

Church Covenant

Praying with First Baptist Church

A Prayer Guide for the week of January 4

Prayer of the week:

One of the ways we learn to pray is by using the examples in Scripture as a springboard and inspiration for our own prayer life. This week, we encourage you to use the prayer of the Apostle Paul from the book of Ephesians 3:17b-19:

“...that you, being rooted and grounded in love,¹⁸ may have strength to comprehend with all the saints what is the breadth and length and height and depth,¹⁹ and to know the love of Christ that surpasses knowledge, that you may be filled with all the fullness of God.”

We recognize our need for God's help in all the areas of our lives. The categories and requests listed below are intentional ways to pray for each other as a church family. For help in knowing how and what to pray for, look up the Scripture included with each item.

### Ongoing prayer items in the life of our church:

- Pray for opportunities and boldness to share the gospel with loved ones (Matt. 28:19)
- Pray for conversions (John 3:3, Acts 16:14)
- Pray for the children of our church to hear and understand the gospel and be saved. (Luke 8:8)
- Pray for the preaching of God's word – for faithfulness, fruitfulness, and God's glory (2 Tim. 4:2, 1 Cor. 2:4-5, Isa. 55:10-11)
- Pray for increased one to one discipleship relationships in our church family (Matt. 28:19-20)
- Pray for unity in our diversity both on Sunday and through the week (Rom. 15:13, Eph 4:2-3)
- Pray for continued growth and joy in the gospel (1 Cor. 15:1-5, 2 Pet. 1:12)
- Pray for growth in holiness, hatred of sin and growth in humility (Prov. 8:13, 1 Pet. 1:14-16)
- Pray for honest, loving relationships in our church (Col. 3:12-13, James 5:16)
- Pray for families: marriages to thrive, parents to teach/love/discipline carefully, and children to obey (Eph. 5:22-6:4)
- Pray that giving would be faithful, joyful, consistent, and sacrificial (2 Cor. 8:9)

### Prayer items outside our church:

- Pray that our elected officials would fear God, seek His wisdom, have integrity, humility, and work together for the good of society and not self. (1 Tim. 2:1-2, Rom. 13:1-7)
- Pray for fruitful ministry in other gospel-proclaiming churches in our area. (Rom. 15:20, 1 Cor. 16:1-3, Matt. 28:19-20)

- Pray that God would bring a swift end to wars going on throughout the world and establish peace. Pray for protection and care for the many refugees fleeing to safety. Pray that those impacted would trust in God in the midst of their suffering. (Ps. 139:23-24)
- Pray for our ministry partners locally and around the world—Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware (BCM/D), North American Mission Board (NAMB) and International Mission Board (IMB). Pray especially for those we have direct partnerships with: Jeremy McClain (Mercy of Christ Fellowship Church, DC), Joel Kurz (The Garden Church, Baltimore), Daniel and Brandy Spandler-Davison and Susanna Schriever (Bangkok City Baptist Church, Thailand). Pray the gospel would flourish and churches would be planted and strengthened through their work. Pray that God would supply their needs. (Ps 93:4, Col. 1:5-6, 1 Pet. 4:12-17)

Young Adult Ministry

The Young Adult Ministry is on their way to CrossCon 2026, January 5-7 at the Kentucky International Convention Center in Louisville, KY. The theme is : LIKE NO OTHER: “Behold the Triune God: the Father who chose us in love, the Son who took on flesh to redeem us, and the Spirit who breathes resurrection life.” The focus of the conference will be on the command to make the name of Jesus known throughout the earth. (Matt. 28:18-20).

At the conference...

This year a combination of sessions including main group, break-out, praise, prayer and worship. Some of the main session Christ-centered teaching titles are, ‘Rejoicing in the Victorious Gospel of God, Compelling a Dying World with Trinitarian Love,’ and a lecture on ‘How the Church is the Answer to Modern Identity Chaos,’ which will be sprinkled through each day. Conference attendees will be engaged according to the schedule from the time it begins on Jan. 5 at 2pm until 9:40pm on day-one, day-two will begin at 9am end around 10:15pm and day-three begins at 8:30am ending around 3pm. Members, attendees, speakers and musicians will be immersed in the Word, songs of praise and have opportunities to share their testimonies among their peers for three days. During the break-out workshops, there will be equal time given for presentations and Q &A.

Tre Fields, one of the leaders of this ministry will be attending along with other supportive members to assist in group activities and ensuring that the experience at the conference will be followed up with thoughtful discussions among the members to enhance and share what they learned. Living in Light of Good News

[Matthew 28:16-20](#)

“Jesus’ Mission for the Church” – January 4, 2026



Introduction

As you begin to take down Christmas decorations, do you feel a letdown? The focus for a month has been on Advent, Christmas - God with us. Even though the Christmas season is past, you must carry the joy of Christmas throughout the year because Jesus is always with you. So, how do you do that? How do you carry the "spirit of the season" with you in the day-to-day grittiness? All of the Old Testament had led to the birth of Christ, but what do we do with that now? Is God with us? We get the answer in today's passage, showing that God lives with us all year long.

