An Explanation of the Apostles' Creed:

From as far back as the 2nd century, Christians have used statements of faith like the Apostles' Creed to confess their faith. It was common to use these statements prior to one's public declaration of faith at baptism. Therefore, through the centuries, the Apostles' Creed has become a well-known and useful tool to help believers around the world learn and affirm the foundational beliefs of the Christian faith.

At First Baptist Church, we use this brief statement in our public services to declare before God, each other, and the watching world that these are foundational truths of our faith that Scripture has clearly revealed. In doing so, we stand united with Christians around the world and through the centuries by our faith in God, the Father Almighty; Jesus, his only Son; and the Holy Spirit.

Praying with First Baptist Church

A Prayer Guide for the week of November 9

Prayer of the week:

One of the ways we learn to pray is by using the examples in Scripture as a springboard and inspiration for our own prayer life. This week, consider using the prayer of the Apostle Paul from the book of Colossians, chapter 1, verse 9:

"...we have not ceased to pray for you, asking that you may be filled with the knowledge of his will in all spiritual wisdom and understanding,..."

We recognize our need for God's help in all the areas of our lives. The categories and requests listed below are intentional ways to pray for each other as a church family. For help in knowing how and what to pray for, look up the Scripture included with each item.

Ongoing prayer items in the life of our church:

- Pray for opportunities and boldness to share the gospel with loved ones (Matt. 28:19)
- Pray for conversions (John 3:3, Acts 16:14)
- Pray for the children of our church to hear and understand the gospel and be saved. (Luke 8:8)
- Pray for the preaching of God's word for faithfulness, fruitfulness, and God's glory (2 Tim. 4:2, 1 Cor. 2:4-5, Isa. 55:10-11)
- Pray for increased one to one discipleship relationships in our church family (Matt. 28:19-20)
- Pray for unity in our diversity both on Sunday and through the week (Rom. 15:13, Eph 4:2-3)
- Pray for continued growth and joy in the gospel (1 Cor. 15:1-5, 2 Pet. 1:12)
- Pray for growth in holiness, hatred of sin and growth in humility (Prov. 8:13, 1 Pet. 1:14-16)
- Pray for honest, loving relationships in our church (Col. 3:12-13, James 5:16)
- Pray for families: marriages to thrive, parents to teach/love/discipline carefully, and children to obey (Eph. 5:22-6:4)
- Pray that giving would be faithful, joyful, consistent, and sacrificial (2 Cor. 8:9)

Prayer items outside our church:

- Pray that our elected officials would fear God, seek His wisdom, have integrity, humility, and work together for the good of society and not self. (1 Tim. 2:1-2, Rom. 13:1-7)
- Pray for fruitful ministry in other gospel-proclaiming churches in our area. (Rom. 15:20, 1 Cor. 16:1-3, Matt. 28:19-20)
- Pray that God would bring a swift end to wars going on throughout the world and establish peace. Pray for protection and care for the many refugees fleeing to safety. Pray that those impacted would trust in God in the midst of their suffering. (Ps. 139:23-24)

 Pray for our ministry partners locally and around the world—Baptist Convention of Maryland/ Delaware (BCM/D), North American Mission Board (NAMB) and International Mission Board (IMB). Pray especially for those we have direct partnerships with: Jeremy McClain (Mercy of Christ Fellowship Church, DC), Joel Kurz (The Garden Church, Baltimore), Daniel and Brandy Spandler-Davison and Susanna Schriever (Bangkok City Baptist Church, Thailand). Pray the gospel would flourish and churches would be planted and strengthened through their work. Pray that God would supply their needs. (Ps 93:4, Col. 1:5-6, 1 Pet. 4:12-17)

Particular prayer items in the life of our church:

- Praise God for a fruitful mission to Bangkok, Thailand (Bangkok City Baptist Church). Our team
 was able to care for and serve the local church and pastors there, as well as identify potential
 ways we can continue to serve in the future. Continue to pray God would strengthen the leaders and members of this church and their ministry to other churches and pastors in Thailand,
 and that the Gospel would flourish through their ministry. (Ps 93:4, Col. 1:5-6, 1 Pet. 4:12-17)
- Pray for the federal workers in our church who are not receiving a paycheck due to the current shutdown. Pray that God will provide for their needs. Pray that they will sense and know God's caring presence in the midst of uncertainty. (Heb 13:5; Rom 12:13)
- Pray for our ministry leaders, deacons, and elders during this budget season as they pray and prepare a budget to present to the church. Pray for wisdom and a God-centered vision for how to use the resources that God has given our church. (James 1:5)
- Pray that good spiritual fruit would come from discipleship efforts in small groups, one to one meetings, and as people show hospitality to others in our church. (1 Pt 4:9; Gal 6:2)
- Pray God would guard our church from fear, anxiety, and disunity. Pray that we would trust that God is good and be assured that He is in control. (John 13:34-35)
- Pray our church family would not grow weary of doing good. Pray we would live and interact with one another in a way that reveals God's steadfast love and mercy to the world. (Gal 6:9)
- Pray that we know a profound contentment no matter what circumstances we find ourselves in

 a contentment from knowing God is our help. (Heb. 13:5-6)
- Pray that God would help us comprehend his good design for the church and center our lives around it for the sake of his glory being made known. (Eph 3:10; 3:21)

