Praying with First Baptist Church

A Prayer Guide for the week of November 10

Prayer of the week:

One of the ways we learn to pray is by using the examples in Scripture as a springboard and inspiration for our own prayer life. This week, consider using the prayer of the Apostle Paul from the book of Colossians 1:9:

"...we have not ceased to pray for you, asking that you may be filled with the knowledge of his will in all spiritual wisdom and understanding,..."

We recognize our need for God's help in all the areas of our lives. The categories and requests listed below are intentional ways to pray for each other as a church family. For help in knowing how and what to pray for, look up the Scripture included with each item.

Ongoing prayer items in the life of our church:

- Pray for opportunities and boldness to share the gospel with loved ones (Matt. 28:19)
- Pray for conversions (John 3:3, Acts 16:14)
- Pray for the children of our church to hear and understand the gospel and be saved. (Luke 8:8)
- Pray for the preaching of God's word for faithfulness, fruitfulness, and God's glory (2 Tim. 4:2, 1 Cor. 2:4-5, Isa. 55:10-11)
- Pray for increased one to one discipleship relationships in our church family (Matt. 28:19-20)
- Pray for unity in our diversity both on Sunday and through the week (Rom. 15:13, Eph 4:2-3)
- Pray for continued growth and joy in the gospel (1 Cor. 15:1-5, 2 Pet. 1:12)
- Pray for growth in holiness, hatred of sin and growth in humility (Prov. 8:13, 1 Pet. 1:14-16)
- Pray for honest, loving relationships in our church (Col. 3:12-13, James 5:16)
- Pray for families: marriages to thrive, parents to teach/love/discipline carefully, and children to obey (Eph. 5:22-6:4)
- Pray that giving would be faithful, joyful, consistent, and sacrificial (2 Cor. 8:9)

Prayer items outside our church:

- Pray that our elected officials would fear God, seek His wisdom, have integrity, humility, and work together for the good of society and not self. (1 Tim. 2:1-2, Rom. 13:1-7)
- Pray for fruitful ministry in other gospel-proclaiming churches in our area. (Rom. 15:20, 1 Cor. 16:1-3, Matt. 28:19-20)

- Pray that God would bring a swift end to wars going on throughout the world and establish peace. Pray for protection and care for the many refugees fleeing to safety. Pray that those impacted would trust in God in the midst of their suffering. (Ps. 139:23-24)
- Pray for those effected by natural disasters around the world, especially recent hurricanes
 through the Southeast U.S. Pray God would provide for immediate needs and preserve life.
 Pray God would comfort those grieving the death of loved ones. Pray for relief workers to
 work safely and quickly to bring stability (Psalm 119:88; 34:18)
- Pray for our ministry partners locally and around the world—Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware (BCM/D), North American Mission Board (NAMB) and International Mission Board (IMB). Pray especially for those we are directly involved with: Jeremy McClain (Mercy of Christ Fellowship Church, DC), Joel Kurz (The Garden Church, Baltimore), Daniel and Brandy Spandler-Davison and Susanna Schriever (Bangkok City Baptist Church, Thailand). Pray the gospel would flourish and churches would be planted and strengthened through their work. Pray that God would supply their needs. (Ps 93:4, Col. 1:5-6, 1 Pet. 4:12-17)

Particular prayer items in the life of our church:

- Praise God for two very fruitful mission trips by teams from our church over the past few
 months (South Africa & Bangkok, Thailand). Both teams were able to care for and serve the
 local churches and pastors they were working with as well as identify potential ways we can
 continue to meet needs there in the future. Continue to pray that God would strengthen the
 leaders and members of these churches and that the Gospel would flourish through their
 ministry. (Ps 93:4, Col. 1:5-6, 1 Pet. 4:12-17)
- Pray for our ministry leaders, deacons, and elders during this budget season as they pray and prepare a budget to present to the church next month. Pray for wisdom and a God-centered vision for how to use the resources that God has given our church. (James 1:5)
- Pray for our church family as we consider amendments to our church constitution. Pray that
 we would work together to comprehend and establish God's good design for the church and
 center our lives around it for the sake of his glory being made known. (Eph 3:10; 3:21)
- Pray that our church family would not grow weary of doing good. Pray that we would live
 and interact with one another in a way that reveals God's steadfast love and mercy to the
 world. (Gal 6:9)
- Pray God would guard our church from fear, anxiety, and disunity. Pray that we would trust that God is good and be assured that He is in control. (John 13:34-35)

Revelation: Following Our Victorious King

Revelation 22:6-21

"Come Lord Jesus" - November 10, 2024



Introduction

It can be very difficult to make important life decisions. Do you feel that if you make the wrong choice, you will have major regrets? The fear of missing out could make it more difficult, making you feel stuck.

If you feel decision paralysis, you may be worshiping the "god of open options." We see the prophet Elijah in LKings 18:21 instructing the people to make decision, and they didn't answer. Do you see yourself just not making a decision for fear of missing out? Do you find yourself unable to commit? Where might you still be flirting with the "god of open options?"

In the book of Revelation, God has been making the case that we should go "all in" with Jesus. We have seen Jesus in His glory, and we have seen how it will all end. Here, at the end of the book, we are called to get off the fence, deciding to follow Jesus. How do we make that decision?

Sermon Outline

- 1. Let truth guide your worship. Vs. 6-9
- 2. Decide today, because tomorrow is not promised. Vs. 10-17
- 3. Don't pretend that you are smarter than God. Vs. 18-21

Read & Discuss

1. Read vs. 6-9

In Revelation chapter one, John tells us that he is in exile because of his stand for Jesus. God pulls back the curtain to show John what will happen. As we see this vision unfold, John sees incredible things.

