthew 13:44</u>. There is joy in the all-surpassing worth of following Jesus. When you give up everything to follow Jesus, you get something better. You get the better deal. This should motivate you to keep you going.

John the Baptist would be filled with and controlled by the Holy Spirit. The only way that we can live this Christian life is by God's word and through the Spirit. John the Baptist would prepare the way for Jesus, calling people back to God. Just like the prophet Elijah called a wayward nation to repent and choose who they would believe and serve, (1 Kings 18) John's mission was to get people ready for Jesus. (Malachi 4:6) God's righteous and rightful judgment was coming. John was to call people back, to repent and trust Christ. The message is the same for you today. We have all sinned. (Romans 3:23) We are headed for destruction and judgement. (Romans 6:23; Isaiah 53:6) Jesus came, lived a perfect life, died for sin and rose again so that you might have a fresh start. You must turn from your rebellion and sin. Repent and come to Jesus. Be reconciled to God.

The hearts of the fathers would turn to the sons. Young people can make a difference. God can and will use the life of young people such that it turns lives around. Young people, will you go all in for Jesus?

3. Read Vs. 18 – 25

God chose Zechariah to serve in the temple and sent an angel to bring the news, yet Zechariah didn't believe it because of his age. Senior saints, are you tempted to believe that ministry is for the young? The elderly should not be on the sidelines. God's design is that older men and women can pour into others for eternal purposes. Call someone and check in on them. Open your home for lunch or coffee. Listen to their story. Offer them encouragement. Write an encouraging note. Pray. God didn't put Zechariah and Elizabeth on the shelf. He had a plan, and He has a plan for you.

Because Zechariah refused to believe, he couldn't use his words until he could see until God's promise was fulfilled. Was this harsh? (Hebrews 12:6) God's disciple is not His hatred. It expresses His love and care for you as His child. God's discipline would help Zechariah. (Hebrews 6:11) God's discipline was His love to help him believe. It is the same for you. God's discipline builds faith. Can you recall times when God's discipline helped you grow in faith and trust Him?

Do you feel the reproach of sin? God not only removed Elizabeth's reproach. He was also preparing a way to remove the shame and reproach of all of God's people. Come to Jesus. He can take away the same and give you a new life.

Prayer of Response

- 1) After hearing God's Word, what sin do I need to confess? From what do I need to repent?
- 2) How should my life be lived this week based on what I have heard? What should I understand, believe, desire, or do?

Deuteronomy 6:6–7 And these words that I command you today shall be on your heart. You shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, and when you walk by the way, and when you lie down, and when you rise.



Suggestions on getting started:

- Decide on a time & place (breakfast, dinner, before bed, etc.)
- Start simple and short (ten minutes or less). Start with three things: 1) Read God's word, 2) Pray together and 3) Sing together. Scripture memory and catechism questions are optional if you have the time. Better to start small than bite off more than you can chew and give up.
- Be flexible. It doesn't need to look cookie-cutter similar for every family. Know yourself and know your kids: their personality, age, maturity, etc. [For younger kids consider starting with a good children's Bible like <u>The Big Picture Story</u> <u>Bible</u>.]
- If you don't know the answer to a question someone has, don't act like you
 do! Say something like, "Great question, let me look into that." Study, ask a
 pastor or Christian friend and get back to them.
- Embrace the chaos. Kids are kids don't expect it to be a perfect roundtable discussion with quiet, attentive children every time. Be patient and persistent. Patterns and habits help to set expectations over time.