Women's Ministry

The FBCUM Women's Ministry exists to provide Christ-centered opportunities for women to grow together, be equipped, and serve. This ministry facilitates women building up one another in love for the work of the ministry through prayer, discipleship, teaching, fellowship, service and evangelism. The Women's Ministry supports all FBCUM women and facilitates connections, coordination, and resources for: discipleship, Bible studies, fellowship gatherings, evangelism/works of service opportunities, training topics for practical Christian living, and women's retreats/events.

The Vision of the ministry is to foster a strong foundation encouraging spiritual growth, obedience, good works, and reliance on the grace of God to His praise and glory. Through the Women's Ministry we strive for a commitment to love, unity, service, diversity, equipping, and prayer.

The ministry has several opportunities to serve one another and has scheduled the following activities:

- Future fellowship gatherings similar to the Dessert & Worship Fellowship that was held in October. Women gathered on a Friday evening to hear speakers, testimonies, sang songs of praise, and enjoyed amazing desserts.
- Spring Retreat provides opportunities for fellowship, Biblical training, praise, and prayer. The overnight Spring Retreat is scheduled for March 2026, on the topic of 'Rest.' Finding His perfect Rest does not happen by accident and neither does cultivating a relationship with the Lord. At the Retreat many will reflect on God's word, praying and understanding why taking time to spiritually connect is so valuable to all believers. As the decision to attend approaches, consider how an invitation to this uplifting Retreat might benefit some of the women in your life.

Ministry Spotlight

• Prince Georges County Department of Corrections (DOC). The Women's Ministry has established a team that supports a Women's Bible study with inmates who choose to attend at DOC. Ministry members commit to serve through a 6-8 week session from selected Bible studies that en-

hance understanding biblical principles. This team meets twice a month with the women inmates reading, reviewing, discussing, connecting and focusing on the biblical principles. Prayer requests are also presented by the inmates. Although some may not be able to complete the study, the hope is that this time of pursuing the Word will encourage them to continue to pursue the LORD once they are released.



• The Women's Ministry has a Monthly Prayer meeting via Zoom for the DOC Bible study members and the prayer requests submitted by the women inmates. These prayer requests remind us of God's faithfulness, and encourages us to be reminded that prayer is a constant need and should not be taken lightly. Pray that God will provide wisdom, and strengthen the unity among the members as they serve. The Women's Ministry is a place to serve and is seeking volunteers to join the DOC Bible Study team! If you are interested, please contact Cathy Baskin.

Volunteers are needed to assist with the Spring Women's Retreat by helping with various event needs like event logo design, music, event check-in, preparing goodie bags, name tags, etc. Trish Crandell is the POC for volunteering for this event.

The Gospel of Luke: Confidence about Jesus

Luke 1:39-56

"My Soul Magnifies the Lord" – November 9, 2025



Introduction

Have you ever been in a situation where you have been on high alert? There is a lot of trouble in this world. There are a lot of things that cause inner turmoil, anxiety, anger, etc., but if you remember that you are connected to God, you can be at ease. The problem comes when you forget God.

When the children of Israel were about to enter the Promised Land, they were reminded not to forget the God who brought them there. They would be prosperous, but prosperity led them and can lead you to a false self-reliance forgetting about God.

Trials and sorrows can also cause anxiety and self-reliance. You may think that God isn't listening to your cries for help. In pride, you forget your identity in God and lose sight of His love. You may be tempted to rely on the things of the world to boost your value and on yourself to take care of the problems. How can you get off the world's performance-based roller coaster? Is there a way for you to find your way back to rest and freedom?

Sermon Outline

- 1. Remember your identity in Christ. Vs. 39-45
- 2. Fuel your Christian walk with praise. Vs. 46-56

Read & Discuss

1. Read Vs. 39-45

After Mary became pregnant, there would be questions. Mary trusted God and surrendered herself to Him. After hearing that her cousin, Elizabeth was also pregnant, she went immediately and eagerly to see her. She might be the only one who would understand what was happening to her. The trip from Nazareth to Judea took three or four days, giving Mary plenty of time to reflect on what she was just told. It would have been easy for her to have doubts. Seeing Elizabeth and Zechariah gave her confidence.

Her arrival was dramatic. When Mary arrived and was greeted by Elizabeth, the baby that Elizabeth was carrying leapt in her womb. He leapt for joy. Think about that for a moment. Yet unborn, John was a full-fledged human being. He heard the voice of Mary. He was filled with the Spirit. This was an expression of the calling for his life as the forerunner of Jesus - the Messiah. Does the coming Christ make you leap for joy?