What the angel tells John here in <u>vs. 9</u>, is instructive to us as well. Worship God. Singing songs of worship is part of our worship gathering, but worship is more than that. It is manifested in adoration and action. This is reflective of all our lives. What you value controls our actions. Do you value what people think of you? Politics? Nice things? Good looks? Athletic ability? You can be tempted to value the same things that the world values, and it will affect your priorities and your actions. If you find your identity in these things, you are giving our hearts to the wrong thing. This is idolatry.

We all need to hear the loving correction that the angel gives John in <u>vs. 8</u>. "You must not do that!" Center your life around God! Trust Him! Why? The world is going one direction; how can you know that God is right? Are you worried about what you will miss out on?

We can trust God because this is His word. These words are trustworthy and true! (Vs. 6) We can trust the Bible because of Jesus. He understood and believed the Bible to be true, authoritative, and the very word of God. How do we know that Jesus is reliable? The linchpin of Christianity is the resurrection. He told his disciples that he would be betrayed and killed, but He also told them that he would rise from the dead. All of that happened which proves what He said about Himself as well as what the Bible says.

Does it feel that the world is winning? Do you doubt that you are giving your life to the right thing? Do the countless voices telling you how to live cause you to be overwhelmed? The way out of a paralyzed indecision into a confident decision is to look into God's word.

Additional Reading: 1 Corinthians 15

2. Read vs. 10-17

John emphasized here is that the clock is ticking. Time is almost out. Jesus is coming soon! When Jesus comes a second time, He will judge. God cares very much about justice. He will make all things right. John is saying, "Decide today! Tomorrow is not promised!"

What does John mean by "soon?" Since it has been over 2000 years since John's writing, people don't take this

warning seriously. The Apostle Peter faced scoffers. (2 Peter 3:4; 9) God is not slow. He hasn't forgotten His coming judgment. God delays His righteous judgment to give unbelievers time to repent. It is His mercy and patience. Jesus will come. He will reward and repay. He doesn't tell us when; he says, "Soon."

When God's word is read, sung, prayed or preached, you will either hear and respond or you will harden your heart. Do you hear? Are you listening? If you stiff-arm God long enough, you will have his judgment today and become spiritually deaf. (Romans 1:22-25) God's warnings are meant to wake us up. Do you hear God speaking to you today through the words of scripture? Don't put it off. Decide today!

God is eternal and sovereign. He is bringing history to His desired end, bringing all the world to judgment. There are those who will enter the city. (vs. 14) There are those who will remain outside. (vs. 15) Compared to a holy God, we are the ones who should be left outside. We are under the curse of the law. That's the bad news, but those who wash their robes will enter. How? (Revelation 7:14) We must be washed in the blood of the Lamb. On the cross, Jesus bore the penalty and satisfied the wrath of God. We cannot get the stain of sin out with our good deeds. Jesus drank the cups of God's wrath to the dregs and rose again guaranteeing salvation for those who trust in Him.

We are tempted to envy the world, but we can trust Jesus. He is the Bright and Morning Star in a very dark world. He says, "Come!." The bride says, "Come!" Are you still tempted to stay on the fence with one foot in the world? The Holy Spirit will help the one who hears to say, "Come."

Is Jesus your greatest treasure? Do you long for Him to come more than anything that this world has to offer? Are you still on the fence? Come! He is the Truth! The world will not satisfy you. The longing to run after things that will satisfy is a longing for God. Come to Him! Drink and be satisfied in Him. However, It is possible to hear all of this and still not be convinced.

3. Read vs. 18-21

A preacher's job is to explain and apply the word of God. It is not to add to or ignore anything to God's word. A preacher's job is to say what it says.

But John's warning here is not just for preachers. It is for all of us. There are several reasons for us want to add to or ignore or twist God's word. When obedience is costly, we might be tempted to add to or take something out. To do this is to put yourself in the place of God. It is what got Adam and Eve in trouble in the first place. What happened in the Garden of Eden happens in our culture today. People ask, "Did God really say?" God does not need an editor. (Psalm 19:7-8)

Our job is to trust and obey God's word that gives us life. How do we do this? It is only by the grace of the Lord Jesus. ($\frac{Vs. 21}{}$)

Prayer of Response

- 1) After hearing God's Word, what sin do I need to confess? From what do I need to repent?
- 2) How should my life be lived this week based on what I have heard? What should I understand, believe, desire, or do?

Spend time praying together in response to God's word asking for His help and greater faith to follow Him in the week to come. If you missed the sermon on Sunday or would like to listen again, visit our website at fbcum.org

Family Guide for week of November 10th, 2024

Deuteronomy 6:6–7 And these words that I command you today shall be on your heart. You shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, and when you walk by the way, and when you lie down, and when you rise.



Suggestions on getting started:

- Decide on a time & place (breakfast, dinner, before bed, etc...)
- Start simple and short (ten minutes or less). Start with three things: 1) Read God's word, 2) Pray together and 3) Sing together. Scripture memory and catechism questions are optional if you have the time. Better to start small than bite off more than you can chew and give up.
- Be flexible. It doesn't need to look cookie-cutter similar for every family. Know yourself and know your kids: their personality, age, maturity, etc. [For younger kids consider starting with a good children's Bible like <u>The Big Picture Story</u> <u>Bible</u>.]
- If you don't know the answer to a question someone has, don't act like you
 do! Say something like, "Great question, let me look into that." Study, ask a
 pastor or Christian friend and get back to them.
- Embrace the chaos. Kids are kids don't expect it to be a perfect roundtable discussion with quiet, attentive children every time. Be patient and persistent. Patterns and habits help to set expectations over time.