Sermon Outline

1. Trust the King who reigns. Vs. 16-17
2. Embrace the mission He has given you. Vs. 19-20a
3. Abide in Christ who sustains you. Vs. 20b

Read & Discuss

1. Read Vs. 16-17

When you look at this passage, you may envision Jesus and the disciples standing on a lush, green mountain. However, if you really look, you see a few heart-sick and confused followers. They had witnessed Jesus' death and resurrection. Now they see Him on the mountain. They worship, but some doubt. There is a tension between worship and doubt. Do you carry that same tension? Do you believe? Do you feel like you'll be let down? Do you often wonder if He is really there with you?

Jesus' words in here are for worshipping doubters. Jesus wants you to know a massive truth about who He is. This isn't just a pep talk. It is a public declaration of Who Jesus is. All right and power to rule have been given to Him - in Heaven and on earth. He has complete reign. There is nothing that was kept from Him; it is ALL under His authority. He is Lord over Heaven and earth FOREVER! Jesus lives and reigns over everything for eternity. He will never be replaced. He is the King of kings. ([Daniel 7:9-14](#); [Psalm 2](#)) His dominion will never pass away or be destroyed! What Daniel saw, has come to pass. Does that give you confidence to trust God in all things at all times? Where in your life, this week, have you felt powerless? Was it the doctor's office? Was it watching the news? Was it looking at your checkbook? Was it in your relationships? Do you live like Jesus has all authority over every single day of your life and not just Sunday?

Even when the kingdom feels hidden and circumstances feel out of control, we can trust the King who reigns.

2. Read Vs. 18-20a

Go and make disciples! This passage emphasizes the command to make disciples as you are going. However, disciple-making is not just left to those who go. It is given to everyone to make disciples by going, baptizing, and teaching.

Baptism is the beginning mark of a believer. This is how we recognized those who have trusted Christ. Then, we must go beyond a profession of faith and teach so that the pattern of life is one that obeys God's commands. There must be a lifestyle change and spiritual growth. Disciples are followers, obeying Jesus commands. It is not just being in a classroom, learning. What or who contributed to your discipleship as a believer? Who can you disciple and encourage in their faith?

As a believer, you are to be His light to the nations. That task can feel overwhelming, but your most immediate mission is sitting right at your kitchen table. Your family is the future. They must be discipled. ([Deuteronomy 6:6-9](#)) You should use every opportunity as a teachable, discipling moment. You can model it with your actions, reactions and instruction. You can also be a light in your workplace. You rub shoulders with a lot of people. Do you doubt your ability to share and disciple? Trust that God has placed you where He has and will enable and empower you to be the light and make Him known. Who has God already placed in your life? You don't have to go oversea, but you may need to go across the street. Jesus gave this command to doubters. He would provide what they needed to follow this command. He will give the same to you.

Remember, you are not trying to "fix" someone. You are inviting them to the One who can change their heart and work in their life. The same Gospel that opened your eyes to truth is the same Gospel that needs to be shared. It is Jesus' work on the cross and His resurrection for the atonement and forgiveness of sins. He took our punishment in our place. Those who come in repentance and faith will be a part of His kingdom. This is available to everyone.

3. Read Vs. 20b

If you are still wondering how you are going to do this, Jesus ends on a promise. He is with you always, to the end of the age. You must learn that it is abiding in Him that gives you the power. ([John 15:1-16](#)) All authority belongs to Jesus, and He is with you always! His presence and authority are necessary to accomplish the mission. What are some things that you need to do or are doing to abide in Christ? Do you have a daily devotional time? Do you regularly attend worship? Do you have relationships with other believers for mutual encouragment?

If you go all the way back to the beginning of the book of Matthew, you will see that the angel tells Joseph that the baby's name would be Immanuel - GOD WITH US! ([Matthew 1:21](#)) Jesus is the covenantal Lord - He is with you just as He was with the patriarchs of the Old Testament. This is the key to your life. He is with you always. Knowing that will help you face the things that cause you to struggle, bring you pain, and leave you with questions. You will walk through the fire, but you will never face it alone. He is Immanuel - God with us. One day, we will be with Him forever. This is our hope.

Prayer of Response

- 1) After hearing God's Word, what sin do I need to confess? From what do I need to repent?
- 2) How should my life be lived this week based on what I have heard? What should I understand, believe, desire, or do?

Family Guide for week of January 4th, 2026

Suggestions on getting started:

- Decide on a time & place (breakfast, dinner, before bed, etc.)
- Start simple and short (ten minutes or less). Start with three things: 1) Read God's word, 2) Pray together and 3) Sing together. Scripture memory and catechism questions are *optional* if you have the time. Better to start small than bite off more than you can chew and give up.
- Be flexible. It doesn't need to look cookie-cutter similar for every family. Know yourself and know your kids: their personality, age, maturity, etc. [For younger kids consider starting with a good children's Bible like [The Big Picture Story Bible](#).]
- If you don't know the answer to a question someone has, don't act like you do! Say something like, "Great question, let me look into that." Study, ask a pastor or Christian friend and get back to them.
- Embrace the chaos. Kids are kids – don't expect it to be a perfect roundtable discussion with quiet, attentive children every time. Be patient and persistent. Patterns and habits help to set expectations over time.

Prayer: (Talking to God)

Pray about one thing you read in Scripture together.