Elizabeth was also filled and controlled by the Spirit. Her words were God's words. She told Mary that she was blessed. Of all the young girls in Israel, God chose her. Elizabeth reminded Mary of truth. God didn't choose her because she was sinless, because she was not. She had no list of achievements. God chose her because of His grace. We all need "Elizabeths" in our lives to remind us of truth. Godly friendships are hard work. Love demands that we do the hard work of communication and/or provide practical needs for each other. We need to be patient with each other and assume the best. We must remind each other of the truth of who God is and our position and identity in Christ.

What do you think this incident was like for Elizabeth? Elizabeth had been waiting to have a baby for a long time. She had spent her entire life watching others get pregnant and have a family. This was **her** moment. Then Mary comes, young and pregnant. You might expect her to be jealous, upset or irritated for Mary stealing the spotlight. But how does she respond? She responds with words of humility; "Why is this granted to me that the mother of my Lord would come to me?" She was honored. She rejoiced. John the Baptist responded the same way when Jesus started His ministry. Why? Jesus has arrived!! This was why they have joy!! We can have joy as well. God is faithful. He knew what was going on in the lives of Mary and Elizabeth. He hasn't forgotten you. This should transform how you see yourself.

Where do you get your sense of self, your identity, your significance, your sense of worth? Is it in the things of the world - your job, your bank account, your abilities, your looks? If your identity relies on performance, you will experience ups and downs. Basing your value on self is a heavy burden. Jesus lived a perfect life, died in our place and rose again. Look to Him and Him alone for salvation and identity. You don't have to be exhausted trying to be good enough. You can trust in Christ by grace through faith. If you are in Christ, you are a new creation. There is a new way of seeing yourself.

After trusting in Christ, you are walking against the current of the world. How do you fight against the temptation to follow after the things the world has to offer?

2. Read Vs. 46 - 56

A telescope magnifies our ability to see the galaxy up close. As Mary magnified the Lord in praise, she saw, with confidence, how big God is. The rejoicing in vs. 47 was a result of the magnifying in vs. 46. She was praising God because He is mighty.

Joy is found in making much of or magnifying God. The more we have joy in Christ, the more we see our identity in Christ. This helps us go against the flow of the world. Mary saw the greatness of God.

God is holy. He can't be around sin, and He hates sin. God is not indifferent to injustice; He judges it. He is also merciful. His covenant love never fails. We may stumble, but God's love never stops no matter what. In vs. 46-49, Mary's praise was personal. She recognized all that God had done for her. When you see God's attributes in a personal way, you will erupt in praise. This fuels your walk.

Do you remember what God has done for you? Have you trusted God? Do you have a testimony? The Gospel fuels your faith. God commands what we gather each week so that we might have joy.

Mary also praised God for what He would do in the future for other generations. Mary's words were informed by God's past actions, but she is speaking of a future event as it had already happened - a great reversal. The proud will be humbled. The oppressive rulers will be brought down - God will vindicate those who have trusted in Him. The rich will be sent away and the hungry will be filled. Unchecked prosperity will lead to self-sufficiency and self-absorption. God's economy is different from the world's. Your value should not be based on your ability to achieve, how you look, or how you compare. It is based on your identity in Christ.

Do you struggle with where you find your identity? Are you envious of others? God deploys people with tasks and roles. Sometimes those roles are based on gender, but that doesn't make one role more important or better than the other. If you think that way, it can be upsetting. Why? The world puts different value or importance on different roles. Seeing yourself the way God sees you, dignifies you, lifts you up, and sets you free. You do not need to perform to get God's love.

Will you praise God for what He has done for you? Will you praise God for what He will do for you in Christ? When we trust God and lose our life in obedience to Him, He will raise it up. You can have joy. Mary's song becomes your song.

Prayer of Response

- 1) After hearing God's Word, what sin do I need to confess? From what do I need to repent?
- 2) How should my life be lived this week based on what I have heard? What should I understand, believe, desire, or do?

Suggestions on getting started:

- Decide on a time & place (breakfast, dinner, before bed, etc.)
- Start simple and short (ten minutes or less). Start with three things: 1) Read God's word, 2) Pray together and 3) Sing together. Scripture memory and catechism questions are optional if you have the time. Better to start small than bite off more than you can chew and give up.
- Be flexible. It doesn't need to look cookie-cutter similar for every family. Know yourself and know your kids: their personality, age, maturity, etc. [For younger kids consider starting with a good children's Bible like <u>The Big Picture Story</u> <u>Bible</u>.]
- If you don't know the answer to a question someone has, don't act like you
 do! Say something like, "Great question, let me look into that." Study, ask a
 pastor or Christian friend and get back to them.
- Embrace the chaos. Kids are kids don't expect it to be a perfect roundtable discussion with quiet, attentive children every time. Be patient and persistent. Patterns and habits help to set expectations over time.
