The English word "disciple" originates from the Latin word *discipulus* – a word that tells of the relationship between student and teacher, typically in the context of a trade. Therefore, a disciple can be accurately described as an "apprentice". But as with any discipline, there comes a time for graduation, when the student leaves the teacher to do work on one's own. The word "apostle" has origins in the Greek word $\dot{\alpha}\pi\dot{o}\sigma\tau\dot{o}\lambda\dot{o}\varsigma$ (*apostolos*) which can be translated as "messenger", or more literally, "one who is sent". Therefore, Jesus's apostles are former disciples who have been sent, or commissioned, to proclaim the Good News.

The story of Jesus' apostles is told in the *Acts of the Apostles* – the second volume of the *Gospel of Luke*. It's a story filled with transitions. While Luke's gospel tells of the journey of the Good News from Galilee to Jerusalem, in Acts, we see the Christian faith marching west to invade Rome, the center of imperial wealth and power. The book focuses on Peter to start, but as the story progresses, Paul will assume center stage. Along the way, we are introduced to new names: Barnabas, Apollos, Timothy, Tabitha, etc. Yet the most radical change in Acts takes place in the Christian faith itself, as the Holy Spirit transforms a small band of local religious outlaws into a global, international movement!

Today, we find ourselves entering a new era for Christianity, or, what some scholars call "post-Christendom" – the ebbing of traditional religious worldviews that once dominated society and culture (for better or for worse). As the institutional church grows smaller and less influential in the West, it may be argued that the church of the 21st century will share more in common with the church of the Apostolic Age. Perhaps then, we should look with renewed interest toward those first apostles who faithfully served our Lord in the past to discover where the Spirit may be sending us next!

Most folks are unfamiliar with the *Book of Acts*. It rarely comes up in the lectionary, yet the events it describes are among the most consequential in scripture. If you read the story all the way through, you'll notice that it's open-ended. No one is quite sure why this is. Perhaps Luke never got around to writing a third volume, or perhaps it was simply lost to time. But maybe, this was intentional. Perhaps Luke recognized that it was not he, but the apostles of the future who would supply the ending, or at least, write our own chapter in this ongoing story of our redemption.

So, in the spirit of this epic pilgrimage, our **Tuesday Evening Bible Study** will begin a new segment on the **Acts of the Apostles**. The fun begins **October 14 @ 6:00pm** in the **SPC Fellowship Hall**. Hope to see you there!



The Acts of the Apostles, the second volume of the Gospel of Luke, tells the story of those who carried the Good News of Jesus Christ far beyond the confines of the Eastern Mediterranean, transforming the Christian faith into a global, international, and multicultural movement in fulfillment of the risen Christ's command to: "Be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." [Acts 1:8] While the Book of Acts does not normally receive the same attention as other books and letters of the New Testament, the events described within its pages have some of the most profound and far-reaching consequences, from the Day of Pentecost, to the conversion of Paul, to the beginnings of the Gentile mission and beyond. The journey of the first Apostles (literally "those who are sent") can offer insight into where Christ may be sending his disciples as the church enters the uncharted religious waters of the 21st century.






Stewardship Campaign Swings into Action in October
